Cooler Weather is coming!

Flagpoles are located around the lake and at the front entrance, which indicate if the lake is open for use. Boats and swimming will not be allowed once the water temperature reaches below 10°C.

RED: Full Closure, stay far away from the water or ice. YELLOW: Partial closure (contact the lake office or check the website for updates)

GREEN: Lake is open for all activities for either the winter or summer season.

Summer Blooms

LAKE SAFETY

Everyone loves having fun at the lake! Please keep in mind the following safety rules while enjoying the lake facilities.

Floating Docks

Hopefully you are enjoying the 2 floating docks. Make sure you are keeping safety in mind when playing out on these docks, as they are outside of the swimming area. There is a maximum of 5 people allowed on the floating dock at one time, as per manufacturer's recommendations. There is NO rough housing or pushing on the floating docks.

Slide

The water slide is another popular feature at the lake to try! You must be 48" tall to use the slide, you can only slide feet first and one person at a time. Parental supervision is highly recommended for the slide, as the stairs up to the slide are very steep. Exercise caution when smaller children are climbing up the stairs, and support them as they climb to prevent a backwards fall.

Water Safety

As a reminder, here are some safety tips:

• ARBOUR LAKE IS AN UNSUPERVISED LAKE. USE OF THE LAKE AND ITS AMMENITIES IS AT YOUR OWN RISK

- There is NO lifeguard on duty
- Please watch children at all times
- Keep your small children within arms' length at all times
- We highly recommend children wear a PFD at all times
- Children must remain in the buoyed swim area
- Infants inflatables and lake toys must remain in the swim area
- Swimming with a buddy is safer and way more fun
 No diving
- No swimming or boating during lightning storms
- Parents: If your children are under the age of 12, you must remain at the Lake with them at all times. They cannot be left unsupervised

Members

• Presentation of a membership card is **mandatory to** gain access to the lake

Members 11 years or younger must be accompanied by a responsible member 12 years of age or older

• Residents under 18 who are not yet registered as a member must be registered by the homeowner

- Replacement membership cards may be purchased for \$25.00
- Arbour Lake staff reserves the right to restrict entry to anyone
- ALRA has the right to make further reasonable rules and regulations

Guests

 Members are permitted a maximum of five guests per household per day.

 Any requests for more than 5 guests must be made through and approved by ALRA management at least 7 days in advance

• Members under the age of 16 are permitted a maximum of two guests at any time and guests must provide photo ID.

Members are responsible for the actions of their guests

All guests must be accompanied by a Member at all times and can never be left in the lake alone

• Members may not check in guests without a current lake card

• Members under 18 years of age who bring guests, must leave their lake card at the office and guests must leave a piece of picture ID with the member's lake card. Members and guests may retrieve their ID upon departure.

Prohibitions

Glass cups, glass bottles or glass containers of any kind

- Liquor/drugs
- Animals
- Bicycle's, Skateboards or other vehicle
- Open fires or BBQ's
- Smoking
- Littering
- Taking sand off the beach
- Digging deep holes in the beach
- Water inflatables with the exception of infant inflatables (such as water wings)

• No personal watercrafts, of any kind, are permitted in the lake area

Boating

Boating activities will not be supervised

Lifejackets are mandatory, and must be fully fastened
Paddle Boats, Kayaks, Canoes: 16+ - Kids may take out a children's kayak if a responsible adult also takes out a

- kayak and is within reach.
- Row Boats: 16+
- Paddle Boards: 12+ (Residents 12-15 years will only be allowed on with a signed waiver from their parents
- All boats and other equipment must be returned at least 30 minutes prior to closing
- All equipment other than row boats has a usage limit of 30 minutes during busy times

Fishing

- May only be done from designated fishing areas
- Hooks must be Barbless
- No live bait, corn, bread, minnows, smelts, fish or nets may be used to catch fish
- Fish must be killed immediately and are not to be kept on a stringer in the lake
- No cleaning of fish is permitted at Arbour Lake
- 2 fish per day/household, 4 fish per month/household, 20 fish per year/household
- No fish over 18 inches are to be kept

GOLDFISH & LAKE RESPONSIBILITY

Gotta Catch'em All

Over the summer, many goldfish have been seen along the lake shallows. Although their current presence is not causing immediate harm to the lake, their numbers and size are notable. Gold fish are a type of carp that is nonnative to Alberta lakes and rivers. Gold fish are an invasive species that are being found all across the province. Invasive species can devastate local ecosystems as they compete with local aquatic species. Although the future impacts of the goldfish are unclear, it is important that all residents maintain our lake by following provincial rules as well as Arbour Lake Residents Association rules. It is illegal to release live fish into Alberta's lakes or rivers. Fines can be up to \$100,000. It is also illegal to move live fish from one water body to another water body. Refrain from adding invasive species into Arbour Lake by following the rules listed below:

Do not use live bait, corn or nets to catch fish




- Do not dump unwanted/dead aquarium or other pets in the lake
- Do not deposit or dump any substance into the lake

Did you know that disposing of live, unwanted fish by flushing is not a humane method of disposal? Flushing is traumatic for fish, and if the fish survives it can introduce invasive species to our local water systems. Dead fish can be disposed of in your regular garbage.


Arbour Lake staff have been removing gold fish from the lake using various methods such as nets, goldfish nets and spear-fishing equipment. Although gold fish can be hard to catch, any gold fish that are caught must not be returned to the lake. Report your catch to the office and we will happily dispose of the fish if you do not wish to take it home. There is no limit for catching goldfish. Arbour Lake resident Jack Chow caught the large goldfish as displayed in the picture. Thank you to all those who have caught goldfish and brought them to a staff member for disposal. Calgary City Council remained busy through the summer months and I would like to take this opportunity to share some important updates that may impact you and your community.

In July, City Council unanimously approved Calgary Police Service's request for 50 new police officers. These new officers will help further support their efforts in reducing crime in our communities. The new positions will be funded by fine revenue and will not have an impact on property taxes.

City Council also unanimously supported a sliding scale low income transit pass. This will change the current \$44 monthly pass to one where the pass price is dependent upon income, according to the low income cut-off (LICO) scale. This will reduce the current \$44 monthly pass down to as little as \$5.45 for low income individuals. The Government of Alberta provided \$13.5 million to help fund this program.

I was pleased that Council agreed to look at Shaganappi Trail between 144th Ave and Stoney Trail in relation to heavy truck traffic. Shaganappi Trail is currently a trucking route; however, I would like to see if it would be appropriate to only allow heavy trucks on weekdays, so that the residents along Shaganappi Trail can enjoy being outdoors on weekends without the loud noises from heavy trucks. City administration will be consulting with the industry to see how we can make improvements for the communities along this portion of Shaganappi Trail.

There has been good progress on the construction of the upgraded interchange on Sarcee Trail and Stoney Trail. Once complete this interchange will allow for safer access from Sarcee Trail on to Stoney Trail, which will also help reduce congestion. This project will also widen 112th Ave west of Sarcee Trail from two lanes to four lanes. To date, these projects are on schedule to be complete by late 2016.
