



Great Grilled STEAKS

The origins of both the activity of barbecue cooking and the word itself are somewhat obscure, but most will agree, everyone enjoys a steak that's been grilled to perfection!

A great grilled steak begins with the grade and cut of beef you choose. Generally speaking, the grade is based on marbling and age, and the cut provides different qualities of tenderness.

Canada A, AA, AAA and Prime are the highest quality Canadian grades of beef.

Although tenderloin is the most tender cut of beef and also the most expensive, it isn't necessarily the most flavourful, as it has very little marbling, whereas a rib-eye, bone-in rib steak or sirloin, although a little less tender, are more flavourful. Experiment with different cuts to find your favourite!

A few general guidelines for grilling:

- purchase fresh (not frozen) steaks that are firm and brightly coloured
- ideally, steaks should be 1 1 1/2" thick to cook evenly
- remove steaks from refrigerator, cover, and allow to "warm up"
 10-15 min. before grilling
- pat steaks dry with paper towel before cooking
- clean and oil grates with non-stick spray to avoid steaks from sticking to the grill
- season lightly, but do not salt steaks before cooking as salt extracts moisture from meat
- place steaks on a medium-high grill; cook on one side, flip once, and finish on other side
- grill steaks to the desired doneness use the "tongs touch test" or a meat thermometer to test for doneness: *Rare* is soft to the touch/130° F; *Medium Rare* is slightly firmer and springy to the touch/140° F; and *Medium* is firm and slightly springy to the touch/150° F
- remove steaks from grill and allow to rest 10-15 minutes before serving as meat temperature rises 5-10 degrees after being removed from heat
- finish with a nice sea salt like Fleur de Sel

Thoughtful seasoning and choice of condiments can make a memorable steak. Choose them carefully and use sparingly so the effect is subtle and complementary. Enjoy!

During a ceremony held on January 2, 1908, the Ottawa branch of the **Royal Canadian Mint** was officially opened by Governor General Earl Grey, who activated the press to strike the Dominion's first domestically produced coin -- a 50-cent piece. His wife, Lady Grey, closed the ceremony by striking Canada's first bronze cent. Previous to that, Canadian coins were struck at the Royal Mint in London, England.

Currently, the Mint's facility in Winnipeg, which was officially opened in 1976, is responsible for producing the supply of Canadian circulation coins as well as foreign coins. The Ottawa Mint concentrates on producing collector and commemorative coins.

While the effigy of the reigning monarch has appeared on every Canadian coin produced since 1908, reverse designs have changed considerably over the years, with the Mint introducing commemorative designs, as well as designs that celebrate Canada's history, culture and values.

In 2004, the Royal Canadian Mint made history by issuing the world's first coloured circulation coin. The 25-cent coins were produced at the Mint's facility in Winnipeg and featured a red coloured poppy embedded in the centre of a Maple Leaf over a banner that read "Remember/Souvenir". In 2008 and 2010, the Mint produced two other 25-cent poppy circulation coins, both of which featured colour designs.

The Royal Wedding Coin is the most recent coloured coin to be minted for circulation – a 25-cent coin featuring a portrait of the young couple, with Prince William's profile in the foreground and his bride Catherine Middleton at his side.
