

WHAT'S UP AT THE LAKE

Fishing is Catch and Release ONLY!

At this time, only catch and release fishing will be permitted at Arbour Lake, until further notice. THERE WILL BE NO KEEPING OF ANY FISH OF ANY SIZE OR KIND! This is a result of Alberta Environment and Parks shutting down all fish stocking within the Bow River drainage area, of which Arbour Lake is included. Due to whirling disease found in the Bow River and commercial fish culture operations, the lake will not be stocked indefinitely, and as such, no fish may be kept indefinitely. Any fish that cannot be returned to the water, must be surrendered to a staff member.

Fishing

May only be done from designated fishing docks Hooks must be Barbless and egg hooks are not permitted. No Triple hooks are to be used. This ensures the survival of released fish.

No live bait, corn, bread, minnows, smelts, fish or nets may be used to catch fish.

Only one rod per resident may be cast at any one time and fishing lines must be attended to at all times. Random tackle box, bag and hook checks will be performed to ensure all Rules and Regulations are being followed.


NOTICE

Lake Fees

Your invoice for your annual lake fee should arrive soon for the 2018 year. If you have not received your invoice by October 15th, please contact the lake office for a copy of your invoice. Please be advised that this fee is mandatory and you cannot opt out of paying it. Fees are due on January 1st. Fees can be paid at the lake office by cheque or debit or through your online banking using your external reference number.

Fall Lake Hours and Flags

As the lake gets cooler and the days get shorter, the lake will have reduced hours. Once the water temperature dips below 10°C, swimming and boating activities will be closed for the season. As soon as ice starts forming in the lake, the water becomes very dangerous and the lake area will be closed until the ice is thick enough for skating.

Flagpoles are located around the lake and at the front entrance, which indicate ice conditions as follows: RED FLAG: Full closure of the lake area (stay off and far away from the water).

YELLOW FLAG: Partial closure (contact the lake office or check the website for updates).

GREEN FLAG: Lake is open for all activities for the summer or winter season.

Reminder:

Calgary Police have asked us to remind residents that making a bike path in an existing City park space is illegal and carries a hefty fine for disturbing trees, soil and park vegetation of any kind.

BYLAW NUMBER 20M2003

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES 17. No Person shall: (a) dig, disturb or remove any mineral substance including soil, sand, gravel or rock from a Park; (b) damage, dig, cut, disturb or destroy any Park Vegetation, whether alive or dead; (c) damage, dig, disturb, deface, destroy or remove any fossils, bones or historical artifacts from a Park; (d) damage or destroy any wildlife habitat; or (e) pester, feed or otherwise interfere with any animal in a Park. http://www.calgary.ca/CA/city-clerks/Documents/ Legislative-services/Bylaws/20m2003-ParksPathways.pdf

Remembering Amie and thinking of her family at this difficult time

In December last year we ran a story about Amie who in 2014 moved to Calgary from England with her partner David and young family of three beautiful girls for a new life here in Calgary.

Amie and her family settled in very quickly to their new lives in Canada and loved Alberta, deciding Calgary was where they wanted to be and call home. Amie particularly liked the Arbour Lake community and the lake for days out with her family. However, in 2015 Amie found a lump in her breast and was diagnosed with an aggressive form of breast cancer. Determined to beat cancer, Amie had chemotherapy, double mastectomy and reconstructive surgery and intense radiation treatment. Amie's family and friends in awe of her courage and determination worked hard to raise funds to support treatments needed that might help Amie to extend her life. Everyone hoped Amie would beat it to be around to see her young family grow up which is all she ever wanted.

Sadly, Amie's health declined unexpectedly and rather quickly and on August 15th. Amie passed away peacefully surrounded by her loving family. Amie was a much-loved mother of her three daughters Mackenzie 14, Imogen ten and Kennedy three as well as long-time partner to David. She was a loving daughter to Audrey and dad John as well as a special aunt and much-loved granddaughter to Shirley. She was also an amazing friend to many who knew and loved her and in these final years admired her greatly the way she fought so hard to beat this awful disease.

