

Fire Bans in Rocky View County

At various times during the year, weather conditions dictate fire bans at certain levels. When a Burning or Fire Ban is issued it has a designated Level which carries specific restrictions. You will know if there is a Fire Ban because it is listed on the Alberta Fire Bans Website, and it will be posted on the County website. Fire bans also apply to Recreational Fire Pits. Level 1

Permit burning in the County is banned due to dry/ windy conditions. All outstanding burning permits are suspended until further notice. The exemptions to this fire ban are listed as follows:

- 1. Internal household fire places
- 2. Incinerators (for farm and acreage use)
- 3. Regulated burning barrels
- 4. Camp stoves
- 5. Solid fuel barbecues (charcoal briquettes)
- 6. Liquid fuel barbecues (propane and natural gas)
- 7. Recreational camp fires (approved burn pit 24" in diameter or less)
- 8. Chimeneas
- 9. Fires contained within approved facilities and appliances in designated camping and recreational areas
- 10.Oil well flaring must register with central fire dispatch at 403.264.1022

Permit 2

Rocky View County Sets **2013 Tax Rate**

(May 13, 2013) – Council has approved the Rocky View County 2013 tax rate bylaw, setting the property tax for residential and non-residential properties.

Property taxes in the County will increase by three per cent over 2012, a number in keeping with the County's 2011 to 2013 Corporate Strategy.

"Council committed to annual tax increases of no more than three per cent throughout our entire term," said Reeve Rolly Ashdown. "We've worked hard with Administration to keep costs down, and we've made some very difficult decisions, but we have kept our promise to taxpayers."

Ashdown says Rocky View County tax rates compare very favourably to neighbouring communities, and particularly to Calgary.

"Calgary's taxes have increased by about seven per cent more than Rocky View's over the past three years. I think the residents of the County can be very pleased with the efficiency of their municipal government."

The actual taxes a property owner pays may go up or down depending on any changes to the property's value from the 2012 assessment. Rocky View County's manager of Business Services, Barry Woods, says work is progressing on rebalancing taxes between residential and nonresidential properties.

"We are adjusting our tax split to gradually move more onto non-residential properties, while still continuing to be a great place to do business," Woods says. "We have low tax rates and exceptional water and wastewater infrastructure in place for those who do business in Rocky View."

Rocky View County will soon mail out tax bills to all property owners. The bills will include taxes for the Alberta School Foundation Fund and the Rocky View Seniors Foundation, but the County does not set those rates. School taxes are expected to rise, while the assessment for the seniors foundation is expected to drop slightly.

reading on the Road



Do you have an RRSP? Are you planning for the future? How long do you plan on working? These are the questions my son asked me the other day. How does he even know what an RRSP is? Why is he, at 12 years old, planning his future now?

It wasn't until years after I moved out of my parents' house that I realized I needed to be safe with my money. And it wasn't until I had my children that I even knew what an RRSP was.

When I was a child, we did not discuss money or bills. We didn't talk to our parents about the mortgage and the cost of running a home. It was taboo. When asked how much money my Dad made at his job, he would say, "That's none of your business. I make enough to put food on the table and clothes on your backs." Indeed he did. I don't think my parents ever planned ahead. When high school finished and college applications were in front of us, it was then that Dad confessed he didn't have enough for my college tuition. He didn't think his children needed college, so he didn't save.

I remember bill collectors calling and notices in the mail from companies demanding money. We were not poor, by any means. They were slow at paying bills because of their lack of budgeting. I guess my parents did not speak to their parents about money and financial matters. In a financial sense, it was a nightmare. They ruined their credit and it took years to correct.

I will always keep those childhood days in mind when I prepare our monthly budgets. I never want to receive those nasty phone calls or rude letters. And, to be honest, I am happy my son is so interested in our family financial situation. It shows he's mature and is thinking of his future. Every few weeks, to put his mind at ease, I show him our paystubs and a list of all the bills we need to pay. I'm glad he's thinking of our future.
