

#### **CROWCHILD TRAIL UPDATES**

#### **Next Steps: Crowchild Trail Plan**

Since receiving funding approval from Council on April 24, 2017, the project team has completed detailed design and prepared contract documents for the shortterm plan work. We are on track to begin construction in late October with completion expected in late 2019. Graham has been selected as our contractor and together, we will ensure that citizens know to expect the following along Crowchild Trail:

- Reduced speed limit to 50km/hr between 17 Avenue S.W. and 16 Avenue N.W., for the safety of citizens and
- Narrowed traffic lanes to make space for crews.
- No lane closures during weekday peak hours (Monday to Friday between 5 a.m. – 9 p.m.)
- One to two lane closures during weekday off-peak hours (Monday to Friday between 9 p.m. – 5 a.m.)
- One lane closure on weekends (beginning Fridays at 9 p.m. and ending Mondays at 5 a.m.)
- Nighttime construction work between the hours of 9 p.m. – 5 a.m.
- The building of road and pathway detours where reguired, to ensure people can still access their destina-
- The removal of trees where necessary, replanting, and landscape replenishments as part of this project.
- Our commitment to keeping business accesses open throughout construction.

The volume of work will increase leading up to the 2018 construction season, which will include road work north of the river as well as work on the Memorial Drive. Bow River and Bow Trail bridges. In an effort to provide neighbouring communities with the opportunity to review the detailed construction plans and ask questions of the project team, we have arranged the following information session:

#### **Crowchild Trail Construction**

On October 29, 2017, The City began the first phase of Crowchild Trail upgrades over the Bow River, between Bow Trail and Memorial Drive, and then further north up to 5 Avenue N.W.

The objective of this two-year project is to upgrade Crowchild Trail so that it will manage traffic better over the Bow River, move traffic more efficiently on and off Crowchild Trail, and improve connections for people who walk and cycle in the area.

Crowchild Trail is a critical part of Calgary's transporta-

tion network; it sees up to 107,000 vehicles a day, has thousands of people using the pathways below, and communities on either side. "We have to keep this road open while we work because it's the main north-south link across the west side of Calgary, provides access downtown, and connects to major destinations across the city", Jeff Baird, Senior Transportation Engineer, City of Calgary explains.

"For the safety of crews and people travelling in the area, we're slowing people down through the site, but we're keeping all the traffic lanes open during weekdays and focusing on more of the road impact work through the night." Baird adds: "Our team is working to ensure the noisier work is minimized through the night and we'll be communicating our night schedules to our neighbours and posting it online."

When pathway closures and detours are necessary, notices will be put in place (For example: Crowchild Trail pedestrian bridge which is closed from Nov. 6 to spring 2018, to accommodate bridge work. People can use Edworthy Park bridge or 14 Street S.W. bridge to cross the Bow River).

The Parkdale Community Association is in the early planning stages of creating a vibrant butterfly and bee garden in the green space in front of the Nifty Fifties. We are excited to announce that Mary Jane Novokowsky has donated \$4414.95 through the Dr. Bernie Novokowksy Legacy Fund. Special thanks to Mary Jane for choosing this project as legacy to her husband's memory.

Currently the green space is unattractive and provides limited interaction with people using the facility. Our goal is twofold. There is a need in Calgary to provide spaces for pollinating species, which plays a vital role in honey bee sustainability. Our second goal is to create a space of beauty, where residents enjoy the wonders of nature, and the opportunity to interact with other users of the space.

The number of honey bees worldwide is on the decrease. According to Green Peace "The main reasons for global bees-decline are industrial agriculture, parasites/ pathogens and climate change. The loss of biodiversity, destruction of habitat and lack of forage due to monocultures and bee-killing pesticides are particular threats for honeybees and wild pollinators. It is becoming increasingly evident that some insecticides, at concentrations applied routinely in the current chemical-intensive agriculture system, exert clear, negative effects on the health of pollinators—both individually and at the colony level. The observed, sub-lethal, low-dose effects of insecticides on bees are various and diverse."

The Parkdale Community Association is currently meeting with a landscape architect who will be tasked with designing a space we can all be proud of. Although we do not know the costs at this time, we know that the expense will be considerable. We will be applying for funding through several grant opportunities available to us, and may need to ask for support from the community.

