

My kids visited the skate park multiple times during the summer and had a blast! I don't live in Hidden Valley, but my community didn't have anything happening and I noticed your signs. I really appreciated having a free activity that multiple ages could participate in. In fact, I even saw one senior citizen, Dale, out on a scooter a few times! He must have been in charge of the program because he was so good at engaging the kids and he always made sure there was cold water available on the hot days. -Svetlana

We're glad you enjoyed the mobile skate park! Yes, Dale volunteered to oversee the event and was frequently present to make sure people were well taken care of. Dale is a good neighbour and can often be seen picking up litter and socializing at the parks. Perhaps the secret to longevity is being young at heart and eagerly engaged. -HVCA

I like that extra lanes were created to help Hanson Ranch and Hidden Valley residents get onto Beddington Trail, but I'm not sure I like the layout. I think the dual turn lane out of Hanson Ranch is going to create backups for people going straight through to Hidden Valley (especially at school times). Also, it may be a hazard for people turning right onto Beddington Trail from Hidden Valley. Better signage is definitely needed as I've already seen people misuse the middle turn lane. -Llean

We've passed your concerns onto our Civic Affairs Director, Dwight, and encourage anyone else who has concerns with the intersection at Hidden Valley Link/Beddington Trail/Hidden Creek Drive to email him at civicaffairs@hiddenhut.org and to also submit a service request through the City's 311 service (they track numbers). -HVCA

As much as I don't like thinking about it, winter is coming. I'm assuming that the City is in charge of flooding the ice rink. When do you think they will start? - Harvey

Actually, the rink is the responsibility of the HVCA. Or, perhaps, I should say the responsibility of the people who would enjoy having a nice ice surface to skate on! There is a lot of maintenance involved in creating and maintaining an ice surface (especially if we want a good quality surface). If you would like to be involved please email rink@hiddenhut.org with your contact information; a "rink rat" orientation should be getting underway shortly. Flooding start times will be weather dependant, but hopefully we can start in November. -HVCA



Hidden Valley Playground Update



Nitanisak Girl Guides



In September, all of our units started their first meetings of the year. Many units are doing 'getting to know you' activities so that the girls and leaders become familiar with each other, and start learning how to work well together.

Brownies get to choose their circles ('Fairies', 'Elves', 'Leprechauns') – small groups they can break off into to do their attendance and dues. Dues are also known as 'Fairy Gold' – girls can earn \$1 per week at home by doing a good deed, by lending a hand either at home or at school or out in their community. It is a great way for young girls to learn how to care for others.

Guides also choose smaller groups called 'Patrols' ('Bluebirds', 'Violets', etc.). Some of our Guide units will also be taking advantage of the warm autumn weather to go camping. Many camps have been booked for months already – September and October are busy times at area Girl Guide camps.

On that note, if your family enjoys camping, Girl Guide camps are available to rent to outside groups. Girl Guides of Canada owns campsites in Cochrane and out into the foothills west of Calgary (near Sundre/Cremona). Some are residential camps which means you can sleep indoors out of the elements (great for winter!), and some are backcountry camps. One our camps (Westover) has canoes you can rent, and Westover Lake is very scenic. You can call 403-283-8348 or email facilitybooking@calgarygirlguides.com to book a Girl Guide camp. Fall and spring are busy times for booking camps, but July and August, and any school breaks throughout the year are usually quite open for booking.

One last major event for all of our units in September and October would be selling our famous Girl Guide cookies. You may have already seen girls selling cookies at Edgemont Superstore, or Sage Hill Walmart, or pretty much anywhere in Calgary starting mid-September.







