

Backyard Fire Safety tips from your Calgary Fire Department

Enjoying a recreational fire in your backyard can be a great way to spend a summers evening. Here are some Safety and bylaw considerations for you.

- Always confirm that a Fire Ban is not in effect before
- starting a fire for recreational purposes.
- Fires may only be burned in fire pits between 10 a.m. and 1 a.m.

Rules for fire pits

- 1. Backyard fire pits should be built into the ground, on brick or stone, or in a fire-proof container. Portable fire pits may be used on a deck as long as they sit on brick or stone, and not directly on your wooden deck. Always refer to the Fire pit manufacturer for approved fir pit locations.
- 2. Fire pits must be at least two metres away from your property line, house, garage, or fence.
- 3. Fire pits must **NOT** be under any trees, branches, plants or other materials that can catch fire.
- 4. All fires in your fire pit must be kept to a reasonable size; 1 metre high and wide. This helps to ensure embers, sparks or smoke don't harm anyone or cause a nuisance to your neighbours.
- 5. Only burn clean, dry firewood. **Do NOT burn:**
 - · Wood that is painted, treated or contains glue or resin
 - Wet or green/fresh cut wood
 - Yard waste (cut grass or leaves)
 - Garbage
 - Rubber or plastic
 - Furniture
- 6. Always have a way to extinguish the fire in the event of an emergency. Easy options are having your watering hose or a bucket of water nearby.
- 7. All fires in your fire pit must never be left unattended.

Aside from safety considerations, not following these rules can lead to fines of \$500, \$1000 or even \$5000. For more information, go to Calgary.ca/fire.

In addition to free parking, Nose Hill has many features, with hiking, off-leash area, washroom, wildlife spotting, interpretive signs, native grasslands, larger mammals, such as deer and coyotes. You can also find geocaches. OISEAU Agents of Nature is a free downloadable mobile app about nature and wildlife. The idea is to encourage outdoors discovery with interactive fun. Be an agent of nature and solve challenges. You can access Nose Hill and the codes for the app from the parking lot off Berkley Gate. Then unlock some mysteries of nature. Speaking of city parks and other green spaces, after the City decided to end the Adopt-a-Park program, there were a few complaints about these areas. The residents involved are proud of how beautiful and green their neighborhoods are through the help of this volunteer program. If this is coming to an end (or being replaced) due to more strict water management, how can we keep the neighbourhoods looking green and nice so that the residents continue to be proud of them?

The General Manager of Community Services responded that the Adopt-a-Park program came into effect in 1984 and was discontinued in 2015. It served a very good purpose and encouraged pride in community, but there were several issues with the program, such as the possible wasteful use of water, safety, collective agreements, and some centralized pieces of the services that the City provides.

The program was replaced with two new programs. The Green Leaders program for community volunteers provides oversight to doing projects in the community to enhance it, such as painting park benches or weeding. The second project, Water Stewards, will have volunteers focus mostly on keeping the city's many high-use playing fields watered.

Both programs are trying to address some of the issues that had emerged but also respond to the community desire to continue to care and have pride in their community with a more focused, targeted, and supportive approach. The General Manager noted that the programs will be evaluated over the course of 2016.

A Safety Management System (SMS) is all about managing the safety interaction you have with your workers. It's an overall strategy to help you communicate information on hazards and best practices in your workplace so you can develop a stronger, lasting culture of safety within all stakeholders in your organization.

Polybutylene (also known as PB or Poly-B) pipe is a flexible, grey pipe that was used in several million homes built from 1970 to the mid-1990s. Due to problems with leaks, Poly-B water pipes are no longer accepted by United States or Canadian building codes and have been the subject of class action lawsuits in both countries. Poly-B fails without warning because it breaks down from the inside of the pipe over time, which can result in sudden catastrophic damage or severe structural damage including mold if a pipe has been leaking for some time without detection. Alberta is developing a new strategy to address climate change based on recommendations put forward by the Climate Change Advisory Panel and I wanted to let you know what to expect in the weeks and months ahead. Details of the final strategy are being developed, and there are 4 key areas that the Alberta government is moving forward on as part of our Climate Leadership Plan.

Under the Climate Leadership Plan, Alberta will be phasing out emissions from coal-generated electricity and developing more renewable energy production to reduce pollution, specifically from coal-fired sources of electricity, by 2030. Moving to cleaner sources of generation like natural gas, wind, solar and biomass to meet our power needs will protect the health of our children and other vulnerable Albertans by making the air we breathe cleaner. Coal fired electricity generation is the source of almost 20% of Greenhouse Gas (or GHG) emissions from electricity generation in Alberta. Our government is developing a transition plan that ensures workers, communities and affected companies are treated fairly in this process.