Please watch for updates in future editions, as we share important information on this project with the residents of Parkdale.

#### **UNIVERSITY DISTRICT UPDATE**

#### CONNECTIVITY

#### **Road Network:**

On November 14, (weather dependent) we are looking to restore pre-existing conditions and traffic patterns which include the following:

- Opening of University Ave & McLaurin Intersection which will coincide with the opening of all of McLaurin.
- Children's Way (adjacent to Rotary Flames House) will be open to McLaurin (right turn only).
- The entrance to Lot 57 will be restored to its original location. See the map below. Please follow the signs and proceed carefully to park.

#### Multi Modal (Pedestrians and Cyclists):

- The pathway detour installed this spring will remain.
- · A temporary pathway will be established along University Ave to provide an additional pedestrian connection and a more direct route to the main campus from the western portion of the site.
- Please use care when walking through the site as it is still an active construction area.
- The existing pedestrian corridor along the east side of 39th street will remain.

#### **SAFETY**

- · Additional digital signs will be placed next week to provide travelers with advance warning of upcoming changes.
- Standard construction signage will be in place to instruct motorists at key intersections, and other areas requiring extra caution.

## **Cold Weather Safety**

SAFE & SOUND

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) paramedics respond to a number of cold weather-related emergencies every winter. However, by taking appropriate measures to dress properly, anticipate sudden weather changes and preparing to be out in the cold, may reduce your risk of sustaining a cold weather illness/injury. It's also advised you store an emergency kit in your vehicle at all times containing extra clothing, blankets and other road-side supplies.

- Frost-nipped skin is extremely cold, but not yet frozen skin;
- · It commonly affects the ears, nose, cheeks, fingers and
- The skin may look red and possibly feel numb to the
- When treated promptly, frostnip usually heals without complication;
- · Move to a warm environment and immediately, but gently, re-warm the affected area through skin to skin contact (i.e. hand covering tips of ears).

#### Frostbite

- Frostbite occurs when skin becomes so cold, the skin and underlying tissues freeze;
- · Affected skin may look white and waxy and will feel hard to the touch;
- Move to a warm environment immediately and place the affected area in warm, not hot, water, until fully rewarmed:
- Call 9-1-1, or seek further medical attention as required.

#### Hypothermia

- Hypothermia is abnormally low body temperature, less than 34°C (as compared to normal body temperature of about 37°C);
- Early hypothermia may manifest as profound shivering; moderate hypothermic patients may act inappropriately: stumbling, mumbling, and fumbling, as their body temperature continues to drop resulting in severe hypothermia (<30°C);
- · Left untreated, severe hypothermia may progress to unconsciousness or death;
- Early recognition and prompt medical attention is key. Call 9-1-1. Don't forget to protect yourself from the factors that originally lead to the patient's situation;
- Initiate gentle re-warming as quickly as possible. Remove any wet or constrictive clothing; cover with blankets, or sleeping bags. Protect from further heat loss: eliminate contact with cold surfaces, and shield from wind and moisture.

**About the Maker:** Founded in 1933 to offer scale to the smaller producers of the area, Celler de Capçenes originated as a low-end bulk-wine cooperative. It re-invented itself in 1995 after recognizing quality wine production was key to its success. From humble beginnings it now produces world-class wines.

About the Land: A combination of clay, Ilicorella slate, limestone, and sand make up the earth of the Montsant region. Each benefit unique attributes to the 50-yearold bush-vines of the region.

About the Blend: A blend in the style of France's southern Rhône Valley, the 2014 Mas Donis is a combination of Grenache (70%), Syrah (25%), and Merlot (5%). It offers a luscious alternative to the signature Spanish reds made from the Tempranillo grape.

About Sustainability: Sustainable farming practices from smaller, family-owned vineyards.

About the Wine: A lovely medium purple in-glass, distinct allspice aromas combine with notes of black cherry. On the palate, a concentrated attack of plum, spice, and liquorice impress and finishes clean and long.

About Pairing: Barbequed dry-rubbed back ribs or Fall evenings.


