One of the most difficult things a pet lover faces is watching our companions slowly deteriorate with the passage of time. There are some basic changes in the care of any elderly pet that will help to prolong and maintain their quality of life.

Diet is the cornerstone of any older pet's health needs. An older pet has a slower metabolism and sleeps more. Don't justify over feeding by saying "but treats are all he enjoys now". This is cruel and shortsighted. An obese pet has difficulty moving, arthritic joints have to work harder, and stress is placed on all organs including the heart, lungs, liver, and kidneys. It is easier if an animal is fit and not wheezing with exertion.

Slowly start to switch a pet to a geriatric diet around eight to ten years of age in cats and small dogs. Geriatric diets in large dogs should be introduced earlier depending on the breed and size of the animal. Specific diets have been formulated for the diseases older pets may suffer from including kidney, liver, and heart disease. Some diets include glucosamine and chondroitin for enhanced mobility with less discomfort in pets with arthritis. There is even a diet to try and slow the progress of canine cognitive dysfunction or senility in old dogs.

Unlimited water is imperative in the elderly pet. Kidneys are fragile. If your pet begins to drink and urinate excessively, consult your veterinarian. This is the first symptom of a number of serious, but often treatable, geriatric diseases.

Many people have had physiotherapy or tried alternative therapies for aches and pains. These therapies are equally beneficial to our pets. Old bodies get relief with heat packs, massage, range of motion exercises, and physiotherapy. Acupuncture, cranio-sacral therapy, chiropractic medicine, and numerous herbal and homeopathic formulas are used successfully to treat old joints, muscles and bone. Remember five or ten minutes gentle exercise three times daily is preferable to forty minutes of intense exercise with the exhausted older pet trailing behind. Like you they stiffen up and hurt! Also older pets do not tolerate extreme temperatures changes as well.

Because they don't exercise as much, older cats and dogs tend to need their nails trimmed more often. An older arthritic pet may find it more difficult to groom himself. Cats may not be able to contort themselves to reach places on their backs and hind end. Introduce regular grooming, gently combing out accumulations of dead hair. Older pets may become crankier if sore and more easily startled if their hearing and sight is failing. Try to make allowances, especially where children are involved, don't startle or pounce on elderly pets. Remember that old dog may need help getting in and out of your SUV.

Don't dismiss slowing down as the normal aging of an older pet. This may be a sign of pain. There are many anti-inflammatory and painkillers now on the market for older dogs and cats. These products prolong quality of life. If side effects are a problem try some of the alternative therapies.

Older pets deserve a comfortable and gentle retirement, but if all of your best efforts can no longer maintain your friend in a comfortable state and there are more sick painful days than not, consult your veterinarian. Knowing when to say good-bye is the least selfish thing you will ever do for an old dog or cat family member.

CREATING YOUR DESIGN STYLE TAKING THE CONFUSION OUT OF DESIGN SCHEMES

Last November and December I wrote about choosing your design style and your color scheme. These two elements are very important when you are decorating a home or room.

There are a lot of options available and many of my clients don't know where to start or how to put it all together.

When choosing the interior selections of a home I have to take into consideration all the architectural elements first, this will guide me in the direction of the colors I will choose and all the other design elements after that. The architectural elements of a home should flow from the inside to outside and vice versa. When decorating a whole home, it must be cohesive and complementary of all elements put into it. This is what is called harmony and this is what makes a good design.

And, this is where the confusion about color selections and elements occur. I have had many clients ask me to give them my advice on their selections. As a designer I know there are a myriad of choices out there, but I don't feel comfortable giving my opinion until I know my client's wants, needs, likes and dislikes. It would be like a doctor prescribing a medicine because the doctor likes it, without taking into account what is best for the patient.

My advice - there are no wrong choices; it is what you like that has to be considered first. The designer's job is to get to know your style and help steer you in the right direction.

Strawberries Dressed for Dessert

5 tablespoons	Grand Marnier liqueur	75 ml
2 teaspoons	sugar in the raw	10 g
1/8 teaspoon	freshly ground black pepper	.6 g
¼ cup	bittersweet chocolate, melted	60 g

Mix the first four ingredients in a bowl; cover with a lid or plastic wrap and let stand in the refrigerator for at least one hour before serving.

To serve, spoon equal portions of the marinated strawberries into martini glasses and then drizzle melted, bitter-sweet chocolate over each portion.

Voila! Dessert that's fresh and interesting to the palate.

Variation:

Use balsamic vinegar instead of Grand Marnier, and increase the sugar to $^{1\!\!4}$ cup / 60 ml.