1. Fill your green cart with leaves and other yard waste like old annuals, vegetable plants, pine cones, etc.



2. If your green cart is full, use paper yard waste bags. Be sure the bags are rolled up and can be easily lifted.



3. Set extra yard waste bags at least 30 cm (1 ft.) to the side of your cart.



Pumpkin Spice Muffins

Ingredients

Spread:

- 4 oz. (1/2 standard brick) cream cheese, softened
- 3 tbsp. unsalted butter, softened
- 1 tbsp. brown sugar
- 1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon

Muffins:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 tbsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. ground nutmeg
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1 can canned pureed pumpkin (NOT pumpkin pie filling)
- 1/2 cup butter, melted
- 2 eggs

Topping:

- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup butter, melted

Directions

1. Heat oven to 400°F. Place paper baking cups into 12 muffin pan cups or grease muffin pan cups; set aside.
2. Combine all spread ingredients in bowl; beat at medium speed until creamy. Cover; refrigerate until serving time.
3. Combine flour, 3/4 cup sugar, baking powder, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, nutmeg and salt in bowl; set aside.
4. Combine pumpkin, 1/2 cup melted butter and eggs in another bowl; stir until well mixed. Stir pumpkin mixture into flour mixture just until combined.
5. Spoon batter evenly into prepared muffin pan cups; spread batter to level. (Muffin cups will be full.) Bake 22-23 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Remove from pan to cooling rack.
6. Combine 1/4 cup sugar and 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon in bowl. Dip tops of warm muffins in melted butter and then sugar-cinnamon mixture. Serve warm with cream cheese spread.

WHAT TO DO

When a Lost Dog is Sighted

The most important rule to understand when the lost dog you are looking for is sighted, is not to chase. By chasing the dog – even a dog you know – you scare it away from familiar ground. A lost dog is in flight mode – if they don't respond and come to your voice, chasing the dog will only make matters worse. These steps are designed to inform you how to catch the dog without chasing. If the dog runs, however, re-assess whether these general guidelines fit your situation. Before you start out on a sighting call, make sure your phone is on vibrate or silent.

1.) Assume a nonthreatening position

- You should be seated with your back to the dog, keep the dog in sight using peripheral vision and soft glances over your shoulder.
- Never look the dog straight on.
- You should never make eye contact with the dog.
- Move as little as possible, all movements should be slight
- All searchers who are within eye sight of the dog or who can see the dog, should assume a nonthreatening position and stop all movement!

2.) Get another dog into the area

- Ideally the search dog should be a dog that the lost dog knows
- A search dog should: be confident, calm, relaxed with the handler
- A search dog should not: be dog aggressive or have resource guarding issues, or reactive

3.) Get treats

- Start by feeding the treats to the dog you have with you to give the lost dog an example. It also shows that other dogs do not find you threatening.
- You want to toss high value treats to the dog, gently, so you don't spook the dog.
- If the dog spooks, remain where you are and give them a chance to come back and investigate
- High value treats are generally soft and have a meaty smell. Ideal high value treats include: Zuke's, hot dog, lunch meat, etc.

4.) Approaching the dog

- This should only be attempted by one person at a time
- Do not start to approach until the dog is in a sitting position. If the dog is standing, it will just run off when you start moving
- All movements should be slow, stay as low to the ground as possible, you should remain facing away from the dog
- It is best if you can move while the dog is eating the high value treats, you will likely have to alternate forward movement with giving the dog treats
- The key is to move slowly and to not rush the process, it can take over 45 minutes to get into a position to catch the dog
- If the dog runs off but has eaten at this spot, make note, this is now a great spot to set up a feeding station.

5.) Catching the dog

- You should not attempt to catch the dog until you are within arm's reach from your sitting position. If you can get the dog to come to you, when you get close, using high value treats, this is ideal.
- If the dog is still wearing their collar, try and grab the chain or connector piece of the martingale, this tightens the collar. If you grab the regular part of the collar, the collar will not tighten and you risk popping the collar off of the dog!
- If the dog spooks and backs away, give the dog a chance to relax and begin approaching again.

Tips and Tricks for Catching a Lost Dog

- Try and avoid cornering the dog if possible, the dog is in flight or fight mode, so avoid taking away its' option of flight
- Avoid trying to surround the dog, this will make the dog edgy, and will be harder to get it calmed down enough to catch
- Don't rush, this process can take over 45 minutes.
- A regular leash makes a good slip lead, don't try and do collar adjustments after catching the dog. Use a slip lead to get the dog in a car or building then make adjustments

If we know where the dog is why don't we just trap it?

