Neighbour Day is an opportunity for neighbours to come together in the form of BBQs, cleanups and potlucks to celebrate our strong community spirit in Calgary. Make Saturday, June 18 the day you host a block party, a picnic at your local park or even introduce yourself to a neighbour and lend a helping hand. The City of Calgary wants to encourage as many people as possible to host a local activity on their block or in their residential building. That is why they are waiving the fees for small scale local block party permits and neighbourhood park bookings for events that take place on June 18 this year. Please note the deadline for road closure permit applications is May 27. Visit calgary.ca/ neighbourday for more information about Neighbour Day including an event planning kit, information about permits and other logistical considerations.

This spring, Calgary Police Service along with Alberta Commercial Vehicle Enforcement will be paying extra attention to safety infractions by heavy and light trucks. They will focus on moving violations, cargo securement, mechanical fitness and other related infractions to ensure all vehicles are roadworthy and safe. There will be check stops and enforcement blitzes throughout the spring.

With the population growth and the new development throughout northwest Calgary, certain major roadways are becoming increasingly congested. Two major projects that I have been advocating for is to twin the Shaganappi Trail overpass over Stoney Trail and to build a full interchange on 14th Street NW and Stoney Trail. Both of these interchange improvements are critical to the transportation network in northwest Calgary. I have met numerous times with officials from the provincial and federal government to advocate for these projects and I will continue to advocate for them at City Hall. As we all welcome spring, your Government continues its Spring sitting as we debate the Budget which was introduced on April 14th, 2016. Our caucus is working very hard to do the best we can for all Albertans; we recognize the challenging economic times we continue to face both personally and financially. My office hears from a number of constituents who are definitely struggling, and I want to assure the residents of Calgary-Mackay-Nose Hill that these issues remain of paramount importance to me.

At the beginning of April, I am proud to say that the Minister of Human Services Irfan Sabir repealed the Person with Developmental Disabilities (PDD) Safety Standards Regulation in response to the input from Albertans. During the public consultation on the standards of safety for Albertans receiving supports through the PDD program, participants said Regulation was confusing and caused

undue stress in the community. The Minister accepted the consultation team's Phase One recommendations in their entirety, to implement a coordinated approach across relevant ministries which includes working with municipalities to ensure safety and to extend the Team's mandate to oversee Phase Two of the consultation. This issue is of vital importance to many of my constituents, and it is crucial that it be addressed.

The Government has established a new structure to improve the province's environmental monitoring and reporting system and this new model will replace the Alberta Environmental Monitoring, Evaluation and Reporting Agency (AEMERA). An independent review concluded that AEMERA is not the right delivery model to ensure effective and accountable oversight of environmental monitoring on behalf of Albertans and found that the private model diverted overhead costs away from monitoring, led to confusion around roles and responsibilities, and limited resources. This government continues to be committed to building standards based on international best practices and a renewed partnership with Indigenous communities; as a part of those commitments, the new structure will improve the province's environmental monitoring and reporting system and will retain an independent science advisory panel and a traditional ecological knowledge advisory panel. The government is also committed to doing the best job possible of monitoring the environmental impacts of industry and resource development as we build a more resilient, diversified economy.

On April 6th the Government introduced proposed legislation to help seniors stay safe and independent in their homes. The proposed 'Seniors' Homes Adaptation and Repair Act' (Bill 5) enables a new low-interest home equity loan program that helps seniors improve the safety and sustainability of their homes. The program allows senior homeowners who qualify to finance essential home repairs and adaptations, such as widening doorways or hallways, installing walk-in tubs, roof replacements, and electrical repairs. About 145,000 senior households could be eligible for the loan program; under the provisions of the Bill, seniors would not be required to pay monthly loan payments as they would with traditional loan programs. Low-income seniors who do not qualify under the loan program may still be eligible for a grant to help finance necessary home repairs. Consumer protection measures will also be offered, including provisions to review the reasonableness of the costs of the home repair as well as the right to cancel contracts. Keeping seniors in their homes for as long as possible is so important, and this program would address the needs and priorities of an aging population.


