## February Is Heart Month

Do you know the signs and symptoms of a heart attack and what to do if someone experiences these? Knowing can make the difference between life and death. Recognizing and responding immediately to the warning signs of a potential heart attack can significantly improve survival and recovery.

**February is Heart Month** - take the time to be heart safe and learn how you can reduce your risk.

#### Know the signs of a heart attack

(Any, or all, of these signs & symptoms may occur)

- Chest discomfort described as crushing, squeezing, pressure, or heaviness;
- Discomfort that moves beyond the chest, such as the shoulder, arm, neck, or jaw;
- Shortness of breath, sweating, or nausea and vomiting.

#### **Reduce your risk**

Heart attack risk factors include: • Obesity\*

- Sedentary lifestyle\*
- Smoking\*
- High cholesterol\*
- Age / gender
- Family history

Speak with your doctor about how to treat your modifiable (\*) risk factors and learn to be heart safe.

#### What to do when seconds count

- Call 9-1-1 immediately. Early treatment can greatly reduce heart damage and make the difference of life and death;
  Treatment starts the moment EMS arrives. Paramedics can provide oxygen, start an intravenous and perform an electrocardiogram (ECG);
- Paramedics can also administer important medication(s) in the early minutes of a heart attack to lessen heart damage;
- During transport, EMS will share information with the hospital, so definitive treatment can begin immediately upon arrival;
- Take a CPR/AED (automated external defibrillator) course. Training is widely available from many reputable organizations. It's easy, inexpensive, and only takes a few hours.

#### Hall Rentals Basics:

#### Can I rent the hall?

Any person over the age of 21 may rent the hall. The hall can be rented for independent group programs, presentations and personal events such as birthday parties.

#### When can I book hall rentals?

Hall rentals must be booked at the Lake office Monday -Friday from 9am – 4pm. You must come into the lake office to book your rental as we must go through a rental contract and necessary information with you.

#### What do I need to rent the hall?

You need your photo ID, payment for the hall rental, and a damage deposit cheque for \$400.00 at the minimum. If you will be having alcohol at your event, you must obtain a liquor license and Party Alcohol Liability Insurance. Proof of these must be given seven days prior to the event.

#### Lake Fees

Arbour Lake annual fees are overdue as of February 1, 2017. If you have not paid your fees yet be sure to do it soon as interest is accumulating on your overdue balance at the rate of 18% per annum, compounded monthly. Your access to the lake is also currently denied until your fees are paid in full.

You can pay your fees at the lake office by cheque, debit, Visa or Mastercard. **Visa and Mastercard payments are subject to a 3.5% convenience fee.** You can also pay your fees at your local bank or through your online banking by adding Arbour Lake Residents Association as a payee. You will find your account number located on your invoice. If you are unsure of your account number, please contact the office. Lake fees are mandatory for all residents living in Arbour Lake and you can't opt out of paying them.

#### Ice at the Lake

We can only hope that February is full of sunny days with temperatures just below zero! However, with Calgary's unpredictable weather, there may be times when we need to temporarily close the ice for safety, or due to unsafe weather conditions. Ice conditions can change day to day, or even change hour to hour. Join us at the lake for as much skating, ice fishing, and hockey as you can handle in February as we're never sure how long the ice will last!

Remember, we are dealing with Mother Nature, and we cannot always control ice or weather conditions.

#### Watch the Flags!



Watch our flags, which indicate whether the ice is open or not.

**Green Flag** means the lake is open for all activities. **Yellow Flag** means there is a partial closure at the lake. Check our social media or call the office for details. **Red Flag** means there is a full closure at the lake.

#### General Rules "Helmets Rule at Arbour Lake"

- All skaters under the age of 18 MUST wear a helmet while on the ice at Arbour Lake.
- Anyone playing hockey must wear a helmet. **NO EX-CEPTIONS**
- Hockey and hockey sticks are only permitted on designated rinks.
- Ice fishing holes will be drilled by Lake Staff only, personal augers are not permitted.



At this time, only catch and release fishing will be permitted at Arbour Lake, until further notice. THERE WILL BE NO KEEPING OF ANY FISH OF ANY SIZE OR KIND! This is a result of Alberta Environment and Parks shutting down all

fish stocking within the bow river drainage area, of which Arbour Lake is included. Due to whirling disease found in the Bow River and commercial fish culture operations, the lake will not be stocked indefinitely, and as such, no fish may be kept indefinitely. Any fish that cannot be returned to the water, must be surrendered to a staff member.



**In My Heart: A Book of Feelings** by Jo Witek (Author), Christine Roussey (Illustrator)




Sometimes my heart feels like a big yellow star, shiny and bright. I smile from ear to ear and twirl around so fast,



At the start of 2017, all Calgary City Councillors took a 2.49% wage roll back. I am very supportive of this decision as I believe that The City needs to be responsible with spending so that we can prevent taxes and fees from increasing.

The City's snow removal crews have been busy this winter ensuring our roads are in a safe and reasonable winter driving condition. One method that they use on residential streets is "flat-blading," which flattens the snow to a hard pack so that it's easier to drive on. One result of flat-blading is the build-up of snow along the side of a roadway, also known as windrow. Plow operators make every attempt to keep driveways clear, or keep windrows as small as possible, but any snow buildup on driveways that does occur is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner to remove, much like sidewalk shovelling.

The Calgary Awards is one of the largest citizen recognition programs in our city which recognizes outstanding achievements and contributions made by Calgarians in the previous year. Each year, individuals, corporations, community groups and organizations are nominated in five major award categories, for a total of 13 awards. The Calgary Awards are for Calgarians. Individuals, businesses, not-for-profit organizations, community groups and other organizations can all be nominated. #### February 26 New Moon (waxing)

Increasing moonlight, lunar gravity pulls water up encouraging plant growth and proliferation. Grafting, transplanting, re-potting, and watering. Gather herbs used for essential oils. Oil content is more concentrated at this time.
