




DeWinton Preschool

Q: I bought a flat screen TV a few years ago and it came on a stand. Now I'm not sure I like the way that looks. Can you make it look better?


There are a few of things that drive me nuts about big TVs:

- 1. Hanging them too high on the wall
- 2. The big chunk of cables that hang out the back of the ever changing black boxes attached by umbilical.

Web World One Some Final Mobile Considerations (Part 4 of 4)

Looking at the previously discussed definitions and prompts for reporting insight will hopefully help you understand and decide if you want to have a mobile version of your website or adjust your current site for mobile friendliness.

So now you've got some decisions to make:

- Do I need a mobile version?
- Is imagery important for viewing or do I want a better gallery functionality or should I just disable the technology that doesn't work as well mobile?
- Do I want social media integration?
- Do I simply want to make mobile improvements to my existing site?
- Is my menu and navigation path clear enough when viewed mobile for my current site?

If you have a website that is 'all over the place' in regards to operation across devices, it may be time to start from scratch instead of trying to patch things with every device.

As a small business owner the entry into mobile can look daunting, but really it is not. Just remember, your mobile traffic is only as important as its relevancy to your business and its ability to satisfy the user's need, whatever that may be.

But don't hold back due to hesitation only out of the fact that it's an emerging trend. If someone said to you, "Leads are down 40% this year" - as a business owner, would you react?

Well 40% of your market might be mobile at the point of purchase decision. At the very least, get that reporting configured and emailed to you weekly to see where your traffic is trending so when you enter the mobile website market you are well informed. Configure it with drilled down dimensions.

At the end of the day, the mobile device is here to stay, so the next time you overhaul your site be sure you take into account its mobile functionality.

Hopefully these articles have helped arm you with at least some introductory knowledge into the mobile area.



QUESADILLA SALVADOREÑA COMMUNITY

This recipe originates from El Salvador, quesadilla is a fluffy, moist, sweet cheese pound cake.

- 1 cup rice flour (you can also use "Bisquick" baking mix)
- 1 cup white sugar
- 3/4 cup sour cream
- 4 oz. Parmesan cheese or queso duro
- 3 eggs, separated into yolks and whites
- 1 stick (4oz) melted, salted butter
- 1 tsp. baking powder

Sesame seeds to garnish top

Directions:

Beat egg whites until firm, but not stiff, and set aside. Beat sugar and butter on high until light and fluffy.

Add in egg yolks one at a time and beat well until creamy. Add in parmesan cheese little by little until well incorporated. Fold in sour cream and baking powder with a spatula. Sift rice flour over the mixture and use spatula to incorporate into mixture. Finally, fold in egg whites using the same spatula.

Pour batter into a 9"x13" rectangular glass baking dish. Sprinkle sesame seeds on top.

Place dish in oven and bake at 350 degrees for approximately 38 minutes or when a knife is inserted it comes out clean.

*It is great as breakfast bread with coffee.

Income Deferral & Income Tax Deductions/Credits (Part 1 of 2)

Income Deferral

Income tax deferral involves pushing current tax obligations to a future year. By doing so you are not only able to reduce your current annual tax bill and reap the benefits of the time value of money, but you may also be able to pay tax in the future, when your marginal tax rate may be lower.

Registered Accounts

Contributing to a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) (including a spousal RRSP) provides you with a tax deduction today and effectively defers the tax on the full amount of the contribution until the funds are withdrawn. RRSPs allow your investments to grow tax-free during your higher income working years. Then, during your retirement years, when you start withdrawing taxable income, you will likely be in a lower tax bracket since your income from all sources will likely be lower than during your working years.

Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA)

Since January 1, 2009, you have been able to use the TFSA to save \$5,000 (now, \$5500) per year for a variety of your short-term and long-term goals with the benefit of tax-free growth. The funds within the TFSA can grow sheltered from tax, however contributions are not tax deductible. This means your investment will be made with after-tax dollars, but the investment income earned and capital gains realized inside the TFSA will be sheltered from tax.

Non-Registered Accounts

Within your non-registered accounts, you should try to minimize the turnover of growth investments to defer tax. The more often you sell your investments, the more often you will trigger taxable capital gains. Furthermore, consider deferring the sale of a security with accrued capital gains to a year when your income will be lower or you have capital losses to offset the gains.

