**President:** The President shall be responsible for the general supervision of the Association and, without restricting the generality of the foregoing, shall:

- 1. Call all meetings of the Board of Directors and the Association, and shall be required to call a meeting of the Board of Directors upon request of three(3) Directors.
- 2. Preside as Chairman at any meeting of the Association or Board of Directors.
- 3. Shall act as the official spokesperson of the Association.
- 4. President has non-voting capacity. In the event of a tie vote, the President will hold the tie-breaking vote.

**Vice President:** The Vice-President shall be responsible directly to the President and his duties shall mainly consist of assisting the President in the administration of the Association generally. The Vice-President shall be required to assume the duties of the President whenever required.

**Secretary:** The Secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings, maintain the amended Bylaws, maintain all records of the Association and give notice of all meetings: and have custody and use of the seal of the Association. Make the records of the Association available for inspection by any Member, by appointment and under the supervision of a Director.

**Treasurer:** The Treasurer shall be responsible for the finances of the Association.

**Board of Director at Large (8 positions):** These are supportive positions within the Board.

The signs of spring are in the air! After a long winter, it's great to be welcoming back robins and crocuses and warmer weather.

Bill 2 is before the House as I write this update and I was very proud to speak in support of the important changes this bill will make for people who've been sexually assaulted or have been the victim of domestic violence. Currently these survivors have two years from the incident to bring a civil case forward and that is often not enough time for someone to have healed enough to face their assaulter in court. I share my own story of being sexually assaulted as a child and I know that being able to bring a civil case forward, in their own time, is a huge step forward in healing from assault. I'm very proud our government has introduced such compassionate legislation and am hopeful it will pass. Last month I had the pleasure of visiting some of the remarkable schools in our constituency. I was lucky enough to visit with the students and staff of St. Henry's, Huntington Hills, Sir John A. McDonald, and Renfrew Educational Services. Congratulations to Sir John A. On March 22nd, the federal government released its budget for 2017.

Many of you have contacted me expressing concern over the level of federal spending, the deficit, and the lack of a plan to return to balanced budgets in the foreseeable future. Unfortunately, the latest federal budget does not do anything to alleviate your concerns. In fact, the projected deficit for 2017 is \$23 billion and, at this current rate of spending, the budget will not be balanced until 2050.

Statistics released from the Parliamentary Budget Officer's (PBO) 2016 Labour Market Assessment show that despite the massive deficit spending the federal government has undertaken, between Q3 2015 and Q3 2016 there were no net full time jobs created. For those of you who are unware of the role of the PBO, they provide non-partisan, independent, and arms-length fiscal and economic analysis of government activity.

Of further concern is the fact that the government's own Gross Domestic Product projections continue to decline despite the increased deficit spending. Canadians are right to be questioning the logic of huge deficits, with no end in sight, which are not creating jobs and are not increasing Canada's competitiveness economically or creating future growth. This is not to mention the scraping of tax credits, including the public transit tax credit, and delays for investments in critical job training programs, infrastructure, defence, and child care.

I will continue to fight for the interests of Alberta families, workers and seniors who are being impacted by this economic downturn.

I recently sponsored petition e-983 which is currently open for signature. The petition is in response to the government's discussion paper regarding changes to the way the House of Commons operates. These proposed changes would eliminate Friday sittings in Parliament, set permanent limits to debate in the House of Commons and committees, and only require the Prime Minister to attend Ouestion Period once per week.

I believe these proposed changes are not in the best interest of Canadians. If you agree I would ask you to visit my website, www. MichelleRempel.ca and sign the petition today.

So, based on vour feedback at this meeting, CPS will be able to conduct additional enforcement in our Ward and report-back their findings. 
