### **CITY PARKS & PATHWAYS**

#### **Edgemont Ravine**

Edgebrook Dr. & Edgebrook Blvd. NW

35.5 hectares of networking ravines in the northwest section of the city are completely surrounded by the community of Edgemont. The naturalized marsh was one of the first to be constructed as part of the water management scheme in a community development. The community and park were established in the late 1970s. Access to the ravines is available through the parking lot on the east side of Edgebrook Blvd. NW.

#### Ranchlands Park

700 Ranchlands Blvd. NW.

Ranchlands Park occupies about 12 hectares in the community of Ranchlands in the northwest part of the city. The park was established when the community was developed in the 1970s.

#### **Nose Hill Park**

5620 14 St. NW

Area: 1129 hectares

Nose Hill Natural Environment Park lies in the northwest part of the city, surrounded by 12 residential communities. The park was created in 1980 and covers over 11 square kilometres. The hill most likely gets its name from the fact that, from certain locations and with a little imagination, it looks like a nose.

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I believe this is the most important skill in the game because when you hit the ball more solidly, you have more fun, it goes farther, straighter, higher, spins more and your distance control will be more consistent. If you are not striking the ball solidly and consistently, here is a check list for you to review along with a video tip demonstrating a great drill that should help you out:

Always start with a good review of your set up/starting **position**. Make sure you have good alignment, body posture, knees slightly flexed, arms extended but relaxed and "hanging naturally", and the ball position correctly positioned in your stance.

As you make your golf swing, ensure that your **posture** is being maintained until after impact by keeping your head "still".

Remember, as you approach your impact position, you want to ensure your body is rotating thus your weight distribution is moving more into your target side (trail heel coming slightly off the ground) compared to your starting position and that you deliver the golf club similarly to that of your address (similar posture, head behind the ball, arms extended, club squared). You also want to ensure that for shots from off the ground (fairway/rough), that your hands are just slightly ahead of the club head at impact (in other words, the grip end of the shaft is **slightly** leaning towards the target). This will ensure a proper "descending" angle of attack into the ball with a divot being made AFTER ball contact.

The challenge for many golfers relates to excessive <u>lat-</u> eral movement during the swing which results in difficulty delivering the club head consistently into the ball near the bottom part of the arc of the swing (remember...the bottom of the swing should take place just AFTER impact, thus ball impact...then divot). This excess lateral movement and incorrect sequence of motion often results in hitting the ground first (hitting it "fat") or topping the ball (hitting it "thin"), etc. One great drill to fix this swing fault is to make some swings and hit some balls with a short/middle iron using the "mini swing drill" where your swing length is shorter, your stance is narrower, and your tempo is smooth. Another great drill is demonstrated in the link below by PGA Professional, Rick Smith, Please click on the link, watch the tip and practice both drills at the practice range and watch your ball striking improve!!

Recently I was told that the City does not collect cycle use data on Nose Hill and there were no 311 calls about it. Now there is a colour-coded Global Heatmap of human activities, such as running or cycling on the regional pathway system. You can use the toggle labels to check locations, for Nose Hill Park or your community. Through social media athletes network in real time.

Local Action for Biodiversity means each local government has a long-term local strategy, action plan, and will implement on-the-ground initiatives. The edits to The City's biodiversity webpage have now been made. The page better reflects the strategic plan, as well as providing details on the BiodiverCity Advisory Committee. Agendas and minutes are at: www.calgary.ca/ biodiversity. As the Committee advances its work plans, further refinement and expansion of the webpage is expected. A report to City Council will go forward in the spring.

The CBC is looking for photos of Calgary's wildlife, animals, and birds for a photo gallery on their website. The contact person is: heather.moriarty@cbc.ca. She is just in the process of collecting photographs now and if people are interested they should email them to her. She hopes to have the online photo gallery put together and posted within the next couple of weeks. "We are featuring photos that were taken in Calgary. The idea is to show all of the wildlife that can be found within city limits. We will credit the photographers, identify the animal/bird in the photo, and let people know approximately where in the city it was photographed."

In 2014, City Parks and Roads received a one-time grant from the Council Innovation Fund of \$300,000 for an automated, interactive Parks and Roads Map. With the number of 311 service requests, it has been challenging to have accurate information. Soon the system on www.calgary.ca will improve access to up-to-date data for Parks and Roads services, such as mowing and snow ploughing.

Calgary has one of the highest allocations of greenspace of any city in North America. There are 693 natural areas which make up over 50% of the park space in Calgary. Natural areas give priority to the protection of vegetation and wildlife over human use when the two come into conflict.

This spring, Transportation Network Companies (TNCs) like Uber will be able to legally operate in The City of Calgary. Like most Calgarians, I believe in free enterprise, which is why I supported the creation of a new bylaw to provide more choice and competition amongst TNCs. The new bylaw will allow TNCs to operate in a fair and competitive market. They address citizen, driver and passenger safety and ensure greater competition and customer service. The bylaw proposes common sense requirements for TNCs' including:

- An annual operating licence from The City of Calgary;
- Valid Class 4 driver's licence:
- Annual Calgary Police Service (CPS) background check;
- Proof of valid commercial insurance as required by the Government of Alberta:
- Proof of eligibility to work in Canada;
- Proof of provincially-approved 134-point mechanical inspection, conducted annually or every 50,000 km whatever comes first.

While it is important that we have more choice and competition amongst TNCs, it is also important that the new bylaw provides adequate safety and security for both drivers and passengers of TNCs. I believe that this new bylaw will achieve this balance and provide all Calgarians with more choice, and allow TNC's to operate in a fair and competitive market.

Pedestrian safety is another important issue that we have been taking action on. This spring, new crosswalks have been installed and current crosswalks have been enhanced at numerous locations in Ward 2. This includes an enhanced crosswalk at Rocky Ridge Road and Royal Oak Way, a new pedestrian corridor on Crowfoot Way in Crowfoot Centre, and more will be coming throughout this spring and summer.

Over 100 people attended the open house on the Sarcee Trail Interchange at Stoney Trail to provide their feedback on the proposed improvements. These improvements will make the interchange safer, more efficient for all users and help reduce travel times for the movement of goods and for commuters traveling southbound on Sarcee Trail to eastbound Stoney Trail. Construction is anticipated to begin in early May. Please

### MP Pat Kelly Introduces Motion to Study CRA Duty of Care to Taxpayers

Greetings residents of Calgary Rocky Ridge! Let me start by thanking you for choosing me as your representative in Parliament. I look forward to working with the Community Associations, individuals, and other stakeholders to voice your concerns in Ottawa and advocate for sound policy on your behalf. To that end, I would like to tell you about my Private Member's Motion to increase protection for Canadian taxpayers.

After each general election, a new session of Parliament is convened and all MPs are given a chance to put forth a bill or motion. My name came up as number six in the draw, meaning that I will be in the first batch of private members' business.

My motion instructs the House of Commons Finance Committee to study and report on ways to create a duty of care between the Canada Revenue Agency and Canadian taxpayers, such as by enhancing the Taxpayer Bill of Rights and making it legally enforceable. The motion also proposes empowering the CRA Ombudsman's Office to direct CRA to comply with Tax Court orders and official decisions. These measures should provide clear expectations for CRA, and should protect taxpayers from frivolous, vexatious, malicious, and grossly negligent behaviour by it.