The Climate Leadership Plan calls for a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions via a carbon levy to encourage people, businesses and communities to lower their emissions. The levy will help diversify our energy industry and create new jobs through reinvestment in renewables and infrastructure, while improving opportunities to get our traditional energy products to new markets. Carbon rebates will offset costs associated with the levy which six out of ten Albertan households will be eligible for a



It is just like man's vanity and impertinence to call an animal dumb because it is dumb to his dull perceptions. Mark Twain full rebate, and another 6% of households will receive a partial rebate. The small business tax rate is being cut by one third to support businesses in the change as well.

A legislated oil sands emission limit Alberta will transition to a \$30/tonne carbon price for oil sands facilities to drive reduced emissions. A legislated maximum emissions limit of 100Mt in any year, with provisions for cogeneration and new upgrading capacity, will help drive innovation and give operators time to develop and implement new technology to remove carbon emissions from every barrel and reduce Alberta's overall emissions.

Lastly, the oil and gas industry is the source of 70% of the province's total methane emissions. Alberta is targeting a 45 per cent reduction in methane gas emissions from Alberta's oil and gas operations by 2025. The climate change impact of methane is significant — 25 times greater than carbon dioxide over a 100-year period. We are confident that this new plan will lead us to a greener future for all Albertans.

I hope you find this information helpful in understanding some of the changes we will see as our province enacts the Climate Leadership Plan. The Plan is an important framework for our province's future economic prosperity and for the health of all Albertan's, especially children and other vulnerable populations. *All Albertans who take steps to reduce their emissions – by turning down the heat when no one is home, installing smart thermostats, choosing more fuel efficient cars, using public transit, walking, biking, or taking advantage of coming energy efficiency programs – can reduce the cost of the carbon levy.

As a member of the Standing Committee on Immigration and Citizenship, my duties require that government decisions are held up to scrutiny, and where necessary, improved upon. An unprecedented number of refugees have arrived and will be arriving in Canada and it is of crucial importance that the federal government provides the services they need to integrate into our country, our culture and our economy.

The Minister of Immigration and his officials have been unable to address the total expenditures on the Syrian refugee initiative to date, when appearing before committee to discuss Supplementary Estimates. The government told Canadians during the campaign that the total cost of the initiative would be \$250M, now it's climbing towards \$1B, they haven't calculated the downstream impact on provinces and municipalities, and frontline service groups are testifying at committee saying that their funding has been cut.

The government needs to show Canadians a fully costed plan to support the refugees that they've brought to Canada.

For weeks now at parliamentary committee, as well as in the media, we have been hearing how Syrian refugees are struggling now that they are in Canada. We've heard that they haven't been able to make long term arrangements for affordable housing, access language training services, or find employment. All of these issues put refugees at risk of isolation and poverty. Supporting refugees means more than taking pictures with them when they arrive.

Front line agencies providing services to Syrian refugees are also struggling. Many groups in recent weeks have told a parliamentary committee that they have faced funding cuts, and have been overloaded by the rapid influx of refugees precipitated by the government's Syrian refugee initiative. School boards have described having to raise class sizes and defer maintenance due to the influx of refugees. By the Minister of Immigration's own remarks in the House of Commons and in parliamentary committee, Canada's intake of refugees has increased by nearly 400%, while funding for resettlement has only increased by 4%.

This committee study will conclude in September. I will continue to advocate on this issue on your behalf.

In case of an emergency, know your location

Each year, Calgary's 9-1-1 centre receives over one million emergency and non-emergency calls. It takes a team of over 300 employees, working in a 24-7 environment to answer those calls and get citizens the help they need.

The most important piece of information a 9-1-1 emergency communications officer needs is your location. If you don't know where you are, there may be a delay in getting you the help you need. Many citizens assume that emergency responders can find them based on cell phone GPS. This is not true. While the 9-1-1 officer may receive your approximate location, it's not always accurate. That's why it is so important to always pay attention to your surroundings and know your location.

It's easy if you're at home where you can provide your home address to the 9-1-1 officer. But what if you were outside, enjoying your day in one of Calgary's parks, when you suddenly need to call 9-1-1? If you're in Fish Creek Park, Glenmore Reservoir or on the Bow River pathway, you can look for our emergency locator signs. These signs are an initiative between Calgary Parks and Calgary 9-1-1. Taking note of them will help crews locate you in an emergency.

Whether you're at home or out enjoying the summer in our city, Calgary 9-1-1 is there to help you stay safe.


