

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Notice of North Haven Preschool Closure

As you may have heard, the North Haven Community Association Board recently very reluctantly made the decision to close our preschool after the spring session. We did not arrive at the decision lightly; it has long been a valued part of our community.

The North Haven preschool was started many years ago by a local parent as a community playschool with a mandatory volunteer component. In recent years, we have been told by parents they do not want to have to volunteer. We changed the program to make volunteering not mandatory, but licensing rules stipulated the hiring of an extra worker. Enrollment has decreased year over year, and we cannot continue to subsidize the program to the extent we have been in the last few years.

We have gone from having a full contingent of 24 or even 25 in each of the 3- and 4-year-old classes 11 or 12 years ago, with a very strong volunteer base, to only six children registered in the current 3-year class. Of these six, only one has registered for the fall. Based on a projection of six or fewer in the 3-year class and at best eight or ten for the 4-year-old class, we reluctantly came to the conclusion that closure was the best choice for the time being.

We wanted to inform people early enough that they could make alternate arrangements for fall. We will be exploring options for the space, including an outside run preschool, the feasibility of a daycare or the possibility of restarting the community run preschool. If you are interested in helping the Board explore the options, visit http://northhavenyyc.ca/nhps to sign up for the remediation committee. Thank you to everyone who has been a part of the Preschool over the years. Thank you to those who have taught and those who volunteered at the preschool. We have had wonderful, dedicated teachers who have helped our children grow and learn and they have helped us create many special memories. We will miss them and the contributions they have made to our children's lives and to our community.

The City annually invests in infrastructure and upgrades to ensure levels of service and address both capacity and lifecycle needs. The storm water quality retrofit program adds more wet ponds to long-established areas of the city. Wet ponds protect the quality of river water by slowing the flow, allowing sediment to settle. Plants help to remove pollutants. In all, there are 200-flood related projects requiring repairs or restoration. There are riverbank stabilization and erosion sites, the storm drainage system, and lift or pump stations. Construction projects include water main and pipe repairs, as well as new projects and upgrades to improve water and wastewater systems.

The North Calgary Water Servicing Project is underway. This is part of a long-term plan to sustain the water supply system. A new water supply line (feeder main) is required to service future area development A consultant will design and construct a new water main from Big Hill Pump Station to the Beddington Reservoir. The preferred alignment will cross Nose Hill Park, using geotechnical tunnelling up to 90 metres or 300 feet deep. A rare plant and bird survey to ensure conservation of protected species will be done before phase 1 soil sampling to test the proposed route. The optimum time to drill 21 test holes (each 6 inches in diameter) is midwinter when the ground is frozen, which minimizes the impact on the surface environment. However, the areas

adjacent to these test locations will be rehabilitated prior to crew leaving the site.

The City promises that there will be only minor surface disruption in the SW and NE corners of Nose Hill at the entrance and exit of the proposed tunnel. No other surface work would be required in the park. Phase 2 construction will occur in Summer 2017 to summer 2018. Drilling and survey equipment and personnel will be visible on the hill but away from the paths by mid-Febearly April 2017. In addition, there will be signs at Nose Hill parking lots and an information brochure at www. calgary.ca/nosehill. You can phone 3-1-1 for general water construction inquiries or a list of road closures due to other construction projects.

On March 22nd, the federal government released its budget for 2017.

Many of you have contacted me expressing concern over the level of federal spending, the deficit, and the lack of a plan to return to balanced budgets in the foreseeable future. Unfortunately, the latest federal budget does not do anything to alleviate your concerns. In fact, the projected deficit for 2017 is \$23 billion and, at this current rate of spending, the budget will not be balanced until 2050.

Statistics released from the Parliamentary Budget Officer's (PBO) 2016 Labour Market Assessment show that despite the massive deficit spending the federal government has undertaken, between Q3 2015 and Q3 2016 there were no net full time jobs created. For those of you who are unware of the role of the PBO, they provide non-partisan, independent, and arms-length fiscal and economic analysis of government activity.

Of further concern is the fact that the government's own Gross Domestic Product projections continue to decline despite the increased deficit spending. Canadians are right to be questioning the logic of huge deficits, with no end in sight, which are not creating jobs and are not increasing Canada's competitiveness economically or creating future growth. This is not to mention the scraping of tax credits, including the public transit tax credit, and delays for investments in critical job training programs, infrastructure, defence, and child care.

I will continue to fight for the interests of Alberta families, workers and seniors who are being impacted by this economic downturn.


I recently sponsored petition e-983 which is currently open for signature. The petition is in response to the government's discussion paper regarding changes to the way the House of Commons operates. These proposed changes would eliminate Friday sittings in Parliament, set permanent limits to debate in the House of Commons and committees, and only require the Prime Minister to attend Question Period once per week.

Investing in Albertans

Occasionally, constituents tell me they're concerned about the state of Alberta's finances. The fact is that Alberta is set to lead the country in economic growth this year, and has the lowest debt-to-GDP ratio of all Canadian provinces. Given this outlook, there are several important arguments for maintaining the state of our front-line services.

The moral argument is the one I find most compelling: Albertans shouldn't be made to pay or suffer for fluctuations in the price of oil and the lack of foresight of previous governments. Since oil was discovered in Alberta, governments have used non-renewable resource revenues to fund schools, hospitals, roads and infrastructure. When oil prices were high, previous governments pretended to be wise fiscal managers, and when oil prices were low, they slashed and burned front-line services Albertans rely on. This isn't fair to Albertans. People shouldn't be made to line up for hospital care, or put their child in a classroom with 50 others, just because the price of oil fluctuates.

There's also a strong economic argument to be made for maintaining funding levels for health and education while investing in infrastructure. As Alberta's economy recovers, we want to be an attractive place to move to, start a business, and invest. This means building the infrastructure we need while prices are relatively low, and maintaining the state of our front-line services. Companies rarely start new branches or move employees to places that throw their health and education systems into crisis. Maintaining stable funding to services helps Alberta remain competitive on the world stage.

The role of any government should be to make life better for Albertans, and that's the role I see myself and my New Democrat colleagues accomplishing. Yes, serious conversations need to happen regarding the responsible management of revenues in Alberta. But when a world-wide oil price shock hurts working Albertans and their families, the first priority of government is to support Albertans as they weather the economic storm.
