





Happy New Year!

We hope you had a wonderful holiday season with friends and family! With the holiday season wrapping up and winter in full swing many pet owners have been contacting the shelter looking for ways to keep Fido entertained when the weather is too cold for outdoor fun. Winter is a great time for dog training! A calm, indoor environment is a great place to begin training skills before heading out into more challenging, distracting, outdoor location. To help you get a start on winter training we've put together a list of ten skills every dog should know!

Loose leash walking – Loose leash walking not only makes the afternoon stroll more relaxing, but safer for both humans and animals.

"Leave it!" – Leaving an item alone is a vital skill. Whether it is a dropped piece of medication or an abandoned food container on a walk, a well-learned "leave it" command can help prevent Fido from gobbling up a dangerous snack.

Recall – Coming when called, first time and every time, has rescued many a dog from a dangerous situation. Recall commands can call dogs away from traffic, prevent them from approaching unfriendly dogs or create distance between your dog and other potential hazards. **Sit** – Sitting is a classic skill that serves as a foundation to build other skills.

Drop it – Sometimes, despite our best efforts, Fido gets ahold of something dangerous or inappropriate. Teaching a "drop it" skill provides you with a safe way to retrieve an item from your dog.

Focus or "watch me" – Teaching your dog name attention and focus will help them respond better to other commands.

Stay – The "stay" command can also help to keep a dog a way from dangerous situations or can buy you extra time to evaluate a situation before acting.

Wait – Knowing that your dog will "wait" in the back seat instead of bolting out the car door brings peace of mind as well as safety.

Release – Teaching your dog a set release cue gives you

10 Important Behaviours All Dogs Should Know!

a way to end a stay, sit or wait.

Polite Greetings – Teaching your dog to greet other people and animals with "four on the floor" prevents accidental scratches and falls from excitable jumping and pawing, particularly if children visit often.

How can I teach my dog these skills?

A structured behaviour class is a great way to help you and your dog build an even better relationship while you both learn important skills. Calgary Humane Society offers a wide variety of behaviour classes for Fido. We also have many free training resources on our website at blog at www.calgaryhumane.ca.

Safety First: Tobogganing and Sledding

Building Safe Communities Program

Winter is a great season to get outdoors, especially the thrill of tobogganing and/or sledding. Here are some helpful reminders if you decide to partake in this fun winter activity:

1. Inspect your ride

Inspect all your equipment for any cracks or broken parts, this includes toboggan or sled, helmet and ensure that you can keep your equipment under control. **2. Be cautious**

Slide during the day time and in well-lit areas, be aware of potential hazards like holes, fences, trees and signs. **3. Ready, Set, Slide**

Ensure the path is clear, keep control and kneeling or sitting feet first face is the safest method to ride.

4. Maintained hills

Did you know that the Parks and Bylaw prohibit toboggan or sledding downhill in a city-maintained park? However there are 20+ hills across the city that has been maintained for your safety. To find which hills are maintained for public use check the city website at calgary.ca

Compost Your Real Christmas Tree

Make it a green Christmas and compost your real tree this year. There are now two ways to compost your real tree: Use your green cart *or* drop your real tree off at one of our 12 drop-off locations between December 25 and January 31. If composting in your green cart, follow the same steps as you would for branches in your yard. All trees should be free of lights, ornaments, tinsel, tree stands and string, and should not be wrapped or bagged. Visit Calgary.ca/christmastree for more information.

All trees collected will be composted with the other food and yard waste collected from the Green Cart program. By composting your Christmas tree, you can keep waste out of our landfills and reduce harmful greenhouse gas emissions.

Outdoor Play for Winter

Winter outdoor play is so much fun! All ages can get into the groove of doing some physical activity everyday! Just remember to dress for the weather (hat, mitts, boots, snow pants, jacket, scarf). Watch the forecast and even if the weather is extremely cold, a little fresh air (10 minutes) can help keep us happy and healthy. It also fights off the winter blues!

Different types of free activities include:

- make a snowman
- make snow angels in the snow
- build a snow fort
- have a snowball fight (safety first of course)
- go on a walk in the neighbourhood
- sleigh rides
- snow painting (food colouring and water in a squeeze bottle and make designs on the snow)
- use those summer toys (shovels and buckets) and make snow castles
- blow ice bubbles (use regular bubbles and watch them freeze)
- sledding/tobogganing (remember to use proper headgear for this activity)
- be a snow detective (chill dark coloured fabric in the freezer for 10 minutes and then bring it outdoors to catch snowflakes. The cold fabric will give your kids more time to examine their specimens before they melt)

- animal track discovery (look in the backyard at the various tracks and try to figure out what animal made them)
- winter photography (go for a walk and take pictures of the interesting parts of the winter)
- make a snow-obstacle course with tunnels, steps, and jumps

- winter hiking
- winter camping
- snowshoeing
- ice fishina
- cross country skiing
- attend a dog sled race
