COMMUNITY PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

About the Planning Committee

The Hillhurst Sunnyside Planning Committee ("HSPC") fulfils an important function in the City of Calgary's planning and development process. It provides a local perspective and feedback to the City, developers and to the decision-makers at Calgary City Council on important projects in the community. Redevelopment in the community is guided by policy contained in the Hillhurst Sunnyside Area Redevelopment Plan or "ARP" which is available via search on www.calgary.ca.

Would you like to get involved and/or learn more about what's happening in our community? All community residents, whether you rent or own your home, are welcome to join or sit in as guests. Planning committee meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month. Our next meeting will be on September 13th from 7-9pm at the HSCA. Meeting agendas and past minutes are posted online at http://bit.ly/hspcmeetings.

Development application plans are available for public viewing at our front office from 8:30am to 4pm. Inquiries can be directed c/o Lisa Chong, Community Planning Coordinator by email at lisa.c@hsca.ca or by phone at 403-283-0554 x229.

Planning/Development News

We provided a huge update on all the new developments in our July 2016 newsletter. Ongoing projects include the Kensington Public Realm Improvements, the Fifth Avenue Bikeways project, the Crowchild Trail Study and more. Stay tuned to HSCA news for more information as it becomes available on the other building projects in our community!

Planning Process

Our article last month provided a brief overview of the land use process. Development Permits are required for most construction projects. This includes new buildings, additions to existing buildings, large signage, change of land use and more.

Development plans for most of the above are circulated to community associations for comments. Affected neighbours can also comment on proposed developments near them. The City posts signs (blue for DPs) on the site for a period of one week so neighbours know who to contact for more information or to send comments, including support, any concerns or suggestions on how the developer can make improvements to their proposals.

Individual applications are reviewed against relevant policies (Land Use Bylaw, ARP, etc) and with good planning principles. Applications are reviewed by City Administration, who then provide their recommendation to the Development Authority to approve or refuse applications for smaller proposals. Larger proposals (such as the mixed-use condo buildings in our community) or policy changes go through Calgary Planning Commission who then provide their recommendation to City Council for final decision. Residents can again get involved in the public hearing component at City Council.

Community association planning committees are run by dedicated volunteers and residents like you! HSPC does not have the authority to approve or reject developments and can only allocate resources where we can make a difference. Hillhurst Sunnyside has seen changes both big and small on from the larger mixeduse buildings on the main streets to the redevelopment of single- and multi-family homes.

Any questions, concerns or complaints regarding construction or anything City-related must be directed to the City of Calgary by calling 311. Calls are directed to the appropriate party or City department (e.g., inspections, parks, planning & development, etc.) for action. The nature of these calls are documented to establish persistent trends and forwarded to the ward councillor's office. You may have also seen the orange posters posted on construction sites with the contact information for the builder. Remember that you can always reach out to your new neighbour(s).

Planning and development can be confusing. As this is only a general overview, more information can be found on the Federation of Calgary Communities' Community Guide to the Planning Process, which can be accessed online (search their website below). The Federation also

offers free Partners in Planning courses on Saturday mornings throughout the school year. Any potential planning committee volunteers or interested residents are strongly encouraged to take these courses. Check out their website at www.calgarycommunities. com for more details including the 2016-2017 schedule when it becomes available.

Mandatory bylaw for **building maintenance** approved by City Council

What goes up shouldn't come down.

In the last few years, there have been several incidents of materials and debris falling off tall buildings, particularly in the downtown core. City of Calgary investigations into these events revealed that there's more to be done to prevent potentially hazardous situations and protect public safety. That's why the Building Maintenance Bylaw was developed.

It will require buildings that are five storeys or higher and 10 years and older to complete visual exterior assessments every five years.

The bylaw comes into force on Jan. 1, 2017. To learn more, visit calgary.ca/buildingmaintenancebylaw.

