





My name is Shahrukh Abid, and I reside in the Hawkwood community. I represent the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, whose slogan is "Love for All, Hatred for None." The misconceptions surrounding my religion have unfortunately struck fear in people's hearts - which is sometimes apparent even in Calgary. The purpose behind writing these articles is to educate our neighbours in the Hawkwood/Citadel community about the religion of Islam, demystify any misconceptions and answer questions that our neighbours might have. Our community's mosque (place of worship) is located in the northeast of Calgary, next to the Prairie Winds Park.

Unity of GOD

Belief in the eternal truth of the oneness of God is the root of all beliefs. All religions share the common believe in God, a master of this universe. In Islam, "Allah" applies to ONE God and no one else. Allah has no mother no father nor a spouse, He is One. The purity of Islam is based on the foundation of belief in the absolute unity of God. It is believed that all sources of strength and energy is exclusively dependant on God, the master, and there is no all-encompassing power except Allah. This belief disregards all fears expect that of the fear of God, which means to try and avoid


displeasing Him and to rather please him with good deeds. Rather than to please this world, man should please his creator by letting go of his ego and pride and turn to the master of this world, Allah.

The FONHS hosted a free guided walk (2 hours) on Nose Hill to identify flowers and discuss the May Count of Plants in Bloom. Our guide was John McFaul, a professional naturalist who has been leading nature walks and hikes for 30 years. He received a BSc degree in Environmental Biology from the University of Calgary. John is an accredited Professional Interpreter with the Interpretive Guides Association, a member of the Friends of Nose Hill, and an honourary member of the Calgary Field Naturalists' Society (Nature Calgary). He has the Loran L. Goulden Award and the Frank & Alice Harper Memorial Award from the Federation of Alberta Naturalists.

The Alberta May Count of Plants in Bloom is an annual event sponsored by Nature Alberta to record plants in bloom in Alberta during the last week in May, using a standardized approach. The purpose is to provide information on the distribution of flowering plants in Alberta. This monitors the spread of non-native species and provides insights into the response of plants to variations in climate.

The City is responsible for the planning, design, construction, maintenance, and programming for 800 kilometers of pathways. Calgary has the largest urban bike path system in North America. Let's keep this in mind while Nose Hill needs restoration and trails are closed to protect wildlife habitat.

You can download the new Pathways & Bikeways App from www.calgary.ca. The map is now in three formats: Mobile Application, Online, Paper Copy. Please note that Pathways are off-street routes and Bikeways are on-street routes. The speed limit along pathways is 20 k.p.h., unless posted. Wear a helmet. Yield to the right of way. Stay on the right side of the pathway, unless passing. Use a bell, whistle or horn to protect walkers and joggers. Do not pass in sections with a double yellow line. You cannot cycle or in-line skate on a pathway with a leashed dog.

All pathways and trails are for non-motorized use, except for powered wheelchairs. A regional pathway is part of the city-wide network, paved with asphalt, and off-street. A local pathway has routes in communities, linking to neighbourhood parks, schools, and other community destinations. Trails are unpaved paths and may be granular or compacted dirt. If you know of a bylaw infraction and would like to report it, please call 311.

Girl Guides of Canada - 82nd Calgary **Pathfinders Visit Costa Rica**

The mangrove is a species of tree, common to tropical regions. They are plentiful along coastlines and home to many species of animals and birds. Out of the 54 species of mangrove in the world, only 7 occur in Costa Rica. These are found throughout the country, in estuaries of salt or brackish water. Their dense roots trap sediments in the water, helping protect the coastline from erosion caused by waves, storms, and hurricanes. Though they don't look like much, they are crucial to preserving the mangrove swamp ecosystem.



In March 2017, my Pathfinders unit and I went on a trip to Costa Rica. This 8-day adventure took us all around the country, and we got to see some amazing sights. We spent three days participating in a service project, planting mangroves on the Central Pacific Coast, and then traveled north to the Arenal region, where we got to explore national parks and see the rainforest by zipline. I learned so much while I was there, and had so much fun as well. I know that I will remember this trip for the rest of my life.



What better way to learn about the environment than to help protect it? Planting mangroves isn't hard to do, but something about it sticks with you. It teaches you about teamwork and about leadership. These are skills that I will need later on in life. Working alongside locals toward a common goal is an incredible experience. On this trip, I learned so many valuable lessons, about the Earth and about myself.



I have been in Girl Guides since I was six years old. I'm now fourteen and this is my ninth year of Guiding. I've made so many new friends through the program. It's been a wonderful way to learn about the world around me together with a group of amazing people. Going to Costa Rica this year has been an incredible adventure. It has inspired me to stay in Guiding in the future. Maybe someday, I'll be able to go on another adventure like this one.

Some Common Questions answered by Dr. Prabhdeep Chahal, BSc, DMD, Dip Pedo, FRCD(C)

When should I first bring my child to the dentist?

The American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry recommends that a child be seen by a dentist when their first tooth erupts or by the age of 1. At this visit, I like to assess medical and dental history, teach parents tricks that help with oral hygiene, inform them on what to expect regarding teeth coming in or falling out, and any dietary or lifestyle modifications that may help prevent decay and keep their little teeth strong and healthy.

What is a pediatric dentist?

