CAMBRIAN HEIGHTS PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The continuing focus of the Community remains the filing of the Re-designation Application DL2018-0062 converting the Community's existing Reserve (S-SPR) Park land bounded by 10th Street and 32nd Avenue into S-CRI (Special Purpose - City and Regional Infrastructure) classification and then the proposed expansion of the Queen's Park Cemetery ("QPC") onto these lands. These Reserve Lands are currently being utilized as an Off-Leash Dog Park. The original application was filed March 19 with responses required by April 13 to City Planning and Development. With an overwhelming opposition to this application from individuals and the Community Association expressed in emails to Planning and Development, City Parks as well as Councillor Sean Chu, City Parks agreed to "slow down" the process.



Two "drop-in engagement" sessions took place at Highwood Community Hall April 25 and May 9. The comment period for residents was held open till May 25. Calgary Parks continued however to disguise this Application as a dog park issue and presented the expansion of the QPC onto the second largest Park Reserve lands within Cambrian Heights as their sole right. They sought in their engagement sessions to address only two issues; alternative off leash dog areas and annotating the application process. No attempt was made to justify the need for QPC expansion and the annexation of this park forever. The Community Association provided members outside the Hall for both these meetings to answer questions and explain the issues to residents attending the sessions. A photo from the first meeting is shown where the only true engagement with Parks and Planning representatives took place informally in the parking lot.

As pointed out last month, this coercive approach to "annexing" these Park Lands is a repeat of Calgary Parks efforts in 2005-6 to expand the QPC into these lands. Details of this history and how the Community Association

successfully fought this application may be found on our website (www.cambrianheightscommunity.com). In July 2006, City Council instructed Calgary Parks to not proceed with the acquisition of these lands for QPC expansion but rather to search out lands in the southern part of the City for a new cemetery. That of course was 12 years ago. They have failed to complete that mandate and want our Community to pay the price.

The Community Association continued through May to lobby Calgary Parks to withdraw the Application. Repeatedly Parks officials have quoted inventory within the existing boundaries of QPC to be 2-3 years. That is with the current 2017 practice of selling pre-needs burial sites at twice the rate of at need sites. This artificial "demand" could be easily reduced to extend further the existing life of QPC. This is against the scheduled opening of the City's new cemetery in south Calgary slated for late 2019. We are apprehensive, since there have been no future plans provided of a desire by Calgary parks to continue to expand QPC over the years to satisfy the demand for an inner-city cemetery at the expense of park lands in our community. At the writing of this letter the Planning Department will be making a recommendation to the Calgary Planning Commission ("CPC") in June/July and the further recommendation of CPC going to City Council in the Fall. At that point Council will allow presentations or submissions by interested parties. We encourage all residents to follow developments closely on our website and by joining our Facebook page (Cambrian Heights Community) which may be easily accessed from our website.



On a positive note, the first Jane's Walk held in our Community on May 5 was a resounding success with over 50 attendees, with children and dogs, walking the neighbourhood. A picture of the attendees leaving the Community Hall is shown. Thanks to organizers Pablo Policzer and Jodi Dixon everyone learned of the com-

munity history and met some of the original homeowners within Cambrian Heights dating back to 1956. At the end everyone returned to the Community Hall for refreshments and conversations with new friends.

The Annual General Meeting was held on May 15 with higher attendance than is usually the case. The Park issue discussion plus attendance by Councillor Sean Chu made it an evening well worth attending. Our presentation and the Community financials have been added to the website for your reference.





International Migratory Bird Day in May was when we offered a free guided walk during the peak time for migrating birds, especially songbirds, to return to Calgary. It is also when they are actively searching for and establishing nesting sites. There is a link on our website to past bird observations for the species that may be seen on Nose Hill. The males will be singing to attract a female and they tend to be most active at an early hour, from sunrise until 10 a.m. In addition, there was an evening Flower Walk to identify and discuss the May Count of Plants in Bloom.

The 2000 Calgary Pathways and Bikeways Plan is being updated to reflect changes to the existing network, updated connections, and approved policies. Priorities will also be reviewed, to determine new pathways, bikeways, and missing connections, so as to improve connections city-wide. With the consultation currently underway, it is anticipated that the final plan will be presented to City Council, in July or Sept. 2018.

The 2003 Calgary Parks and Pathways Bylaw is being reviewed. A report will summarize the feedback received and offer an analysis to determine if a second phase of engagement is required. Once the process is complete, the results of the consultation will be posted on the City's website. During the summer, a project team will determine next steps, before the updated bylaw is drafted and presented to City Council for approval in the fall of 2018.

Although the survey is now closed, part of it asked about linear parks for walking, running, cycling, and dog walking. Another was about pathway use year-round, ranging from popular routes for recreational activities; community connection for walking to schools, community stores, or centres; and for commuting to and from work.

Smoking in outdoor recreational spaces; responsible pet ownership rules for on-leash and off-leash; and tree protection on public land, including in city parks, are not part of the review. However, the Parks Bylaw and others may need to be changed to reflect the legalization of recreational cannabis.



Gypsy jazz trio Monsieur Periné kicks off the month with a funny, socially progressive performance at Arts Commons, followed quickly by If It Ain't Got That Swing by the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, which transports audiences to the era of Ella Fitzgerald, Ethel Waters and Cab Calloway.

For the deep thinkers, TEDxYYC ignites discussion with a series of powerful speakers at their ninth annual event. This year they cover areas in technology, entertainment, and design. It's Calgary's largest and most well-attended independently organized TED event.

Speaking of technology, the Adult Recreational Choir – make up of 150 voices – have created an epic musical tribute to human ingenuity and invention. They will pay tribute to the men and women who have transformed the world as we know it.

495 New Jobs for Calgary Confederation

I am pleased to announce that Calgary Confederation will see 495 jobs created through 163 community groups, small businesses and non-profit organizations with the assistance of \$1,306,561 of funding from the Canada Summer Jobs program.

This is a substantial increase from last year's 361 jobs that were created with 132 employers in Calgary Confederation.

We know that services from non-profit organizations and community associations often increase in the summer months and many were concerned about their ability to offer employment opportunities again this year.

Unfortunately, a number of applicants who had previously provided critical summer jobs were banned from receiving funding this year because they refused to support the Liberal government's values test. This has had a negative impact across Canada as organizations were rejected at an alarming rate. The latest numbers show the rejection rate this year was 12 times that of last year.

Many of these organizations provide critical employment experience and skills training for young Canadians. Statistics show us that unemployment amongst young Canadians is the highest of any age group and so the real job experience they obtain through summer jobs is critical to future employability.

The Canada Summer Jobs program provides funding to assist employers to create summer opportunities for young people aged 15 to 30 years who are full-time students intending to return to their studies this fall.

With this funding, young people will learn or improve job skills and gain work experience with local employers in areas such as retail, hospitality, marketing, technology, research and communications.

Employers will get to extend their services through the summer, allowing a variety of camps, children's programs, specialized teaching opportunities, and unique community service programs for all ages.

This is a valuable program and I encourage community groups, small businesses and non-profit organizations to consider applying for funding next year. Hopefully, Trudeau's values test will be eliminated for next year's applications.


