

We are in the homestretch of our BAS Program before we kick it up a gear and switch to day camps for the summer months!

This year has been a whirlwind for us. We spent a lot of time outside during the past few months and loved it (thank you, mild winter and spring)! Summer registrations and September waitlist registrations were also in full gear, as well as we went through our Re-Accreditation process in May which was challenging but rewarding and a great way to push our program practices!

During the Re-Accreditation process, we created a new policy, the QEP Policy, that we wanted to share on behalf of our program:

"The aim of a QEP is to allow us, as childcare providers to self-assess our performance in delivering quality education and care and to plan future enhancements. The accreditation standards are based on current research and leading practices focusing on outcomes related to children, staff, families, and community. Complete program reviews will be completed each year with the families and staff within the program. Individual room reviews with the children will also be completed at a minimum of once per year however they could be conducted more often during the year. The next step is to determine where quality enhancements can be made and plan how to implement changes. Any and all changes will be added directly into our working QEP plan and will be communicated with all stakeholders."

Our Summer Camp is chalk full of daily adventures with an incredible average of 3 offsite fieldtrips/week! Deerfoot Trail Study

Deerfoot Trail is an urban expressway for Calgarians, connecting them to their community, workplace or destination. Alberta Transportation and The City are partnering on a study for Deerfoot Trail from Stoney Trail North to Stoney Trail South. With up to 189,000 vehicles per day travelling on Deerfoot Trail we know there are challenges driving on this road. Through this study, we are looking at ways to better manage traffic and will provide short, medium and long-term recommendations to improve safety and reliability on this road.

Where is the study area?

Deerfoot Trail, between the Stoney Trail interchanges in the north and south. The study area is 37.5 km long, and includes 20 interchanges. Approximately 44 communities border the study area.

Why is this study needed?

Deerfoot Trail is Calgary's oldest freeway, and the busiest in Alberta. The majority of Deerfoot Trail was built between 1971 and 1982. The city's population has doubled since 1981 and the road is no longer meeting current traffic demand, resulting in traffic congestion, unreliability and safety concerns.

Oysterscale taking toll on Beddington Hedges

Last year, Inglewood lost many of its hedges to the damaging oystershell scale and because of the warm dry spring, it appears the invasive pest is now taking its toll on many hedges and shrubs in other Calgary communities- including Beddington.

The oystershell scale insect is damaging many cotoneaster hedges and can impact over 120 species such as lilacs, green ash and crabapple trees often grown in Calgary. If areas of your cotoneaster suddenly go brown, it may be infested with the tiny vampires that suck juices out of the plant. If you look closely at the plant, you'll see little bumps and ridges that look like oyster shells which is the protective armor that the little bugs hide under.

If oystershell has only damaged a small area of the plant, prune heavily infested twigs and branches and spot treated with insecticidal soap. But if it has spread, you will need to chop the plant right down and treat the stumps. The vulnerable life stage called a crawler is active from late May through early June. Crawlers may be managed with a registered insecticide from late May through early June or try a horticultural oil applied to conserve natural enemies of this armored scale insect.

BBQ Season is upon us!

Your Calgary Fire Department wants you to grill safely!

- Propane, natural gas & charcoal BBQ's should **only** be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area
- Keep your BBQ clean by removing grease or fat build-up from the grills and in trays below to reduce the risk of flash fires
- Never leave your grill unattended.

NATURAL GAS/PROPANE GRILLS

- Always make sure the lid on your gas grill is open before lighting it.
- Check hoses for leaks at the start of BBQ season by applying a light soapy water solution to the hose, a gas leak will release bubbles
- If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill, then get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again.
- If you smell gas while cooking and cannot safely turn off the gas, then immediately get away from the grill and call the *Fire Department*, **DO NOT move the grill**. If the flame goes out, turn off and wait at least 15 minutes before re-lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches
- If you use a starter fluid, use only *charcoal* starter fluid.
- Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to a fire OR while hot coals are present.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

construction zone safety

Imagine sitting in your cubicle with cars whizzing by dangerously close to your work space and so fast that you can feel the tailwind. Well, that's just what many City employees experience every day when they are out working in the field.

"The only protection that we have are those signs and the cones. It's all that separates our workers and the traffic," says Marco Nicoletti, Roads Foreman. The "My Dad Works Here" Construction Zone Safety campaign is a joint initiative with Roads and Water Services, spotlighting the kids of employees working in high traffic construction areas.

It isn't always easy to maintain your patience when you're delayed in traffic because of road or utility work, but for the safety of the workers doing their job and for your safety too, it's important to slow down, stay alert and obey all posted signs.

So, keep an eye out for *My Dad Works Here* signs popping up in construction zones in late May.

The latest resource Fandrich's team uses to educate Calgarians on development and building regulations is the webpage calgary.ca/homeimprovement, which allows anyone interested in doing a renovation to browse popular home renovation topics for bylaw and permit information, property and land designation, drawings and forms they will need to complete their home renovation.

"It can sometimes be difficult to understand when you need a permit and what City bylaws might impact your project - we're here to help guide you through the process," Fandrich says.

News from the Friends of Nose Hill

Calgary: City of Animals, this year’s U. of C. community forum, brought together Canadian scholars in history, animal studies, and geography to explore the roles that animals play. The fur trade, cattle ranching, and the Stampede are part of our history. So too is our relationship with animals and it is interesting to adopt that perspective about our shared spaces, as well as the city’s past, present, and future.

We categorize urban animals in different ways, as wild and domestic, livestock, companions, and entertainers. Have you thought of how your interaction with animals shapes Calgary and traces were left on geography, and identity? Consider the routes animals take and the places where they live. We can learn more about viewing the city as an ecosystem, that includes animal life, and see/be humans as “one animal” among many in the urban environment.

Shelley Alexander, a lead in the Candid Conservation Science Lab, made a study of human-wildlife conflict, especially wolves and coyotes, both in the field and using a geographical information system (GIS). Sean Kheraj is co-editor at niche-canada.org of Nature’s Past: Canadian Environmental History Podcast. Susan Nance, who studies entertainment, communication, performance, and historical animal life, is associated with animal welfare. For information you can go to: www.facebook.com/CalgaryInstitute.

You can become a Parks volunteer and help take care of natural areas, off-leash areas, parks, green spaces, playgrounds, pathways, trees; conduct research; and provide park users with interpretive experiences. Individuals commit six shifts per season. For example at Nose Hill Park, you will greet visitors; offer information; present “biofacts”; lead interpretive activities; and promote Parks programs.

If you are looking for a volunteer project for your company or group, join the Parks Environmental Team

on a green initiative project, such as invasive species (weed) pulls, painting projects, playground renewals, and more.

Volunteers of all backgrounds, abilities, and experience are invited to contribute. Once accepted, volunteers receive orientation, training, and support. To apply, call 311 or email: parksvolunteer@calgary.ca.
