PRESIDENT'S

It is hard to imagine that it is December already (of course I did miss the November newsletter!).

I would like to welcome Hi Ball Restaurant to Montgomery. After the devastating fire in Stadium Shopping Centre, the restaurant was forced to close. With the redevelopment of Stadium Shopping Centre it was uncertain what the future would hold. It was great to see the sign lit up in our community!

I would also like to welcome Shawarma Palace which will be opening soon!

Montgomery was chosen for the City of Calgary Main Streets Project. Using the Municipal Development Plan and the Montgomery Area Redevelopment Plan, the project aims to increase densification along the corridors of Bowness Road and 16th Avenue. Two open houses were held with the City Planners. It was great to see the City integrating the comments of residents in the changes in the second iteration of the plan. I hope that everyone who was interested in this project took the opportunity to provide feedback.

Shaqanappi Trail, 16th Avenue, Bowness Road intersection review is also underway. Four plans were previewed by the Board and again at the open house on November 23. This is a long range plan and it is uncertain what the next steps will be or when they will be implemented.

The light barrier fence has been constructed along Shaganappi Trail across from the Children's Hospital/University District intersection. I would like to thank Janice M, David B, and Rhonda Z for their work with West Campus Trust in planning an interesting and high quality product.

The Volunteer Banquet was held November 19. It is incredibly humbling to work in this community where we have close to 200 people who volunteer their time to make this a better place to live, work, and play. I know that there are people thinking about getting involved and wondering how to connect with the community. I encourage you to contact me, Janine, or attend a Board meeting as there are many different ways to become involved.

We have also engaged the services of S2 Architect firm to examine the building and to consider a long range plan for renovations. The kitchen is in dire need of upgrades and we are looking at what options we have for the space.





South Shaganappi Area Strategic Planning Group

The South Shaganappi Area Strategic Planning Group is a group of community representatives and stakeholders that meet on a monthly basis to inform and respond to a number of institutional and infrastructure development projects in the area.

The Calgary Cancer Centre announced that Ellis Don Construction Services and PCL Construction Management are the two teams that were shortlisted from the list of qualified applicants to submit proposals for the design/build phase of the project.

Alberta Health Services is looking for assistance from neighbouring communities regarding parking at the Foothills Medical Centre during the construction of Lot 1. Potential users are requested to use Lot 10 on the west side of the Centre, and also the underground parkade at McKaig Tower where the +15 is available to connect to the main hospital.

Cadillac Fairview provided an update of the construction activities at Market Mall. The small west parking lot will be closed until July 2017 for excavation to accommodate the Sport Chek expansion. Demolition at the former Target site is underway. Sporting Life and Home Sense are scheduled to take possession of the premises February 1, 2017. Planning openings are for the Fall of 2017.

The University of Calgary has launched their annual United Way campaign. The goal for this year is \$500,000. Currently the campaign has raised approximately \$170,000.

The University District is developing a new 5,000 sq. ft. marketing centre scheduled to open in February 2017. Brookfield Residential and Truman are currently working on the underground utilities for the Phase 1 residential towers. The offices of the West Campus Development Trust have been moved to the Alastair Ross Technology Centre, located behind Vecova, in the University of Calgary Research Park.

PLANNING REPORT

New Permits

The Planning Committee reviewed a range of Development Permit proposals over the past month.

A DP application was reviewed for a Temporary Home Occupation – Class 2 (Acupuncture) at 4656 Montalban Drive NW (DP2016-4217).

A DP application for a Change of Use – Medical Clinic and Addition (DP2016-2642) was reviewed - located at 4620 16th Avenue NW. This clinic will house a chiropractic office along with other related disciplines. The building will include two levels of underground parking and the high-quality exterior design will be a welcome addition to the streetscape along 16th Ave NW. The owners and architect should be commended for their commitment to a well-considered design for this site.

A multi-residential unit is being proposed for 4803 Bowness Road NW (DP2016-4320). The proposal showed 5 units; 4 of the units face 47th street and one unit faces 47th & Bowness Road. Three of the driveways will be accessed from 47th St. NW and two will be accessed from the lane.

A refurbishment of the exterior façade of the multi-residential / multi-use commercial development at 4611 Bowness Road NW is being proposed (DP2016-4412).



A Sensible Solution

For those who may not already know, I have been a long-time advocate of organ and tissue donation in Canada and was instrumental in creating the organ donor registry in Alberta a few years ago.

However, the reality is 4,600 Canadians are awaiting a transplant and we need to do more to find those critical matches to save more lives.

I have introduced a Private Member's Bill, Bill C-316. which proposes a very simple, very effective method to increase the size of the organ donor base in Canada. It will also help update existing databases.

I am proposing we add a line to the annual tax forms that asks Canadians if they would like to become an organ donor and if they want to have this information passed to their provincial government for addition to the existing organ donor registries. The provinces will still be maintaining their own lists and the federal government will just be supplying them with data for that purpose.

The Canada Revenue Agency already successfully shares data every day with all the provinces and territories via encrypted networks with strong and reliable privacy safeguards. In addition, the existing infrastructure would support this change with virtually no cost. CRA already shares dozens of data fields of information on every taxpayer with the provinces and territories and this would simply be one more data field.

The tax form is a way to update this information annually via a legally-binding document. It would allow for lists to remain current and relevant.

Currently, the only proactive approach used by governments is to ask for donors via the driver's licence registration process. The number of people getting drivers' licences is dropping every year.

The voluntary online method of registering is neither proactive or fully effective. Those who move from one province to another do not update their information,

especially young people who are prime donors. The tax form approach overcomes these common problems and expands the potential donors reached.

Sadly, when someone dies, the tax department is often one of the first government agencies to be notified. This too will help update provincial registries and keep them current. This makes for a more effective and responsive donation system.

I hope I can count on your support for Bill C-316.



Changes are coming to the following northwest and inner city bus routes on September 5, 2016: Routes 8, 9, 10, 22/122, 37/137, 43/143, 145, 404, 405, 407, 412 and 419.

Calgary Transit has completed a major review of these bus routes and is excited to share the results with customers. Earlier this year new bus route proposals were shared online and at open houses, and feedback was collected from thousands of transit users and community stakeholders. Public input was incorporated as much as possible in designing the new bus routes.

The new routes are simple and direct, and many of them have upgraded service levels, meaning that buses come more frequently and/or run longer on evenings and weekends. Additionally, service has been increased or improved to major locations such as Foothills Hospital, The University of Calgary and shopping centres.

2016 Transit Service Review

After the new bus routes were introduced on Sept. 5, we had operational concerns with Route 9 (Dalhousie/Sunnyside) and Route 90 (Bridgeland/Parkhill). These concerns have negatively impacted our ability to provide safe and reliable transit service on these routes. As a result, we are making changes to Routes 9 and 90 in order to address these concerns while continuing to provide transit service in these communities. The changes will come into effect on Monday, Dec. 19.
