# The Moody Blues

For some, the holidays are a time of happiness. For others, they can be a trigger for moodiness and despair. Whether you are happy or not this time of year, moods affect all of us at one time or another, so let's learn how to combat them!

I used to be moody. It wouldn't take much for someone to push my buttons. I was never nasty or outwardly argumentative, but I could easily sink into quietness while I seethingly pondered how someone could be so insensitive!

This is so common. It's called touchiness or oversensitivity, and is a form of self-pity that causes much unnecessary pain.

Most people are unaware when they've slipped into a mood. Let's describe it. Someone criticizes you and you feel yourself getting defensive. That's a mood. Your least favorite person enters the room and you feel immediately irritated. You get the picture. Sometimes we shift through the day from mood to mood. It's so unhealthy.

The first step is to become aware. Our knee-jerk reaction is often to try and change the other person or rearrange things so that everything is the way we want it. Usually, this causes more trouble.

If something bothers you, it's a trigger. Immediately introspect: "Why does this bother me? What desire do I have that isn't being met?" If you're spiritually inclined, this is also the time to pray for help in overcoming the mood. You'll find amazing results if you're sincere.

Another nugget, try this affirmation: "Change no circumstance in my life, change me." Truly mean it. Put the behavior of the other person completely out of your mind and say to yourself: "How should / behave?" then put all your attention there.

Moods can be beaten. I have proven so in my own life.

Hello Neighbours.

I have always preferred the term 'neighbourhood' to 'community'. I believe that a neighbourhood is not only the physical space that we inhabit - it is also the relationship between the people that live there and the businesses and institutions that operate there. By fostering and growing great neighbourhoods we ultimately build a great city - a city that is more equitable, more economically resilient and diverse, and, overall, a city that is better equipped to handle the challenges that we face in this complex world.

The strategic plan that I wrote, and ultimately guides my work, is called Great Neighbourhoods. Point two of Great Neighbourhoods demands local governance transformation and clearly articulates the importance of this resident-business-institution triad. The goal of this point is to build on the incredible strength of Calgary's culture of volunteerism, neighbourhood activism, and local governance found in our community associations, and transform them into "next generation" organizations where the rich mix of residents, businesses and institutions that make our neighbourhoods what they are, can meet, and work together to make our neighbourhoods what we want them to be.

I am extremely pleased that this work is starting to be done through the Community Representation Framework (CRF) Task Force. Its mandate is to offer strategic advice on the development of a framework for inputs into decision-making that have traditionally been provided by organized community groups on matters related to community-building. The framework will clarify the role of organized community groups and maximize relevant and sustainable public benefit through all stages of a community's evolution to ensure complete communities. At the Organizational Meeting of Council held on October 24. Council amended the Terms of Reference for the CRF Task Force to include four Councillors, rather than two, along with 11 other representatives from stakeholder groups, demonstrating the weight and importance of this work. I am honoured and privileged to be one of those Councillors.

So why does this matter to you? This brings government closer to the people. It strengthens our neighbourhoods' ability to engage the City and build the spaces that we want to live in. This is not a 'one-size-fits-all' approach but something that understands and celebrates the uniqueness of each of our neighbourhoods. I am excited to sink my teeth into this work and help strengthen our great neighbourhoods.

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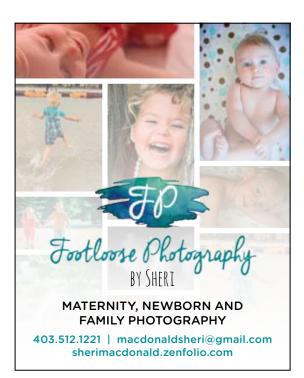
