In December, the community association renewed our 15 year license of occupation with the City of Calgary, the legal agreement between the City and the LBCA that permits the community association to occupy city land. Called "LOC" for short, the renewed license gives our community assurance that we can continue to locally own and operate our buildings for many years to come.

We're often asked who owns the Recreation Centre on Acadia Drive and the Field House on Lake Bonavista Drive (next to Andrew Sibbald School). The community association owns these buildings and manages them on behalf of LBCA members. The neighbourhood lakes and their lands are separate entities and operate outside the scope of the LBCA.

The City of Calgary owns the land our buildings sit on, as well as the adjacent parking lots and green spaces. Our renewed LOC defines this rather unique relationship between the community association *as property owner* and the City *as land owner*.

In the 1970s, the recreation centre and field house were constructed by our land developer and local residents using a mixture of funding, including grants, bingos, Bonafund debentures and donations. For the last 30+ years, the Boards of Directors and our employees have managed these facilities, providing programs, services, events and rentals.


The License of Occupation contains maps defining the lands the community association is responsible for and details several requirements of the City, including the need to:

- Maintain the land and facilities
- Submit audited financial statements
- Submit proof of filing with the Province's Corporate Registry
- Obtain approval to complete capital improvements with a cost exceeding \$50,000
- Obtain approval for third party sub-leases

- Obtain sufficient insurance
- Complete a Business Plan within one year of entering into agreement, and every five years thereafter
- Complete and submit a new Lifecycle Study every five years
- Meet with liaison minimum of twice per year
- Adhere to the Public Use Policy

While you're tapping, repeat your thought-changing affirmations, visualize your desired outcome, and overcome your limiting beliefs in just minutes. It's that simple!

Tapping can be done anytime, anywhere, for fast selfreprogramming results in any area of your life that needs a boost



Which Fears to Address First?

Many of us hold fears around various areas: fear of rejection, fear of being alone, fear of failure, fear of success, fear of pain, fear of poverty, etc. So where do you start?

Typically – and this may vary for you – fear of not being good enough, fear of failure, and fear of rejection are the three biggest fears that people have. Just pick an area of your life where you are struggling (wealth, health, relationships, or career/purpose) and focus on that one area. Targeting one area helps you focus on systematically solving one problem at a time. You may have a lot of crossover fear – for example, fear of not being good enough can manifest in all four life areas so addressing that fear in one area will create a ripple effect of improvement in other areas.

The Sequence

MIND, BODY, SPIRIT

2. Next, perform the "negative tapping sequence" where the current situation is stated clearly and the source of the fear is identified, while gently tapping

- 7-10 times on each meridian point. Tap the:
- eyebrow
- side of eye
- under eye
- under nose
- chin
- collarbone
- under arm
- top of head

It's important to focus your mind on the negative thought patterns that are causing a problem in your life. This is the process of **releasing the negative thought patterns by becoming aware of them** and acknowledging that they are not doing you any good but that they have been a part of your life for some time.

- 3. The negative tapping sequence is followed by tapping each meridian point 7-10 times while simultaneously repeating a different phrase for each point. This is the process of installing new thought patterns.
- 4. The exercise finishes with a deep breath to help move energy throughout the body. You may feel a huge release immediately or within minutes. You may feel physically unwell for a short time as the emotional toxins work their way out of your body. You may feel euphoric or sad. Whatever you feel is right and normal for you, as your body and mind process the experience.

In many cases, a single treatment addresses many issues. Even the most stubbornly-held beliefs and damaging phobias can be released in minutes; other complex fears may take time, as they may consist of several interrelated fears that all need to be addressed.

You'll experience a huge motivational boost as you immediately feel the effects of Tapping and as those effects begin to manifest in your actions and your speech!

Greetings Ward 14!

Great news! You have an extra day in February! I'll be making sure that the City is using that extra day and the other 365—wisely, and I want to mention a couple of ways we'll be doing. Let's leap right in to it.

LED Streetlights in Ward 14

The lights we use to brighten our streets at night have a huge impact on this city, and not just in terms of better visibility. They require us to produce energy, they can cause light pollution, and they often need to be replaced. I am happy to say that in 2015 we began retrofitting streetlights for new light emitting diode (LED) bulbs, and will continue into 2018 until the retrofitting of 80,000 streetlights is complete. They will be replacing the high pressure sodium lights that the City has been using for some time now. The financial benefits of the project are clear. With all the lights installed we expect to save \$1 million annually on maintenance costs, and \$5 million in annual electricity costs. But there are also some benefits that are not as easily represented in a financial statement. They will reduce energy consumption by up to 50% the equivalent of powering 2,820 homes per year and will drastically reduce light pollution. I think you'll find you'll be able to see better too.

The LED streetlights are coming to Ward 14 very soon. Silverado is scheduled for retrofitting during the first quarter of 2016, and the rest of Ward 14 will be done during the third and fourth quarters. Let me know what you think of them!

Interactive Parks and Roads Map

As I write this just a little before Christmas, the Roads department, Parks department, and I are hoping for some snow to test a project that we have been working on. We had an exceptional amount of snow during the winter of 2013/2014, and we learned many things from the experience. Based on people's comments to my office, the lack of communication between the City's crews and its headquarters became very apparent. A highlighted map was literally the only way for us to know what had been cleared and what had not.

The result of our work will be real-time information not only on what roads and pathways have been cleared of snow, but eventually what parks have been mowed as well. It will be available to the public in an online map made possible with GPS outfitted equipment. It is a significant step forward in the level of service that we provide citizens. All we need are two significant snowfalls to test the system out. Hopefully we will have had them by the time you read this.




