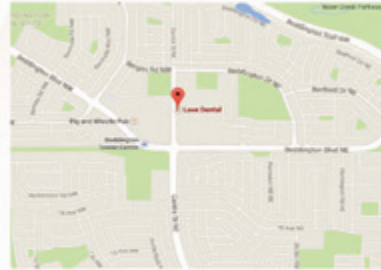

TGCA celebrates community!

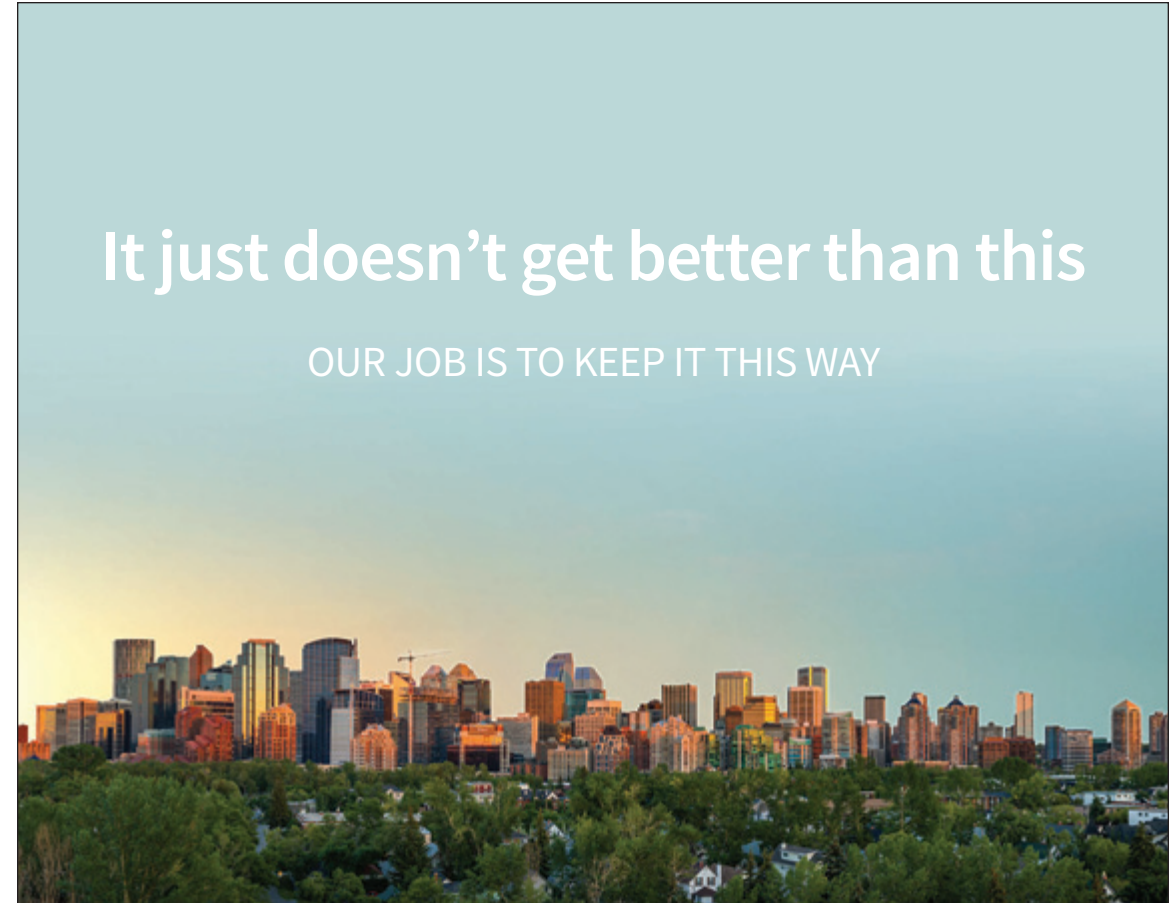

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Good Food Box Program

What is the Good Food Box? It's a monthly program where community members can buy fresh fruit and vegetables for a very low cost. Thorncliffe Greenview Community Association now has a Good Food Box Depot. You receive top quality produce at wholesale prices. There are three sizes of boxes to choose from. The large box (\$35.00) contains 40 plus pounds of produce. The medium box (\$30.00) contains 30 plus pounds of produce. The small box (\$25.00) contains 20 plus pounds of produce. You only order the size you want, when you want. How do you get a food box? Bring your exact cash to the Horizon Room at Thorncliffe Greenview Community Centre between 2:00 and 5:00 p.m. on the scheduled pick up day. This will secure your order for the next month or bring your exact cash to the Administration Office no later than the order deadline listed below. News from the Friends of Nose Hill