David, Amie's partner has had to give up work in recent weeks to take care of his three daughters and to organize Amie's funeral that took place on 23rd of August. 
Forest Lawn Library Nature Playground

American Kestrel: Small Acrobatic Gliders

Gliding to the left and right, the American Kestrel keeps a sharp eye on the earth below for flickering blades of grass or the rustling of bushes. A member of the raptor family, the American Kestrel is easy to identify because it is the smallest of the North American falcons and the most colourful. Male and female Kestrels are dressed in a rusty red but only the males are garnished with a brilliant slate blue on their head and wings. They are easily spotted in open grassland areas, such as meadows and farmer's fields. They also can be seen in city areas

and suburbs. Fun Facts:

- These raptors rely on abandoned Woodpecker holes, tree hollows and other empty cavities that are found in the environment to make their home.
- Your backyard could become a suitable home for the Kestrel but it won't be in a regular birdhouse. A nesting box, nailed to a tree, high above the yard and away from sources of noise could provide a suitable home for a feathered family.
- They may repay you by keeping pesky rodents out of your yard!
- Like many raptors, the American Kestrel hunts for insects such as grasshoppers, beetles and spiders as well as small vertebrate prey such as mice, voles,

shrews, songbirds and occasionally, frogs, snakes and small lizards.

- Some brave Kestrels have been spotted preying on larger creatures, such as red squirrels.
- One characteristic that gives the American Kestrel the upper hand on small prey is their ability to see ultraviolet light. This feature gives them the power to see urine trails created by small rodents and other creatures, leading them to their next meal.
- This raptor can also be the hunted: as the smallest falcon, they become easy prey to other raptors, such as Barn Owls, Goshawks and Red-tailed Hawks. Large reptiles such as rat snakes and corn snakes will also take Kestrels as prey.

When you are out on your next walk, keep an eye to the sky, you may just see the Kestrel gliding through the air or perched on a light post or telephone post. If you come across an injured American Kestrel, or any other wildlife in distress, please contact Calgary Wildlife Rehabilitation Society wildlife hotline at 403-239-2488.

Impacts of Blue Light and Screen Time

What is blue light?

Blue light is also known as high energy visible (HEV) light. Aside from sunlight, the most common sources of blue light today come from digital devices such as smart phones, tablets, computers and TVs. Other sources include fluorescent lamps, and LED lights. Blue light's high energy penetrates into deeper layers of the eye compared to other colours of lower energy.

How does blue light impact you?

1. Digital eye strain may develop gradually. Increased problems with blurred vision, dryness, slow focusing between near and far objects, headache, neck and shoulder pain are symptoms of computer vision syndrome. Research indicates that eye coordination disorders and increase in myopia (nearsightedness) are linked with prolonged digital eyestrain.



SNEEZE AND BE MERRY!

In a number of cultures around the world, the response to a sneeze is typically to wish God would bless the sneezer, or to wish the sneezer health and long life. And the usual responses are to say thank-you or to excuse oneself for the sneeze. Studies suggest long term exposure to blue light and UV light from a young age may increase risk of cataracts and age related macular degeneration later in life.
The natural release of melatonin is suppressed by blue light, thus increasing alertness to the brain and disrupting sleep patterns. Limiting screen time before bed may help those who have problems sleeping.

Device advice

Since digital screens are unavoidable for many in the schools and workplace, eye doctors and Canadian pediatricians provide guidelines to parents and children:

• Limit screen time for children to 2 hours per day and follow the 20/20/20 rule.

• Infants and toddlers under 2 years of age should have zero screen time.

- Avoid "text neck." Children unknowingly bring the screen too close when concentrating.
- No digital devices in the bedrooms, to avoid affecting sleep patterns.

• Visit your optometrist to determine if glasses with blue blocker filters are needed to ease digital eyestrain.

• Develop ground rules with your family to keep digital device use at safe levels.
