

SILVERADO RESIDENT'S

Just a reminder, Silverado Residents Association Fees were Due January 1st, 2016, invoices were issued to owners in early December 2015. If you did not receive your invoice, please contact Simco Management. Please make sure you get your payment into Simco Management as soon as possible. This fee is **NOT** optional and must be paid once a year by all residents. If the fee is not paid, then we as a community cannot pay for the following services specific to SRA designated areas:

Snow removal and Landscaping contract: Snow removal from pathways ;Garbage removal, Entrance Features, SRA Planters, Garbage removal, Grass Mowing, Weed Control

Irrigation Contract: Water the SRA Lands such as grass around the pond and pathways.

Management Contract: Invoice/Collect annual fees from owners; negotiate contracts; assist with annual review of required insurance, attend SRA Board Meetings/ AGM, professionally manage our money and property by paying all bills and taxes, preparing/oversee monthly financials, operating fund and reserve fund.

If payment was not received by Simco Management by January 31, 2016, you will be charged interest at a rate of 18% per annum, as per the Encumbrance on your Title that is attached to all homes in Silverado.

Methods of payment: You may now pay your fees online through Simco Management's website, effective December 16, 2015! Simco's website is: www. **simcomanagement.ca**. Once you are at the home page of the website, at the top will be a tab labelled "Payments". Select this tab and complete the required fields. You will be able to pay by Visa, Mastercard or Visa Debit.

You may also forward a cheque, payable to Silverado Residents Association, to Simco Management. Please ensure you have your Silverado address on your cheque.

If you have received a letter from McLeod Law, you must deal with McLeod Law to clear up your arrears. 14505 Bannister Road SE, Calgary, ABT2X 3J3, 403-278-9411.

Snow Route Parking Bans - The following routes in Silverado are considered snow Route Parking Bans: Silverado BLVD, Silverado Way, Sheriff King Street, Silverado Skies Dr. Silverado Skies Link, Silverado Ridge Link.

The SRA board wanted to make sure all owners/occupants that park on the street/BLVD aware of the City of Calgary parking bans when it snows 5cm or more. The City of Calgary has put up small signs on all snow route streets, but they are not easy to see. 
The Snow Route parking ban program supports snow plowing operations by removing parked vehicles from the streets, and allowing crews to clear snow from Calgary roads more efficiently and effectively. During a ban, parking will be temporarily restricted on designated Snow Routes for up to 72 hours. Parking bans are reserved for the few times each winter when there is a large build-up of snow on city streets.



Year In Review

The last 12 months have been transformational for our Caucus; they have been a time for thought, for reflection, and most importantly for engagement.

We started 2015 recognizing the challenges that laid ahead for Alberta, recognizing the need to stand up and secure our fiscal future. Greetings Ward 14!

Great news! You have an extra day in February! I'll be making sure that the City is using that extra day—and the other 365—wisely, and I want to mention a couple of ways we'll be doing. Let's leap right in to it.

LED Streetlights in Ward 14

The lights we use to brighten our streets at night have a huge impact on this city, and not just in terms of better visibility. They require us to produce energy, they can cause light pollution, and they often need to be replaced. I am happy to say that in 2015 we began retrofitting streetlights for new light emitting diode (LED) bulbs, and will continue into 2018 until the retrofitting of 80,000 streetlights is complete. They will be replacing the high pressure sodium lights that the City has been using for some time now.

The financial benefits of the project are clear. With all the lights installed we expect to save \$1 million annually on maintenance costs, and \$5 million in annual electricity costs. But there are also some benefits that are not as easily represented in a financial statement. They will reduce energy consumption by up to 50%—the equivalent of powering 2,820 homes per year—and will drastically reduce light pollution. I think you'll find you'll be able to see better too.

The LED streetlights are coming to Ward 14 very soon. Silverado is scheduled for retrofitting during the first guarter of 2016, and the rest of Ward 14 will be done during the third and fourth quarters. Let me know what vou think of them!

Interactive Parks and Roads Map

As I write this just a little before Christmas, the Roads department, Parks department, and I are hoping for some snow to test a project that we have been working on. We had an exceptional amount of snow during the winter of 2013/2014, and we learned many things from the experience. Based on people's comments to my office, the lack of communication between the City's crews and its headquarters became very apparent. A highlighted map was literally the only way for us to know what had been cleared and what had not.

The result of our work will be real-time information not only on what roads and pathways have been cleared of snow, but eventually what parks have been mowed as well. It will be available to the public in an online map made possible with GPS outfitted equipment. It is a significant step forward in the level of service that we provide citizens. All we need are two significant snowfalls to test the system out. Hopefully we will have had them by the time you read this.