Sometimes we do, but if we can grab the dog, that's the ideal solution. Trapping is stressful and in a standard trap, if the dog isn't in the right spot, the dog can be badly injured when the trap shuts. In extreme weather conditions, traps MUST be checked every 3-4 hours. You are also likely to catch a variety of wildlife. Be careful when releasing wildlife (raccoons, skunks, foxes are considered part of the rabies vector and must be released near where they are trapped. Squirrels and opossums are not rabies carriers, but they still bite hard).

Cleaning up the yard is easier with your green cart

This fall, enjoy the convenience of using your green cart as you get your yard and garden ready for winter. Leaves, pine cones, branches (up to 6 inches in diameter and 4 feet in length), old annuals and pumpkins can all go in the green cart for weekly collection and will be turned into nutrient rich compost.

Three-step checklist for fall yard waste:

- 1. Fill your green cart first.** Yard waste can go directly inside the cart; there's no need to bag it first.
- 2. If your cart is full, simply use paper yard waste bags and roll down the top.** Home and garden or grocery stores sell paper yard waste bags. They're usually sold in packs of five. Please **don't use plastic garbage bags**. These bags will not be collected since they contaminate the compost.
- 3. Place the bags approx. one foot away from the cart for collection,** so you can walk between the cart and the bag. Bags should be easily lifted (max. 20 kg).

During busy fall periods, to ensure our crews stay on schedule we may not be able to collect all of your extra yard waste bags right away. Please leave them out and we'll pick them up as soon as possible.

Other options for disposing of yard waste are available at calgary.ca/yardwaste.

What to do about unwelcome junk mail

While most of us do our best to be good neighbours, sometimes we need a little guidance to do the right thing. That's where the Community Standards Bylaw comes in. Updated at the end of 2016, the bylaw promotes good neighbour relationships and addresses community concerns by regulating noise, fire pit use, untidy properties, weeds and grass, graffiti—and nuisances such as flyers.

One of the areas updated in the 2016 review refers to flyers, including non-commercial flyers. If you have a 'no flyer' sign visibly posted at your home, it's a violation of the bylaw to deliver flyers to your door. With the municipal election just around the corner, you should be aware that election advertising is exempt from this bylaw along with newspaper subscriptions, community newsletters and information provided by government and elected officials.

For more information, visit Calgary.ca and enter Community Standards Bylaw in the search bar. If you do continue to receive flyers despite having a 'no flyer' sign at your home, you can call 311 or submit a service request using our 311 app or on The City's web site.

In early August, I took a small trip to NW Alberta to visit with stakeholders as part of my role as Shadow Minister of Economic Development and Trade.

After an overnight stop in Hinton to meet pulp mill workers, I was off to Jasper for breakfast with the local Chamber of Commerce. There are jobs available in Jasper right now, if you don't mind sharing accommodations or paying \$2,200 a month for a two-bedroom apartment. Jasper is concerned about land release and infrastructure renewal. Money is flowing out of the community as hotel tax and park gate fees but not coming back to replace ageing water and sewer pipes.

I travelled up Highway 40 to Grande Cache. This road has no shoulders, needs to be rebuilt, and handles many tractor trailers. The local power plant and metallurgical coal mine are closed. The local sawmill can't get permission to harvest enough wood. There's only one fibre optic line and it's been known to get cut, stopping medical diagnosis and bank cards from working. The town hopes the provincial medium security penitentiary will have its lease to the federal government renewed in three years.

In Grande Prairie, I toured Canfor's lumber mill and met with the Mayor, Member of Parliament, Chamber of Commerce, Seven Generations Energy, and others. Because of the lack of pipelines to export west, Grande Prairie is eyeing the petrochemical industry to turn their rich natural gas liquids into value added products. Crown land release is essential for these strategic opportunities.

I also visited the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum in Wembley. If you are ever in the Peace Region, please visit this facility. 30% of the Royal Tyrrell collection comes from this area.

My last stop was the Millar Western Pulp Mill in Whitecourt. Forestry and conventional oil and gas industries are very concerned with the government's Caribou Management Plan.

This is a small sample of the economic conditions in Alberta right now.
