Student safety

Summer vacation is over, students are back in school and traffic has again become much busier. The safety for our students is a primary concern of the Calgary Board of Education.

Safety on the roads is a shared responsibility. National School Safety week will be held on October 17 to 23. Below are some reminders to help us all travel safely.

Drivers

- The City of Calgary is moving to change all school zones to playground zones by the end of 2015.
- Playground zones are in effect 7:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. every day, all year round.
- Maximum speed in a playground zone is 30 km/h.
- Passing in a playground is not permitted during the hours the zone is in effect.
- Do not park within five metres of a marked crosswalk or intersection. This ensures children are visible to other road users.
- Do not double-park when dropping off or picking up students.
- Traffic congestion near schools is problematic. When dropping off students consider parking your vehicle a few blocks away from school.
- Stop for all pedestrians crossing in a marked or unmarked crosswalk. Do not proceed until the pedestrian clears the entire intersection.
- Do not park in school bus zones.
- Be prepared to slow down or stop when approaching a parked school bus.

Pedestrians

- Look both ways before crossing the street.
- When crossing at an intersection, make eye contact with the driver and proceed when safe to do so.
- Cross the street only at corners/intersections not mid-block (jay-walking).
- Walk, do not run, when crossing the street.
- Understand and follow traffic signals, signs and directions from crossing patrols.

Prevention is the key to safety. With education and awareness, we can ensure that all students get safely to school and home again.

Bring your leaves and pumpkins to a depot near you until November 8


Fall is in the air – and on the ground. As Calgarians tidy up their yards they can bring their bagged leaves and pumpkins to one of our 36 drop-off locations around the city. By composting this material it keeps it out of the landfill, reduces harmful greenhouse gas emissions and helps turn the leaves and pumpkins into useful compost. We recommend using paper yard waste bags as they can be composted with the rest of the material. No sod or rocks please.

Wow! I can hardly believe that summer is all but over! Long days outside enjoying the sunshine and enjoying your garden are now being replaced by wearing sweaters on your evening walk and preparing your garden for winter.

We all know what it takes to winterize the garden – cut down the perennials, water in bushes and trees, maybe wrap our more sensitive plants with burlap for protection against the long, cold winter. But what about winterizing our homes?

Winter is a harsh season to live through, especially if your mobility is not as agile as it once was, or if you are noticing your sight is not as sharp as it once was. The autumn is the perfect time to prepare your home, and yourself, for the winter season – and here are a few tips to help you do just that!

The main focus of all preparations is fall prevention. A fall can result in even the most healthy and fit person spending time in the hospital and then needing to move into assisted living. As we age, it is increasingly difficult to make a full recovery from a fall.

Clear off your decks and walkways so that you have a path clear of all obstructions between your car and home. Be sure that this pathway is relatively flat and void of tripping hazards. If the sidewalk blocks have moved and one edge is sticking up, call a professional to repair it so you are not at risk of tripping on it. Make sure your stairs and walkways inside are also free of objects blocking your way.

Ensure your pathways, inside and out, are adequately lit. Aging eyes require 50% more light to see the same as they did when you were young!! You do not necessarily need to install new fixtures, maybe just clean the glass cover and install a higher wattage bulb. As fall begins to show its wonderful colours, Mackay-Nose Hill is looking lovelier than ever. This has made getting out into the Constituency that much more enjoyable - it's wonderful to connect with people when we can still enjoy the weather.

The past month has been busy; your Government Caucus has been meeting regularly through the summer and September. Much care is going into the preparation of the fall budget, and I would like you to know that the decisions made are not being taken lightly or hastily, but with thought to both Alberta's current situation and the future.

In addition to the Caucus meetings, I was pleased to meet with a number of constituents, stakeholder groups and various agencies. While at my Legislature Office, I was able to connect with the Public School Boards Association and Public Interest Alberta, and back in Calgary I was privileged to meet with the wonderful people at VIVO (formerly Cardel Place, if you haven't already - please check it out), tour the new and quickly-progressing National Music Centre, and meet with the dedicated and inspiring folks at Homefront. Their mandate is to create a safe community by eliminating domestic violence through direct client services, justice co-ordination and facilitate community action. I also enjoyed attending Sandstone-MacEwan's 'Sandstock' event and dropping by Movie Night in Evanston and I was happy to bring greetings from the Province at GlobalFest in August.

Your government has also been busy. The Royalty Review is now underway; the advisory panel will begin its work connecting with Albertans as it reviews the province's non-renewable resource royalty framework. The panel is to be finished their work by the end of year, with public engagement running through November. These are YOUR resources; please make your voice heard at letstalkroyalties.ca. As you are also likely aware, the province's updated first quarter financial report was released at the end of August. This forecast

reflects higher-than-anticipated costs for fighting wildfires and drought, as well as the reversal of the previous government's planned health levy and cuts to healthcare and education. This illustrates the difficult choices we have to make build the economy, create job opportunities and protect health care and education. For example, as students headed back to class, many schools saw the direct benefits of the \$103 million dedicated by the government to support enrolment growth. Your government recognizes the importance of protecting health care and education, especially in challenging times.