A pediatric dentist is the primary and specialty oral care provider for infants, children, adolescents, and children with all kinds of special needs. A pediatric dentist has 2-3 years of additional specialty training following dental school.

They're just baby teeth- why do they need to be fixed if they will just fall out?

Primary (baby) teeth are much smaller than permanent (adult) teeth, and can decay much faster. It is necessary to fix this decay before it gets bigger and causes an infection. The primary teeth are needed for feeding speech development and to guide development of the facial structures. Generally speaking, children don't lose their front primary teeth until age 6, and don't start losing their primary molars until age 9!

Is it necessary for my child to wear a sportsguard while playing sports?

Sportsquards (or mouthquards) are particularly crucial pieces of equipment for any child participating in any sporting or recreational activity. Sportsguards not only protect the teeth, but can vastly reduce the degree of force transmitted from trauma and can help prevent concussions, tongue and cheek lesions, and jawbone fractures.

At what age should my child start using fluoridated toothpaste?

We recommend using fluoridated toothpaste as soon as your child has teeth! It all depends on how much toothpaste you are using. For age 0-3 use a "smear" of toothpaste. For ages 3-6 uses a "pea-sized" amount. Fluoride is a mineral that helps make teeth more resistant to decay. There is no longer any fluoride in the water in Calgary, so using fluoridated toothpaste is very important for your child's oral health!

I don't want to give fluoridated toothpaste to my child. Are there any alternatives?

Yes, there are! Ask your dentist to learn more about fluoride alternatives and how these products are used.

HOME GARDENING WITH BARBARA

Soil

Whether you have acres, a lot, or a balcony with pots, you should be interested in soil. If you grow your garden in pots, you will probably buy new potting mix from the nursery. It is a combination of many things such as compost, vermiculite, perlite, and peat moss, often containing no soil at all. Add some fertilizer and you are good to go.

Suppose, however, you are creating a brand-new flower or vegetable bed in your yard. If you live in a new house, the builder will have left you with little useful material after scraping off the original soil before construction. In most cases, only a little soil was returned before the sod went on. In some parts of Canada, they have lovely loam that goes down for several feet, but here in the chinook belt we have only a few inches to work with. Topsoil (loam) contains sand, clay, silt and humus in varying combinations. Sometimes it is perfectly good for garden use, but usually you need to supplement it with more nutritious stuff. Calgary soil can be challenging because it has a high percentage of clay. We have several companies who sell bulk or bagged product that can be mixed in with the soil you have, or used entirely in the new bed. Choose a good quality "garden mix" as it will have the proper blend of nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium and organic matter for your plants. The new bed should be at least 6 inches deep, as the plants' roots need space to grow. If you plant new trees or shrubs, dig holes much deeper than that because the roots need to be strong and well established before they tackle the clay beneath.

Older gardens still need regular help, and compost is our friend. You can make it yourself by using kitchen vegetable and fruit peels, lawn clippings, and tree leaves (no animal matter). Water and patience are the only other ingredients. If you don't have room or energy to make your own, you can buy it from the same companies who sell garden materials. It comes in little bags, big bags, and by the yard delivered by truck. Every year or two, new compost should be added on top of the old soil. There is no need to dig it in; snow and rain will send the nutrients down to the root systems naturally. If you



have a source of farm manure, this can be a powerful additive, but only if it has been well aged; too fresh and it will burn your plants. Other organic amendments such as Sea Soil are effective in modifying the soil structure and improving fertility. If a luscious lawn is your thing, aerating and top dressing with compost from time to time will be of benefit.

The last ingredient for a beautiful garden is water, and fickle Mother Nature will supply too much, too little, or just enough. When she gives us weeks of sunshine, we need to water, of course. Our rivers flow from the mountains; our water is alkaline. Add to this the chemicals the city adds to the water in its treatment to keep us safe, and what comes from our taps is not perfect for growing plants. The easiest thing to do is have water barrels collecting rain water from your downspouts. The next is to let tap water sit in containers for a few hours or a day, coming to ambient temperature, and evaporating off the chemicals before use. (I do this all year round for my indoor plants.) So, amend your soil, fertilize regularly, and water as necessary for a beautiful and colourful garden.

Crowchild Trail is an important skeletal roadway in Calgary's Transportation network, with over 100,000 vehicles per day crossing the Bow River. It not only plays an important role in the movement of goods and services throughout Calgary, but also is a primary roadway for commuters in Ward 2. That is why I was pleased to support a plan to significantly upgrade Crowchild Trail.

The short-term improvements to Crowchild Trail which were approved by City Council on April 24, 2017 focus on upgrading the Crowchild Trail bridge over the Bow River. The existing Crowchild Trail bridge requires a major lifecycle rehabilitation, therefore it makes economic sense to upgrade this bridge while it is being rehabilitated. Upgrades include building an additional lane in both directions. This will be accomplished by widening the bridge across the Bow River, widening the bridge across Memorial Drive and ramp reconfiguration. Once complete, Crowchild Trail will have 3 through lanes in each direction over the Bow River which will help reduce congestion on this major roadway. Longer-term plans for Crowchild Trail include building an interchange at 24th Avenue NW, 16th Avenue NW, 5th Avenue NW and Kensington Road NW. This will eliminate all traffic lights on Crowchild Trail and allow for free flow traffic between Stoney Trail and Glenmore Trail. 