We can preserve nature and foster biodiversity for future generations, by staying on designated pathways and trails in our parks, in addition to respecting wildlife habitat and their migration patterns. The long-range plans are to monitor and manage invasive species (weeds); reduce habitat fragmentation; and link important habitat areas in the city and region.

The city-wide Biodiversity committee has met and a website with agenda and minutes is in the works. In the meantime, digital versions of the 10-year strategic plan can be found on the City's biodiversity page at: www.calgary.ca/biodiversity.

Many of Calgary's existing open space sites, such as Nose Hill, Union Cemetery, Reader Rock Garden, Riley Park, Fort Calgary, and Inglewood Bird Sanctuary are in the category of Cultural landscapes. A major challenge is determining which method is most appropriate for the resource, with a view toward protection, preservation or conservation, and restoration.

Cultural resource projects may include some or all of the following:

- Protection: measures needed to guard against further damage or deterioration;
- Preservation: ongoing maintenance activities that preserve the historic appearance or features of the landscape;
- Restoration: the removal of later additions and the re-creation of missing elements

Of the 800 kms of city-wide pathways, City Council approved snow clearing for up to 350 kms. Generally, City Parks crews are to clear snow on pathways within 24 hours and on sidewalks adjacent to parks within 72 hours. Re: concerns about pathways in natural parks not being cleared, some trails/pathways are best used only in non-winter months. Due to the steepness of the slope or site conditions, there may be safety concerns for potential pathway users and crews.

Environmentally Significant Areas (ESAs) are land with conservation value.

This applies to the river valley system, the urban forest, and natural environment parks. The land includes escarpments, natural grasslands, woodlots, and native pasture but also pertains to wetlands, natural bodies of water, and riparian corridors (along the river margins and banks).

There is an update on Open Space policy for recreational and environmental park spaces. Stakeholder consultation meetings with City Parks staff and industry began in February 2015. A final draft form of impact assessment for ESAs was debated by Council in early 2016. Planning and mapping guidelines are expected and a work program completed by March 2016.

Hello Calgary-Klein!

I've spoken to many in the riding that are concerned about the effects low global oil prices are having on Alberta's businesses, workers, and families. Our reliance on a single commodity, the price over which we have no control, contributes substantially to the problem. While Alberta is and will be an energy province for years to come, our government is taking important steps to diversify our economy to increase its resiliency when faced with volatile changes in the price of our energy exports. Some of these steps include:

- **The creation of the Ministry of Economic Development and Trade**, led by Hon. Deron Bilous. This ministry leads economic development efforts and provides one-stop access to information and support for businesses and investors.
- **Working with other provincial leaders to advance Alberta's economic and trade interests.** Premier Notley met with New Brunswick Premier Brian Gallant to confirm their mutual support for the Energy East pipeline. Premier Notley also met with the Prime Minister while participating in a First Ministers' meeting and discussed how our country can best tackle climate change.
- **Funding for Student Temporary Employment Program (STEP)**, which will provide 3,000 students with valuable work experience, as well as help small businesses and non-profits connect with a talented and motivated workforce.
- **Introduced the Job Creation Incentive Program**, which supports employers who create net new employment through the provision of grants.

Albertans want stable public services that are there for them when times are tough. In times like these, we need to strengthen health care, education, and social services, because taking care of each other is the Alberta way. Several steps we've taken to stabilize public services include:

- **Freezing post-secondary tuition** for the next two years and **re-investing funding for post-secondary schools** to ensure higher education is accessible and affordable for families.
- **Investing in our students** by hiring more teachers and support staff, as well as lowering the burden of school fees on families.

