

• Helmets are mandatory for all participants.

• Parents are to remain at the lake during their child's skating lesson.

• No refunds will be issued for classes cancelled; a make-up class will be rescheduled dependent on availability of Participants will be notified one week ahead of time for classes cancelled due to low enrolment.

WHAT'S UP AT THE LAKE

Lake Fees

Your invoice for your annual lake fee should have arrived in your mail box for the 2018 year. **If you have not received your invoice, contact the lake office for a copy.** Please be advised that this fee is mandatory and you cannot opt out of paying it. Fees are due on January 1st. Fees can be paid at the lake office by cash, cheque, debit, Visa or Mastercard (there will not be additional charges if you pay by credit card). You can also pay through your online banking using your account number, noted on your invoice.

Lake Hours

The lake will be open from 9am-5pm, Monday - Saturday for November. Lake hours will be extended again in December once we open for skating and ice fishing. Watch our website, social media or call the lake office for updates on lake hours.

Thin Ice

The lake should hopefully start to freeze over in November but please remember the ice will be extremely thin and dangerous! Stay off the ice and all docks when the red flags are up. The red flags will be removed once it is safe and we open for skating season!

When is the lake ready for skating?

No one will be allowed on the ice surface until a depth of 10" has been observed in our test locations. This will be on natural ice only (not resurfaced by the Olympia zamboni).

The Arbour Lake Olympia will not be put onto the ice until a depth of 15" has been observed in our test locations. Skaters will have to skate on the natural ice between depths of 10" to 15".

What do the flags mean?

Red flag = Full closure. Stay far away from the ice. Yellow flag = Partial closure. Contact the lake office or check the website for updates.

Green flag = Open for all Winter Activities

Clothing Donation Bin

Have your kids grown out of their new clothes before actually wearing them? Do you have clothes in your closet taking up space that you don't really wear? Arbour Lake Residents Association has a clothing donation bin in front of the lake office, close to the fire lane. Drop off your gently-used clothing to help clear up the clutter in your closet. Clothing will only be accepted in bags, dropped inside the container. Bags or items left next to the donation bin will be sent to the landfill. NO HOUSEHOLD GOODS PLEASE!

Did you know that over 10,000 tons of textiles was dumped into the City of Calgary landfill in 2014? That pile of clothes would be as tall as the Calgary Tower.

Fishing is Catch and Release ONLY!

At this time, only catch and release fishing will be permitted at Arbour Lake, until further notice. THERE WILL BE NO KEEPING OF ANY FISH OF ANY SIZE OR KIND! This is a result of Alberta Environment and Parks shutting down all fish stocking within the Bow River drainage area, of which Arbour Lake is included. Due to whirling disease found in the Bow River and commercial fish culture operations, the lake will not be stocked indefinitely, and as such, no fish may be kept indefinitely. Any fish that cannot be returned to the water, must be surrendered to a staff member.

Fishing

May only be done from designated fishing docks Hooks must be Barbless and egg hooks are not permitted. No Triple hooks are to be used. This ensures the survival of released fish.

No live bait, corn, bread, minnows, smelts, fish or nets may be used to catch fish.

Only one rod per resident may be cast at any one time and fishing lines must be attended to at all times. Random tackle box, bag and hook checks will be performed to ensure all Rules and Regulations are being followed.





When can I book hall rentals?



This group of girls has a wide range of guiding experience; we have girls who started 6 years ago as little year 4-year-old Sparks, right up to girls who are brand new to Girl Guides and only have two weekly meetings under their belts. Their honest, heartfelt, unedited answers are given below, and we're sure after reading them, you'll agree that there isn't a lot of opportunities for girls to be involved in an organization that can provide all of these things, in such a nice cohesive package.

So, what does being a Girl Guide allow me to do? It gives me an opportunity to make new friends and meet new people, to see nature and animals, to go on adventures, to have a peaceful moment with my friends, to make crafts, to sleep in tents or bunk beds, to volunteer, to explore new places, to learn to cook, and clean and be independent, to learn life skills, to learn new songs and games. This fall has been a busy one for our office. I joined Community and Social Services Minister Irfan Sabir to announce the LGBTQ2S+ Youth Housing and Shelter Guidelines. These guidelines will assist out homeless shelters in helping homeless LGBTQ2S+ youth who account for approximately 40% of the homeless youth population in our city.

I was also proud to stand alongside Advance Education Minister Marlin Schmidt at Bow Valley College as we announced funding for mental health supports for all Calgary post-secondaries. In Alberta, 64% of postsecondary students felt overwhelming anxiety, 57.5% reported feeling hopeless, more than 42% felt so depressed it was difficult to function, and 13.1% seriously considered suicide. This funding will help to provide the necessary supports our students require to succeed.

November is also a special month because it is the month that we put aside a day to Remember and give thanks for the sacrifices made by Canada's brave men and women who have served honourably to protect and preserve the rights and freedoms we as Canadians have today.

There will be many services held around Calgary on November 11th and many the week before. I encourage everyone to take time out of their busy lives to pay their respects to our brave men and women in the Canadian forces past and present who serve and have served with distinction and honor.

To the veterans and service men and women in Calgary-Hawkwood and across our nation, I would like to personally thank you for your dedication, commitment and sacrifices to this country of ours.
