Last month we looked at the barbershop at the Mayland Heights Mall. This month we will look at a new story about my neighbours Corrando and Lucia Chiacchia.

Corrando and Lucia Chiacchia

If you ever had a walk down McKinnon Drive, you might have caught Corrando in his yard giving a friendly wave as you go, always lively and talkative. "Hey Boss!" is usually the first words out of his mouth when he greets you. Corrando and Lucia left Italy with their 2 children, Sylvester and Helena and my landlord Valentino on June 10, 1957 and arrived in New York in 10 days and in Calgary on June 24, 1957. Corrando had 3 brothers who were already living in the Calgary area before and that is why they came out west. All his siblings pictured above came to Alberta, his parents stayed in Italy for the rest of their lives. My landlord, Valentino D'Orazio was 18 at the time, young and single.

"The time we came here Italy never move, after the war, nothing is moving. My brother Rocko came here in 1952, Nick in 1951, we come to be with family. Start a new life. We lived on the east coast, San Valentino, in our country, we can read, can talk and write, but not in English, in Italian, we had to learn everything. It was rough times, when we come here, what happened, Valentino was a young man, he was single, we would go to school, in the evening after work and learn English at St. Mary's School. I was married, I have to support my kids, we go out, we spend a dollar, you have to take the bus, if I was single it would be different, you meet a girl, they start pinching you, believe me! See, I am married man, Valentino is single, the girls come after you, those Canadian girls they chase you, see and for me it was no good, because I was married. I had responsibilities, they were good times and hard times too, but we had to stop going to school. We lived in Renfrew the first few years while working in construction, we built homes in Westbrook in the Southwest, 1957-60."

"There was nothing here, Union Packing, down in the valley, my brother Romado used to work there, now in Brooks. At the Chinese Gardens, we used to buy vegetables there, that's a long time ago, also by Memorial, there was a Chinese Farm there, also off 32nd Avenue, we used to pick carrots there for a dollar and hour! See, a dollar an hour, see, Saturday and Sunday we don't work, make 10 dollars a day, you buy groceries for a week! Rocko, my brother, his brother in law, Alfonso we used to go there make dollar an hour, you see, when you come to here from the old country, every penny counts at that time, you have kids, you pay rent, it all counts!"



"The city only went to 66th, Glenmore, then nothing, farm, out to McMahon Stadium was on the edge of town, east of Barlow, nothing. All along 4th Avenue, all small houses, we could see the tower being built from here, in 1967. We build this house together, me and Valentino, \$26,000 the house, both sides. Just a field across the street, between McKinnon Drive and Barlow, till they build in the 80's. I worked for the CPR in Ogden for 30 years after that and retired, me and Mamma. Valentino got married to my sister and had three daughters, all of whom went to St. Clement's School. This a great area, it's in the middle of the city and this house built really good. Nice and quiet."

WINTER OPERATIONS AT YYC

Meet the Fleet

YYC is no stranger to snow and with over 3 million square metres of paved surface on the airfield, a 5 cm snowfall is the equivalent of 26,000 tonnes of snow!

Below are the steps our hard working crew takes to clear the runways on typical winter days ensuring safe and efficient operations:

- Runway Sweepers begin the process by pushing snow to the edge of the runway. This sweeps the pavement clean and removes the bulk of the snow.
- Plows push the piled snow from the edge of the runways to clear the side lighting.
- Blowers blow the piled snow back towards the grassy
- Pavement De-Icing Trucks are called into action during severe winter conditions as a preventative measure. They stop ice from sticking or forming on the pavement.