Certain investments, such as real estate investment trusts (REITs), royalty income trusts, as well as some mutual funds typically distribute a non-taxable return of capital payment to you. Return of capital distributions can be thought of as tax-deferred income because the distributions reduce the cost base of the investment for income tax purposes.

Tax Loss Selling

If your portfolio contains investments that have decreased in value, prior to the end of the calendar year, consider selling these investments to recognize a capital loss. This capital loss can be used to reduce capital gains realized in the current year or in the three previous taxation years. If you cannot use the losses in any of those years, you can carry-forward the losses indefinitely to be used against future capital gains.

Tax Shelters

There are certain investments which offer tax incentives, such as flow-through shares. Flow-through shares are offered by companies in the mining, oil and gas, and energy sectors to help finance their exploration and project development activities. The companies then renounce or "flow through" eligible expenses to you.

There once was a little boy who had a bad temper. His father gave him a bag of nails and told him that every time he lost his temper, he must hammer a nail into the back of the fence.

The first day the boy had driven 37 nails into the fence. Over the next few weeks, as he learned to control his anger, the number of nails hammered daily gradually dwindled down. He discovered it was easier to hold his temper than to drive those nails into the fence.

Finally the day came when the boy didn't lose his temper at all. He told his father about it and the father suggested that the boy now pull out one nail for each day that he was able to hold his temper. The days passed and the young boy was finally able to tell his father that all the nails were gone.

The father took his son by the hand and led him to the fence. He said, "You have done well, my son, but look at the holes in the fence. The fence will never be the same. When you say things in anger, they leave a scar just like this one. You can put a knife in a man and draw it out. It won't matter how many times you say I'm sorry, the wound is still there. A verbal wound is as bad as a physical one."

What did your pet eat today?

Veterinarians are amazed at the strings, clothes, inanimate objects, toys, and food parts we find inside your pet sometimes. Unfortunately some things a pet eats may lead to serious illness or worse death. I want to share just a few of things I and other veterinarians have seen ingested by your pets.

Typically a pet will come in to the vet because it's vomiting or not eating. After a physical examination and possibly blood work, the source of the problem may be isolated to the gastro-intestinal tract. A vet may ask to do further diagnostics, the most common being radiographs or x-rays, or may ask to ultrasound the pet's abdomen.

String or anything string-like can be the most difficult shape to diagnose in a pet because it doesn't cause a complete blockage and the line can act like a saw as the intestines move against it. I remember a dog that ate a cassette tape in his owner's car subsequently dying as the stretched tape acted like wire.

Cloth objects are also difficult to diagnose because they are radiolucent. That means x-rays pass through cloth

and don't stop to outline an object like they do with metal or stones. I have removed tea towels, stockings, socks, underwear, and carpet from intestines. I once gave a bulldog barium to outline an object in its stomach. I called the owner and said it looks like a stuffed horse, and the reply was "Oh, that's where that went!" The bulldog recovered after surgery.

There is a narrowing of the intestines where the small intestine enters the large intestine. I have found in various patients lodged there: a peach pit in a Labrador who ate it from a roadway ditch; a corn cob in another dog; and the knot from the end of hiking boot shoelaces a cat was playing with. Ferrets are notorious for playing and eating small objects and getting them stuck at that narrowing.

Remember the barbeque scraper and the drip pans filled with grease under the barbeque. An unsupervised retriever in the backyard considers those things appetizers. Ditto the remote control you were handling with hands covered with popcorn butter. Then there is the dog in the boat that eats the fishy wonderful hooks. I have removed needles, beer caps, and batteries from patients.

Today I removed garden stones from the stomach of a small shepherd with liver disease. Several years ago it was a liter of large stones from the stomach of a pregnant boxer. In both these cases the pets likely felt nauseated and ate something to try to relieve the discomfort, we call this pica.

Some of our veterinary journals invite veterinarians to submit copies of radiographs of some of the more impressive things pets have eaten. My two favorite pictures celebrate the snake's ability to unhinge its jaws and eat prey whole. One x-ray was of a snake that had swallowed another snake whole after it had in turn swallowed a mouse whole. There were three perfect skeletons superimposed over each other. The second xray showed about six intact light bulbs inside a snake. I'm sure that snake thought he had swallowed six lovely warm round bird eggs.

Diagnosis of what veterinarians refer to as "foreign objects" is complex and often limited by your imagination with the ultimate full recovery of your pet being the final goal of your veterinarian.
