ALRA BOARD REPORT


Hello Arbour Lake Residents!

The lake crew has been busy getting ready for the winter season. The winter programs will open up registration on November 12th. The Christmas lights are in full production. Our "Pictures With Santa" event will take place on the of evening November 25th.

We have had several events in the last couple of months. The ALRA hosted a "Girl Power" workshop on October 22nd at the Residents Hall. There were 33 people in attendance. A community led campaign to give hope to Amie and her young family Photos and article by Remember When Photography

Amie's Story so far: Amie was 34 years old when she moved with her partner David and young family of three from the north of England to Calgary. Full of hope with dreams of a new life in Calgary their exciting adventure began in August 2014 when Dave secured a job and the whole family moved over here. Their girls were 11, 7 and 7 months old at this time. The family fell in love with Alberta and quickly realized they wanted to make it their forever home.

In June of 2015 Amie discovered a lump under her armpit within her left breast. A mammogram and ultrasound confirmed her worst fears that it was breast cancer. Further tests confirmed it to be a particularly aggressive form of breast cancer, being HER2 triple negative. At this time it was confirmed to be contained within the lymph nodes within the left armpit and breast. Amie met with her oncologist to discuss next steps and this is when her courageous fight to beat this awful disease truly began.

In July of 2015 Amie began treatment of chemotherapy and Herceptin every 3 weeks for 6 rounds. Chemo

had to be delayed on one occasion whilst Amie was in hospital fighting an infection. On the fifth round of chemotherapy Amie was again in hospital with a bacterial infection making her very unwell.

Once chemotherapy was complete, Amie had a double mastectomy and reconstructive surgery. Amie struggled with the day to day activities of a young mother and the demands that come with that.

In December 2015 it was confirmed that 15 lymph nodes, of which 9 had cancer, had all been removed. Amie for a short while felt that it had all been worth it when cruelly cancer reared its ugly head again. Only one month later, in January of 2016, a lump that Amie discovered in her collarbone was confirmed as being HER2 cancer back again and Stage 4. Amie once again began chemotherapy until further notice.


Amie was put in touch about this time with a naturopath who prescribed natural treatments that Amie could try alongside the grueling chemotherapy treatment. These

treatments helped, with the lump in the collarbone disappearing by the time Amie had her next visit with her oncologist.

Amie has in recent weeks experienced setbacks - including repeated seizures - for which she has needed to have intense radiation treatment, other new treatments and spend time in hospital.

Amie has now exceeded her limits on her health insurance and this is where she needs our help urgently. We need to raise funds to support Amie's ongoing treatments to enable her to be there for her young family, for as long as possible. Please donate at https://www.gofundme.com/8wsn6524. Hall Rentals Basics:

Can I rent the hall?

Any person over the age of 21 may rent the hall. The hall can be rented for independent group programs, presentations and personal events such as birthday parties.

When can I book hall rentals?

Hall rentals must be booked at the Lake office Monday -Friday from 9am – 4pm. You must come into the lake office to book your rental as we must go through a rental contract and necessary information with you.

What do I need to rent the hall?

You need your photo ID, payment for the hall rental, and a damage deposit cheque for \$400.00 at the minimum. If you will be having alcohol at your event, you must obtain a liquor license and Party Alcohol Liability Insurance. Proof of these must be given seven days prior to the event.

Catch and Release ONLY!

At this time, only catch and release fishing will be permitted at Arbour Lake, until further notice, THERE WILL BE NO KEEPING OF ANY FISH OF ANY SIZE OR KIND! This is a result of Alberta Environment and Parks shutting down all fish stocking within the bow river drainage area, of which Arbour Lake is included. Due to whirling disease found in the Bow River and commercial fish culture operations, the lake will not be stocked indefinitely, and as such, no fish may be kept indefinitely.

Lake Fees

Your invoice for your annual lake fee should have arrived for the 2017 year. If you have not received your invoice, please contact the lake office for a copy. Please be advised that this fee is mandatory for all Arbour Lake households and you cannot opt out of paying it. Fees are due on January 1st, 2017. If your fees are left unpaid, interest will start accumulating on the overdue balance as of February 1st at a rate of 18% per annum, compounded monthly. Fees can be paid at the lake office by cheque or debit or through your online banking. **Payment made by VISA or MASTERCARD is subject to a 3.5% Convenience Fee**

Lake Hours

The lake office is currently open from 9am-5pm. Lake hours will be extended once we open for skating. Watch our website, social media or call the lake office for updates on lake hours.

Watch for the flags!

What do the flags mean?

- Red flag = Full closure. Stay far away from the ice.
- Yellow flag = Partial closure. Contact the lake office or check the website for updates.
- Green flag = Open for all Winter Activities When is the lake ready for skating?

- No one will be allowed on the ice surface until a depth of 10" has been observed in our test locations. This will be on natural ice only (not resurfaced by the Olympia zamboni).
- The Arbour Lake Olympia will not be put onto the ice until a depth of 15" has been observed in our test locations. Skaters will have to skate on the natural ice between depths of 10" to 15".


Clothing Donation Bin

Joe's Tip: Joe's Holiday Eggnog

- 4 eggs
- 120 ml sugar
- 500 ml of milk
- ½ tsp of vanilla
- 1 tsp. Rum flavouring
- May add optional pinch of nutmeg & cinnamon

Directions:

Put the milk, vanilla, and optional cinnamon and nutmeg in a saucepan, and heat on low setting until mixture is brought to a boil.

In a bowl, combine egg yolks and sugar and thoroughly blend together.

Pour the eggs mixture into the saucepan with the milk mixture. Cook over medium heat, stir in rum flavouring and stir mixture until it reaches desired thickness (3-5 minutes).

Refrigerate until cool.