- **Investing in stable, long-term funding for our public health care system**, including \$120 million over two years for new long-term care spaces, \$90 million over two years to expand public home care, and \$10 million annually for mental health services and resources.

Lastly, our government has proudly set an example when it comes to diverse representation: there is gender parity in Cabinet, a near gender parity in caucus, as well as representation from the LGBTQ community by three MLAs. Our aim is to ensure Albertans from all walks of life have access to the public services they need, and to that effect we've:

- Invested \$15 million in women's shelters.
- Launched a legal aid review to ensure fair access to justice.
- Prohibited discrimination on the basis of gender identity and expression.
- Protected those affected by domestic violence.
- Enhanced safety standards for paid farm and ranch workers.
- Offered ongoing support for Syrian refugees coming to our province.

Calgary City Hall is, by definition, a public space where citizens can visit, attend Council and Committee meetings, and present on issues that matter to them. City Hall 101 aims to throw open the doors and welcome you to this important city space.

Much like an introductory course at University (hence the "101"), this afternoon workshop is an interactive welcome to your City Hall. In just two and half hours, you will learn about the inner workings of Council and its Committees. And to help you find your voice in government, the event will explore the many ways (at City Hall, online, or in your community) that you can connect with your City, Mayor, and Councillors.

Hosted by the Mayor's Civic Engagement Committee, 3 Things for Calgary, and the City Clerk's Office, City Hall 101 starts by welcoming you and other Calgarians to Historic City Hall and the Municipal Complex.

Beyond touring these important public spaces, you will also learn from citizens like yourself about how you can present to Council or Committee. From getting your turn at the microphone or getting tips or tricks about speaking with Council, the goal of the workshop is to help you get the knowledge and confidence to connect with The City and your politicians about the issues that matter to you.

Interested in doing a job that counts? The City is recruiting civic census takers now!

The City's civic census is conducted annually and that means census taker recruitment is underway. The City needs nearly 1,000 flexible workers to help with the door-to-door physical Census collection and data recording in April.

Census takers need to be able to walk in seasonable weather conditions and easily operate a tablet computer. Census takers are provided with essential training, to be completed at home online and must be available for an in-person session in March.

Applications can be downloaded online and are accepted in person, at The City of Calgary Election and Information Services office, 1103 55 Ave NE, between 8:30 a.m. - 4 p.m. Monday to Friday. In addition to completing an application form, there is a written skills assessment test that takes approximately 30 minutes to complete.

If you or anyone you know would be a good fit as a census taker, be sure to send them to calgary.ca/census to fill out an application.

60 years of the 58th Thorncliffe Scout Group

The Beginning

60 years ago a few parents were interested in starting a Boy Scouts Group. They were on the outskirts of town and a community was just starting to be formed. They needed a place to have their meetings but there were no buildings to hold them in. One of the Thorncliffe community members happened to work at the old 'wartime' airport terminal and found out that there were some U.S.A.F shacks up for grabs for only the moving costs. The Scoutmaster asked the newly forming Thorncliffe/Greenview Community Association if they could provide ground to put these buildings on. The Community Association was very agreeable to this and the Scout Group raised the \$500 needed to get the shacks to the property. There were two buildings joined by a kitchen. That first year there were about five boy scouts and two leaders. Registration fees were only \$1.16 cents per child.

At around the same time, the newly established community of Thorncliffe/Greenview was interested in using the Scout Hall. They asked the fledgling 58th Thorncliffe Boys Scouts group to rent theirs. The Scout group was instrumental in helping build the foundations of the Thorncliffe Greenview Community Association. The new Community Association used the Scout hall while a new Thorncliffe Greenview Community Centre was being built. During this time the Community Association and Scout Groups Parent Association were very intertwined, the scout's and their parent's drove much of the fundraising and community awareness.

A Charter was signed on November 24, 1955 documenting that the new Thorncliffe Greenview Community Association would now be the sponsor of 58th Thorncliffe Boys Scouts.
