the city. He is also the namesake of our elementary school located in the neighbourhood of East Huntington Hills.

On June 2, 2017, we hosted an amazing special event at Alex Munro School to celebrate the newest addition to our beautiful outdoor learning spaces, the unique and one-of-a kind Canadian Rock Exploration Playscape.

What other features are included in our outdoor learning spaces, you ask? Let me see.... there are flower gardens, composting bins, a natural rock amphitheatre... Oh yes! And don't forget our tiny free library, wicking beds, and birdhouses. And future projects that include a buddy bench and a labyrinth.

We believe we could not have created such a beautiful and inviting outdoor space without the cooperative spirit of our school community and we would like to share this inspiring story with you. On the day of our event, we were joined by special guests to celebrate the official opening of the Rock Playscape.

We welcomed our benefactor: Dr. Nowlan represented the Canadian Geological Foundation to whom we are extremely grateful for the generous grant money that made this project possible.

We welcomed our Community Partners: Mr. Carey from Surface Pro, Mr. Landa who built our beautiful Tiny Library and Miss Aura from Huntington Child Development Center.

We welcomed our friends from the Calgary Girl Guides: District Commissioner, Mrs. Kathy Dion, Girl Guide Leaders Mrs. McWilliam & Mrs. McMillian. **We welcome YOU!** You are invited to enjoy these beautiful spaces with your family and friends during the evening and weekends.

This Rock Playscape Project is a result of the vision and efforts of our Alex Munro Garden committee, a group made up of community volunteers, past and present parents, family members, and staff. We especially acknowledge the vision and tireless efforts of our Garden Committee Chair Person, Ms. Robin McQueen. This group is always looking for new members to join the conversation.

Now, what is a Canadian Rock Exploration Playscape?

It's an interactive playscape that is made up of a collection of seven boulders. Each boulder is engraved with its specific scientific classification. Like many great projects, this one started out with a great question. Mrs. Robin McQueen began to wonder about what would happen when you combine the following: Fresh air + friends + freedom + curiosity + rock science! After much thought Mrs. McQueen was inspired to design this project we now call our Canadian Rock Exploration Playscape.

The Rock Playscape is for everyone: Alex Munro students, community residents, clubs and organizations like Girl Guides, Scouts, Daycares and Day Homes. We invite students from nearby schools to interact with and learn from this outdoor learning space.

Be active and healthy with your friends by moving safely around and on top of each of the rocks!
Be curious and questioning! What's the difference between Sedimentary, Metaphoric, and Igneous rock?
Be a friend! Gather around the Rock Playscape to visit, to enjoy the scenery, to have a picnic.

We believe these outdoor projects provide all of us with an opportunity to appreciate nature and care for our school and community spaces.

News from the **Friends of Nose Hill**

The Supreme Court of Canada played a role in the creation of Nose Hill Park. Planned public purchase of land for a park can be a legitimate reason for refusing to grant a building permit or for a refusal of an application for rezoning.

In 1973, Calgary passed a resolution restricting urban development on 4100 acres in the Nose Hill area and requiring investigation by the City of "all available means" to acquire the land. In 1976, the City reduced the size of the proposed Nose Hill Park by deleting the western parcel of 1500 acres. The Municipal Plan in 1979 said there will be a plan for Nose Hill Park. Then the City passed an area structure plan called Crowchild III which refers to the "proposed Nose Hill Park".

The City adopted the Nose Hill Master Plan by Parks and Recreation to outline the types of recreational activity desirable in the park. This plan put forward 3 alternative park concepts which were evaluated and with recommendations. As a policy document, it was incorporated in the Municipal Plan in June 1980. (There was a Master Plan Review in 1993). With approval of its plan for Nose Hill Park, the City authorized the purchase of land in the park.

The Court determined that: when a municipality makes a firm decision to create a park and demonstrates this in a land-use bylaw, this does not mean that the municipality must create the park immediately.

Under the 1963 law, land could not be zoned as parkland unless the municipality owned the land at the time. Once the decision was made, it had to acquire the land within 6 months. Otherwise, the bylaw was no longer in force.

In 1984, the Court observed that the law has gradually moved away from the rights of the property owner as paramount to planning flexibility and public interest as more important. Alberta decided that, if the rights of individuals and the public conflict, then to the extent necessary, the "greater public interest" must prevail. Ottawa agreed. In other words, *there is nothing inherently wrong with a development freeze*. The Appeal was dismissed with costs.





