Your help is needed in improving Alberta's consumer protections!

The Government of Alberta is seeking feedback on ways the government can improve Alberta's consumer protection legislation. Feedback is required on several topics, including contract-related issues like warranties and cancellation rights, as well as shopping-related concerns like transparency in pricing and reward points. The government is also seeking input on topics like household moving services, debt collection, ticket sales and auto repairs.

Do you have stories regarding your experiences with these issues and their related products or services? If you have suggestions for how we can make life more



affordable for Albertans by ensuring a fair marketplace that's fair for buyers and sellers, please provide your feedback to this important initiative.

As part of the efforts to strengthen consumer protection and ensure a level playing field for Alberta businesses, the government has already taken the following steps:

- Payday lending: Put an end to 600 per cent predatory interest rates on payday loans to prevent Albertans from spiralling into poverty. Alberta now has the country's strongest protections and lowest interest rates for borrowers.
- Door-to-door sales: Put an end to misleading, aggressive sales tactics by banning door-to-door sales of energy products and services. The ban includes furnaces, hot water tanks, air conditioners, windows, energy audits, and electricity and natural gas contracts.
- Electricity price cap: Introduced a price cap to make life more affordable and ensure electricity bills are fair.
- New home buyer protection: Introduced a builder licensing framework to protect consumers as well as the reputation of good builders.

Your participation will help Albertans increase trust and build confidence between businesses and consumers.



This school year will be the first one after the implementation of the School Fees and Costs Regulation and the School Transportation Regulation which eliminates the fees for textbooks, workbooks, printing, photocopying and paper as well as bus fees for students living 2.4 kilometres or more from their designated school. This will save Alberta families hundreds of dollars every year.

On Labour Day weekend, the Montgomery Community Association will host the annual BBO on the Bow. It is a delicious celebration of all the ways you can grill fine Alberta meats, as well as a contest for aspiring pitmaster champions. I am certainly looking forward to attending again!

Our government is always interested in hearing what Albertans have to say about major public programs. I am leading Service Alberta in a review of consumer protection laws. You can fill out an online survey until September 15th, or attend an open house in Calgary in mid-September. The condo review is still ongoing and you can submit your feedback to condoreview@gov. ab.ca. Also, the Municipal Government Act review is accepting public input until September 22nd.



Pedestrian Safety

Pedestrian safety and cut-through traffic are top issues for Ward 7 communities. Most older neighbourhoods were built on grid networks, where streets connect at right angles with frequent intersections. The grid makes our communities easy to navigate by foot and by bike, but it also makes them easier to shortcut through, given that multiple routes can be taken to reach a destination. While communities that have "loop and lollypop" streets experience less cut-through traffic, they work poorly for walking and cycling. Both types of Calgary communities have their challenges, which is why we need a wide-reaching approach to make Calgary a better city for walking.

The City's new **Step Forward** pedestrian strategy is a long-term plan to improve the safety, accessibility, and desirability of walking in Calgary. The strategy includes


