Yielding to Emergency Vehicles

Time is the enemy in any emergency. You can help EMS, police and fire get to the scene quickly and safely by following the rules of the road. It is important for motorists to understand how to safely yield right of way to emergency vehicles with lights and siren activated, so that everyone stays safe.

What to do when an emergency vehicle approaches with lights and siren activated

- If you're in the middle of an intersection when an emergency vehicle approaches with lights and siren activated, safely clear the intersection.
- On a one or two lane road, motorists should move to the right side of the road, slow down, and then stop. Remember to signal.
- On a road with three or more lanes, motorists should move to the nearest side of the road and stop. If driving in the centre lane, move to the right side of the road and stop. Remember to signal.
- Come to a complete stop and wait for the emergency vehicle to pass. Shoulder check for more emergency vehicles (there is often more than one) before re-entering traffic flow. Remember to signal.
- Remember, emergency vehicles may need to use any available road space to maneuver. This may include the use of shoulders and left hand turning lanes to pass other traffic.

While driving on the road

- Drive attentively and defensively at all times. Be cognizant to sirens of emergency vehicles and be prepared to yield the right of way.
- It is the law for motorists to slow down to at least 60 km/hour (unless a lower speed is posted) when driving past an emergency vehicle which is stopped.
- Do not break the rules of the road in order to give right of way to an emergency vehicle. This could include proceeding through a red light or making an illegal turn. Actions such as these jeopardize all motorists in the area.
- Driver attention must be directed towards the roadway and safe operation of the vehicle in which they are driving, at all times.
- Always leave plenty of space between your vehicle and an emergency vehicle should it need to stop suddenly.

Community Update On New Schools

The Calgary Board of Education is pleased to welcome more than 3,000 additional students this year. With rapid growth comes the challenge of finding schools for all these students. Funding for new school construction hasn't kept pace with growth, particularly in new communities. As a result, we bus about a third of our students to schools where there is space.

To meet this pressing need, the CBE is planning the construction of 12 new schools, three major modernizations and two replacement schools, all to open in 2016.

New K- Grade 4 schools for Panorama Hills, Tuscany, Auburn Bay, New Brighton, Copperfield, and Evanston.

New Grades 5 – 9 schools for New Brighton–Copperfield, Evergreen, Mackenzie Towne, Saddle Ridge, Rocky Ridge–Royal Oak.

Modernization of Bowness High School and Jack James High School, and turning the former Harold W. Riley school into an Aboriginal learning centre.

Replacement of Christine Meikle and Elbow Park schools.

The Province is also building a new northeast high school to open in 2016.

In addition, the Province announced Sept. 22 that it would partner with the CBE to build four starter schools. They will be built in phases to get students into classes before the entire school is complete. It also announced funding for modular classrooms for Westgate School and for the planning of a new south Calgary high school.

Funding for new schools, modernizations and modulars comes from the province and the CBE is very grateful to the government for this investment in education.



International Child's Day Will you be celebrating with your child?

Initially proclaimed in 1925 by the World Conference for the Well-being of Children, a universal day to honour the children of the world has gone through several incarnations over the decades before becoming internationally recognized in 1954. Observed on November 20, International Child's Day marks the day on which the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Declaration of the Rights of the Child, in 1959, and the Convention on the Rights of the Child, in 1989.

In Canada, National Child's Day was written in parliamentary law in 1993, to help promote awareness about the 1989 convention which spells out the basic human rights to which children under the age of 18 are entitled.

This November 20, the Calgary Public Library (CPL) is celebrating children and encouraging play and literacy by holding a Colossal Play Date at CPL locations throughout the city. Children aged three and older are encouraged to bring an adult and drop in to various library locations from 10:30 a.m. to noon.

If you and your child (or grandchildren) aren't able to participate in the CPL events, take the opportunity to celebrate your child and to help them embrace the love of learning by reading to your youngster every day, but especially on November 20. Reading aloud to children is the single most important thing parents and caregivers can do to help children develop language and early-literacy skills -and to build a life-long love of reading!



the Friends of Nose Hill

speaker (and answer questions from the public) at a free meeting of the Friends of Nose Hill, on Wednesday, November 12, at Triwood Community Centre, 7 p.m.

