




Summer in Review

WHAT'S UP AT THE LAKE

Fishing is Catch and Release ONLY!

At this time, only catch and release fishing will be permitted at Arbour Lake, until further notice, THERE WILL BE NO KEEPING OF ANY FISH OF ANY SIZE OR KIND! This is a result of Alberta Environment and Parks shutting down all fish stocking within the Bow River drainage area, of which Arbour Lake is included. Due to whirling disease found in the Bow River and commercial fish culture operations, the lake will not be stocked indefinitely, and as such, no fish may be kept indefinitely. Any fish that cannot be returned to the water, must be surrendered to a staff member.

Fishing

May only be done from designated fishing docks Hooks must be Barbless and egg hooks are not permitted. No Triple hooks are to be used. This ensures the survival of released fish.

No live bait, corn, bread, minnows, smelts, fish or nets may be used to catch fish.

Only one rod per resident may be cast at any one time and fishing lines must be attended to at all times. Random tackle box, bag and hook checks will be performed to ensure all Rules and Regulations are being followed.

Clothing Donation Bin

Have your kids grown out of their new clothes before actually wearing them? Do you have clothes in your closet taking up space that you don't really wear? Arbour Lake Residents Association has a clothing donation bin in front of the lake office, close to the fire lane. Drop off your gently used clothing to help clear up the clutter in your closet. Clothing will only be accepted in bags, dropped inside the container. Please do not leave bags next to the donation bin. Bags or items left next to the donation bin will be sent to the landfill. NO HOUSE-HOLD GOODS PLEASE!

Did you know that over 10,000 tons of textiles was dumped into the City of Calgary landfill in 2014? That pile of clothes would be as tall as the Calgary Tower.



BYLAW NUMBER 20M2003

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES 17. No Person shall: (a) dig, disturb or remove any mineral substance including soil, sand, gravel or rock from a Park; (b) damage, dig, cut, disturb or destroy any Park Vegetation, whether alive or dead; (c) damage, dig, disturb, deface, destroy or remove any fossils, bones or historical artifacts from a Park; (d) damage or destroy any wildlife habitat; or (e) pester, feed or otherwise interfere with any animal in a Park. http://www.calgary.ca/CA/city-clerks/Documents/



As our kids get back to school, please pay extra attention when driving, especially around schools and playgrounds. At our last council meeting in July, I re-introduced a motion to have administration look into requiring school buses to use their flashing lights when picking up and dropping off children. This is the norm in most other jurisdictions and can be achieved at zero cost to taxpayers because buses are already equipped with these safety features. I thank council for voting 12-1 in favour of this motion.

Another important vote in council was on the issue of an Olympic Bid Plebiscite. I supported Councillor Sean Chu's Motion for a plebiscite because I believed that a decision of this magnitude, both financially and culturally, should be made directly by Calgarians. I also believed that by October, voters could have had sufficient information to make an informed decision on this matter. Unfortunately, the majority of City Council voted against a plebiscite. As exciting as an Olympic Bid may be, I do not want to see the kind of costs downloaded on Calgary taxpayers that have been prevalent in many other cities that have hosted Olympic events.

Construction of the new "Shane Homes YMCA" on Country Hills Boulevard in Rocky Ridge is in its final stages and is scheduled to be complete at the end of this year and opened to the public in early 2018. When opened, this facility will contain an 8-lane competition pool, Leisure pool with a wave system and water slides, multipurpose ice rink, 3 full gymnasiums, Fitness centre, Library, 300-seat theatre and many more amenities. I would like to thank Shane Homes for their \$3.5 million investment in the new recreation centre that will serve all of northwest Calgary for many years to come.

Blue-winged Teal – a Little Dabbler

The Blue-winged Teal is a small, dabbling duck that is only about 16 inches (40 cm) long, with a wingspan of 23 inches (58 cm) and weighing in at only 13 ounces (370 g). The adult male has a rounded slate blue head with a crescent shaped band of feathers behind its black bill and in front of its black eyes. The male has a light brown body with a white patch near the rear and a black tail, and shows a blue patch with a white border on its fore wings, especially when in flight. The adult female is a mottled or scalloped grey-brown with a whitish patch at the base of the tail and bill, and a dark line through its black eye.

Fun Facts:

- A dabbling duck feeds on the surface on vegetation or water insects just ducking its head under water, or by tipping right up, pointing its tail end upwards while feeding on submerged vegetation
- The Blue-winged Teal's formal name (Anis discors) comes from the Latin words for "a duck" (Anis) and discors or "disc about the mouth" which may refer to the face pattern of the male.
- This is the most common teal in Alberta's grassland and parkland areas. Although it is found in the right habitat throughout the province, the Blue-winged Teal is most common in central and southern Alberta.
- This dabbler is most often found in the calmer waters of marshes, sloughs, ponds and the weedy edges of

- small lakes. Nests are built in concealing grasses or vegetation on dry land, but near to water.
- This little duck hangs out in pairs or small groups spending most of their time foraging in shallow waters.
- In the late summer, the Blue-winged Teal undergoes a moult (during which they shed their old feathers and grow new ones), which prevents them from flying so they will spend this time in prairie sloughs or large marshes with good food supplies.
- These dabblers are the first ducks to go south in the fall and the last ones to arrive north for the breeding season in the spring. It is likely that they leave early and arrive back late because they are long distance migrators, some going as far as South America - a Blue-winged Teal banded in Alberta was found in Venezuela a month later!

HALL RENTALS BASICS

Can I rent the hall?

Any person over the age of 21 may rent the hall. The hall can be rented for independent group programs, presentations and personal events such as birthday parties.

When can I book hall rentals?

Hall rentals must be booked at the Lake office Monday -Friday from 9am - 4pm. You must come into the lake office to book your rental as we must go through a rental contract and necessary information with you.

What do I need to rent the hall?