Celebrate National Child Day November 20, 2017!

In 1959 Canada signed the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) and in 1999, it was endorsed by Alberta. The UNCRC sets out the rights of children with 54 articles that provide us with a solid road map of what is needed to raise healthy and happy children and youth. **The 2017 theme is a child's right to be safe**.

Supporting children's rights is a key factor in improving their quality of life. A community that promotes and invests in healthy childhood development, free from adversities, raises healthier and more engaged citizens. When children experience safe, stable, and nurturing relationships, they develop the strength necessary to cope with significant stressors or challenges. When they are placed in unsafe environments that do not uphold these rights, children are at risk for toxic stress, hindered brain development, and negative physical and mental health outcomes later in life.

At the core of respecting a child's right to safety is their voice being heard, believed, and valued in their community. Whether children and youth are at school, at home, on a sports team, with friends, or online, fostering a safe community involves creating positive relationships with caring peers and adults. We respect a child's right to safety by:

- being approachable;
- listening to, and believing their concerns; and
- advocating for safe spaces for them to learn, grow and play.

We encourage all community members to learn about children's rights and to make plans to celebrate the day. Wear blue, attend a special event or plan an activity with a child, read a story or watch a film on children's rights, encourage youth to use their voice on issues that affect them, or plan a fundraiser to support activities for children. Small businesses are vital to the Canadian economy. Business owners work hard and have often sacrificed a great deal in order to become successful. That is why I am deeply concerned about the small business tax increases that the Federal Government has proposed. Any changes to Canada's tax system must ensure that small businesses are given every opportunity to grow, create good paying jobs, and contribute to our economy. With those principles in mind, I have supported legislation in the past, and will continue to support legislation in the future, that lowers taxes for small and medium-sized businesses, reduces government red tape, and allows entrepreneurs to create jobs.

The formal consultation on the Federal Government's proposals closed on October 02, 2017 but, if you would like to learn more about the proposed changes please visit my website www.MichelleRempel.ca.

In order to hear directly from those in our community on this issue I held a Town Hall Meeting at the end of September that was attended by over 300 individuals. Due to the short notice of the event I was unable to advertise the meeting via billboard signs and apologize if you were not aware of the event. The overwhelming majority of the individuals who attended, and who have contacted me through my office, are opposed to the proposed changes.

Now that the consultation period has closed the debate shifts to Parliament. Please continue to send me your feedback and suggestions on this topic as we debate these changes.

November means the days are growing shorter, the clocks are changing and the Legislature is back in session, and I am honoured to be your representative in Edmonton.

Bill 203, Alberta Standard Time Act, was referred to the Standing Committee on Alberta's Economic Future during the last session, and I participated in the process of hearing from Albertans and business stakeholders in the province. What we heard is that many people do not support continuing to observe Daylight Saving Time; for some people it is an annoyance, for some it is a hardship to adjust schedules, especially for people with small children and for people who rely on accurately-timed medication. We also heard from a minority of people who believe we should continue with DST. We also heard from business stakeholders that changing the time as proposed would put them at a competitive disadvantage. Two of these stakeholders are here in Calgary Mackay Nose Hill: The Calgary Airport Authority and WestJet. WestJet has some concerns about losing business to competing airports, specifically Vancouver, if we were 2 hours ahead of British Columbia for part of the year. The Airport Authority similarly expressed concerns about attracting and retaining airlines if our time zone were to change as proposed. Less business in Calgary for WestJet and the Airport Authority means fewer jobs for many people in Calgary Mackay Nose Hill, and for these reasons I introduced a motion to recommend to the Legislature that the bill not be passed as is, AND that Alberta lead conversations with other jurisdictions who are considering ending DST. Given our early economic recovery, I do not want to introduce more challenges to our business community.

Alberta has more women working than any other province, yet women represent only 7% of corporate board positions here. A pilot program has been established by the Status of Women minster to help remove barriers and expand leadership opportunities for women and was recently launched in Calgary. The six-month program matches women with mentors in engineering, construction, finance, academics, and business development. Volunteer mentors will share advice, connections, and opportunities and support their mentees' career development. This pilot is part of the government's ongoing work to advance women's equality by tackling the systemic barriers and deeply-rooted gender biases that keep women out of leadership positions.