Coyotes were once called song dogs in First Nations myth. The urban coyote now lives in nature surrounded by urban development. Citizens report seeing coyotes and a few have negative interactions with them. But does that mean you need to be afraid of coyotes? She will explore how coyotes live in the city, what challenges they face, and how we can co-exist without fear.

Alexander led a guided walk around Nose Hill, which supports a small group of coyotes in an urban green space. She describes what type of habitat (in parks like Nose Hill) is important to coyotes and answers whether coyotes were living in these places before the city was built. Or, are coyotes "invading" cities, like you hear in the media?

Next to spring denning, another critical conflict time is fall for the "dispersal season", when coyotes reaching maturity leave the pack to fend for themselves. This is a period of stress

for coyotes, and when hungry, they will sometimes roam residential areas looking for food.

This summer there were concerns over wild animal trapping in the city, as well as how we manage the encroachment of bears and cougars. Or are we in their space? Urban wildlife is a reality, and experts from the Calgary Zoo as well as Alberta Fish and Wildlife will bring forward an Urban Wildlife Strategy.

The city can be a better custodian of good animal welfare practice. Animal and Bylaw Services already plans to meet with other agencies. Be pro-active to avoid conflict with animals like beavers, by planting trees along the river, placing wire around tree trunks, and providing under-dam drains to control water levels.

A cougar found prowling at the South Calgary Health Campus delayed many police officers who waited for the Alberta Fish and Wildlife officials to arrive. Of course we need to respect the potential for harm to the public. The Minister of Justice & Solicitor General announced a review of the Provincial Government's response in this situation.

One Tiny Suitcase

ne Tiny Suitcase, a local Baby Equipment Rental company is lightening the load for families travelling to Calgary.

Former Health & Safety professional and mother of twins, Stacey Corbett, started One Tiny Suitcase in 2006 after being frustrated with taking her twins on a vacation and having to do without many essential pieces of baby equipment. Trying to put her 18 month old twins to sleep on a regular bed in their vacation rental created a 'nightmare' for everyone.

It was after this first big trip that a friend asked, "Why didn't you just rent what you needed at your destination?" Turns out baby equipment rental companies have popped up all over the U.S. and Canada. Each major city now has one of these businesses (www.baby-equipment-rental.com).

Since opening day in 2006, One Tiny Suitcase has helped families have just what their tiny guests need when they arrive.

Car seats are the most popular travel rental items. Many grandparents have never used a car seat and are intimidated trying to figure out how to use one safely. With the Health Canada regulations for car seat expiry dates, recalls, etc. it is not as easy to borrow a seat from a friend and be confident that the seat meets current safety standards. Owner Stacey Corbett says, "Safety is a parent's top concern."

The entire inventory is safety checked and sanitized prior to every rental. Items include the original manufacturer's instruction booklet as well.

Open daily from 9 am-9 pm orders can be placed by email or phone. Items can be picked up locally and a delivery service is offered as well. You may have seen the One Tiny Suitcase van driving around the community. It's hard to miss with two huge baby photos on either side of the Dodge Caravan! A visit to the company's website (www. OneTinySuitcase.ca) shows photos, prices and availability.

After about two years in business, One Tiny Suitcase expanded to include a location in Edmonton. They offer

one-way rentals between Calgary and Edmonton too. It makes traveling to Alberta with a baby seamless!

Rentals start at as little as \$5/day. The average car seat rental is \$55/week or \$10/day. Parents appreciate not having to haul their child's own heavy car seat through the airport and risk damage or lost luggage when they arrive at their destination.

Grandparents who have down sized appreciate that they can get a full size crib delivered and set up in their home and don't have to store it all year round for a one time visit. One Tiny Suitcase takes all the stress out of having tiny guests in your home.

One Tiny Suitcase also provides one-time event rentals like high chairs and booster seats. These items can be used for weddings, parties and corporate events. The company provides discounted rates for non-profit and charity events.

With Calgary's growing population, the company has expanded their service to include rentals for new and expectant mothers too. As an authorized Medela breast pump rental station, pumps are delivered free of charge to new moms in their homes. How convenient is that when you have a newborn?