Back to School safety

Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and children about a few road safety tips, as streets become more congested, with the return of the school year. Pedestrians and motorists both have an important role to play – road safety is a shared responsibility.

Motorists

- · Avoid talking on a cell phone, texting, or any other behaviour that diverts your attention away from driving;
- · Give right-of-way to pedestrians who have activated overhead crossing lights, or who are waiting to cross from a street corner;
- Remember, it is illegal to pass vehicles other than those that are parked - in school, or playground zones, during posted hours.

Around school buses

- Flashing amber lights mean a bus is slowing down to stop – motorists should do likewise;
- No matter which direction you are coming from, STOP, when approaching a school bus with activated flashing red lights – unless the bus is on the opposite side of a divided highway from you;
- Driver courtesy goes a long way. By simply being alert and cautious when approaching a school bus, you are contributing to school bus safety.

Pedestrians

- Cross only at marked crosswalks, or street corners that have clear visibility from all directions;
- When activating overhead crossing lights, pause and make eye contact with all drivers before stepping off the curb. This is to ensure that motorists in both directions have seen you and come to a complete stop;
- · Stay within the crosswalk lines until fully clear of the
- Obey pedestrian lights at intersections. Cross the street only when you see the "walk" sign and only when all vehicles have come to a complete stop;
- If you are with young children, or pets, hold your child's hand firmly and keep a solid grip on leashes when
- · Remember: children learn by observing. By demonstrating safe crossing habits, you can reduce the chances of your child being involved in a preventable auto/ pedestrian collision.





Past, Present and Future


The City Parks Department was first among Water for Riley's valued partners, helping every way it can. Parks officials acknowledge that Riley Park needs drinking water. The City of Calgary calls this an unfunded priority, meaning a drinking fountain's need is recognized as a priority and there are no funds for it.

The Present

A nozzle and bowl should protrude from the wall during the few months the wading pool is open. It's accessible only from the wading pool area. No dogs are allowed near it, it isn't close to the children's playground, and its location isn't accessible to the disabled. As the pool season started this year even this drinking bowl wasn't available.

The Past

According to officials in the City Parks Department, many years ago there was a concrete block drinking fountain southeast of the playground, like the one pictured below. The City removed that old fountain and, according to best memory, permanently sealed the water line to it.

With rising household costs, a growing number of families are struggling to afford shelter and other basic needs such as food, medication, and childcare. Household incomes in Calgary have not kept up to housing prices. Over the past decade, prices have increased 156% while incomes have increased 34%.

Over 4000 households are currently on the qualified waiting list for Calgary Housing Company, but the actual need is far greater. In Calgary, over 38,000 renter households need affordable housing. These Calgarians require some extra assistance to ensure they have access to safe and affordable places to call home. Those in need include students, seniors, young couples, people with disabilities, people who are unemployed, low-income workers and their families, and new Canadians.

What do we mean by affordable housing? For housing to be affordable, The Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation states a household should not spend more than 30 percent of its gross income on rent. That target is especially difficult for lower income Calgarians to meet and they must often spend larger percentages of their incomes on basic shelter.

Although increasing the affordable housing supply is one of City Council's priorities, the City of Calgary has not added a single affordable housing unit in the past three years. This is one of the reasons that Council unanimously passed the new Affordable Housing Strategy in July.

The strategy calls for the City to secure funding from the provincial and federal governments, to work with partner agencies and the development industry, and to prioritize private projects that include some affordable and accessible units. The strategy also calls for the City to build new rental units through Calgary Housing Company and affordable homes for ownership through Attainable Homes Calgary.

Learning from the past, the City no longer concentrates affordable housing in one area, but instead encourages smaller projects that better integrate into all neighbourhoods. Most Ward 7 communities already host at least one affordable housing development.

Proposed affordable housing projects will include public engagement to ensure that they integrate well with the surrounding neighbourhood. Should your neighbourhood be selected to host affordable housing, please ask how it can best be accommodated and welcomed into the community. Your new neighbours will certainly appreciate it.






