On September 25, an additional southbound lane was added onto the Shaganappi Trail Bridge over Stoney Trail. The purpose of the additional lane is to help with traffic congestion during the morning rush hour. So far, I have heard and observed that this enhancement has made a significant improvement in reducing traffic congestion. The City of Calgary has also adjusted the traffic light timing to allow for improved traffic flow on Shaganappi Trail south of the Stoney Trail interchange.

City of Calgary Crews are keeping an eye on the forecast all winter long, preparing roads with anti-icing solution before the snow falls, and maintaining City streets as soon as snowflakes hit the ground. Stay informed during every snowfall by following @yyctransport on Twitter and downloading the Road Conditions App for frequent updates. You can also see where crews are plowing on the live map at Calgary.ca/RoadConditions.

After each snowfall, Roads crews follow a priority clearing system called the Seven Day Plan:

- Priority 1 routes, which carry more than 20,000 vehicles per day, are cleared to bare pavement within 24 hours after the snow stops falling.
- Priority 2 routes, which carry between 5,000 and 19,000 vehicles per day, are cleared within 48 hours after snowfall has stopped.
- Playground zones, designated hills, and residential streets on Residential roadways are cleared on Days 3-7. These roads are flat-bladed, which means snow is packed down so it is easier to drive on, and ruts are removed.

Happy November! As you are reading this our government is back in session and working on legislation that supports all Albertans through challenging times.

On October 1st, Alberta's general minimum wage increased from \$11.20 to \$12.20 per hour as part of our government's effort to achieve a \$15 per hour minimum wage by 2018. In addition to the 2016 increase, the general minimum wage will rise by \$1.40 to \$13.60 per hour on Oct. 1st, 2017, and a further \$1.40 to \$15 per hour on Oct. 1st, 2018. Currently, an estimated 300,000 Albertans earn less than\$15 per hour, a majority of those being women, often the head of the household. It is imperative that Albertans who are working full time earn enough to live.

I was fortunate to attend a number of events in October and brought greetings on behalf of Seniors Minister Hon. Lori Sigurdson to the Atrium of City Hall for the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the United Nations International Day of Older Persons celebration. The event was hosted in partnership with the Calgary Chinese Elderly Citizens' Association (CCECA), Immigrant Services Calgary (ISC) and the City of Calgary and the year's theme was "Take A Stand Against Ageism". We are all indebted to the contributions that our seniors have made, past and present, and it was a real honour to thank them.

It was great to meet so many of you on Friday afternoons for our Coffee and Chats throughout the riding. Thank you again for bringing me your thoughts and ideas! October was a very busy month in MacKay Nose Hill, including the celebration of the opening the new International Terminal at the Calgary Airport, which is over two-million square feet (186,000 m2) in size! My staff and I also attended a number of Community Association meetings and I'm always impressed by the hard working community volunteers and acknowledge them for their dedication to community life.
