# MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

#### Board Motion Made on Cell Tower Proposal

On November 18th, the Board of Directors met and reviewed feedback regarding a cell tower proposal from Wind Mobile. Approximately two dozen members of the community attended the meeting and took part in the discussion. Overall, the majority of the feedback in Lake Bonavista was against a new cell tower being constructed on LBCA leased land. There was also concern expressed about the potential for new cell towers to be built in other parts of the community, even though this is outside the control of the community association. The Board voted unanimously to oppose construction of any cell tower in the community of Lake Bonavista. This means there will be no cell tower built at the recreation centre. At the meeting, it was also decided that letters would be written to key stakeholders in the community, such as local stores and churches, to let them know the LBCA is against new cell tower construction throughout the neighbourhood.

We have had an excellent season so far. However, following the great Olympic curling, we again look forward to the next season.





#### Board Motion Made on Cell Tower Proposal

On November 18th, the Board of Directors met and reviewed feedback regarding a cell tower proposal from Wind Mobile. Approximately two dozen members of the community attended the meeting and took part in the discussion. Overall, the majority of the feedback in Lake Bonavista was against a new cell tower being constructed on LBCA leased land. There was also concern expressed about the potential for new cell towers to be built in other parts of the community, even though this is outside the control of the community association. The Board voted unanimously to oppose construction of any cell tower in the community of Lake Bonavista. This means there will be no cell tower built at the recreation centre. At the meeting, it was also decided that letters would be written to key stakeholders in the community, such as local stores and churches, to let them know the LBCA is against new cell tower construction throughout the neighbourhood.

#### **CREATE A LIFE PLAN**

You have the power to improve your relationships right now. This process begins with improving the relationship with yourself. Draw up a one or two year life plan just for yourself (not your mate or family members). Spend at least 30 minutes dreaming about how you'd like to fill your time, where you'd like to go, whom you'd like to be with, and so on.

#### **CREATE AN ENERGY BUDGET**

Draw up a balance sheet with one column listing the activities that rejuvenate you and the other listing activities that drain you. Then make a daily expenditure plan that tips the balance in favor of rejuvenation. Commit to engaging at least one activity per week that is pleasurable to you- regardless of what your family members think of it. Understand that this is a process, not a destination. It will take time for you and your family members to adjust.

# MAINTAIN A RELATIONSHIP WITH YOUR OWN CREATIVITY AND PLEASURE

Keep your mind engaged. Don't allow your mind and your creative pleasure to wither or permit your true self to get lost in the daily grind of living. #### DON'T WORRY WHAT OTHERS THINK OF YOU

Be who you are and say what you feel because those who mind don't matter and those who matter don't mind. – Dr. Seuss

• Fear of social judgment wears many masks: shame, shyness, etiquette, prudence, perfectionism. Whatever form it comes in, its impact is to limit, to constrain, to constrict.

• People who fear social judgment miss out on much of life. Across the room they see what could be the per-

son of their dreams, but they don't approach because of what a roomful of strangers might think if they're rejected. By caring what these strangers think, they're allowing people they'll never see again to control their behavior.

 Fear of social judgment also makes people think small. Accomplishing anything big is going to annoy some people, who will try to deter you. To really have an impact, you can't let them get in your way.

 Why are we so concerned about what others think of us? As with so much else, we inherited this trait from our ancestors. The ancient world that shaped your genes was one of small hunter-gatherer tribes. Everyone in the tribe knew each other and built their lives together. Survival and reproduction were all that mattered, so people did whatever it took to stay alive and get the best mates they could. Status was pursued, authority was revered, and group cohesion trumped individuality, so fitting in and being liked were essential.

- These innate tendencies that served your ancestors so well do not serve you in our modern world. You can choose what tribes to belong to, and what roles to play in each. If you mess up with one group, it rarely affects your status in others. And you have far more potential romantic partners to choose from now than your ancestors did, and if you're rejected by one it rarely affects your chances with others.
- More importantly, while your brain is wired for survival and reproduction, you can choose to focus on other priorities. Survival is easy now, and reproduction is just one part of a well-lived life, to be weighed in the balance with other things you may choose to value, like happiness, meaning, beauty, or justice. Focusing on other values may help you worry less about what other people think.
- When you stop trying to impress others, you can express your true self more fully and connect with people, more genuinely, openly, intimately. The less time and energy you spend on image management, on making your life presentable to others, the more time you can spend on things that really matter.

### How can you stop worrying about what people think of you?

1. Bring awareness to how your decisions are currently affected by what others will think of you.

- 2. Be unswayed by social pressure, unaffected by criticism, immune to embarrassment. And take fewer things personally.
- 3. Don't look to others for guidance on how to behave. And don't wait for permission from others. It's easier to get forgiveness than permission.
- 4. Don't be needy. If you don't need anything, you don't have a reason to try to impress people.
- 5. Be authentic. Have the courage to allow people to see the real you.
- 6. Be willing to be judged, and even encourage it. It's good for self-knowledge and for developing thick skin. As you become and express your best self, others will think great things about you, and the few that don't, won't matter anyway.
- 7. If all this is too extreme for you, start by taking small steps. Expect it to be hard, and show yourself some compassion; you're swimming against ancient currents thousands of generations old. Rather than not caring at all what others think of you, start by just caring less. Be open to what they think and feel, and consider their opinions, but decide for yourself how to act. Care what the important people in your life think, but only those whose opinions you value. Strangers should not get a vote in how you live your life.



# Are You a "Hands-on" Investor?

The investment world can be complex — so you may not want to navigate it alone. But when it comes to getting professional advice, you certainly have an abundance of choices. How can you know which approach is right for you?

The answer depends, to a large extent, on how you choose to work with a qualified financial advisor — someone with the training and experience to help you work toward your financial goals. For example, if your portfolio has become overweighted in a specific asset class, such as stocks or bonds, and is no longer aligned with your goals, it may automatically be brought back into balance.

No matter what your 2015 was like, I hope your 2016 is even better. This year a Ward 14 tradition will be getting a fresh start—or a fresh name at least.

#### Counciltalk

Aldertalk finally has a name that fits with the title of Councillor. I've had reservations about leaving the old name behind. It fit so perfectly. But Aldertalk is a name for an Alderman, and I am a Councillor now. Counciltalk is a name for a Councillor.

I will now be using the name Counciltalk when referring to my monthly discussions, and if you have never attended one I sincerely hope that you will join on at least one occasion in 2016. In short, it is a chance to sit down with me—and your neighbours from around Ward 14—to talk about whatever municipally related topic you choose. It has become so popular that even some other Councillors are implementing their own versions of the idea.

It is very fitting that the first Counciltalk session will take place in Parkland. It was at the Parkland Community Hall on January 14, 2012 that a group of Ward 14 residents gathered for the very first Aldertalk. Since then residents of Ward 14 have been joining me regularly to engage in meaningful dialogue.

I want people to feel like they can always communicate with me. Aldertalk has been a powerful tool in my strategy for ensuring that they can. Because of the generosity of Ward 14's community associations it is also a low-cost tool. It is held about six months out of the year, and rotates location between communities in Ward 14. People only have to go as far as their local community hall to speak with me, but have been known to travel much further. We sit in a round-table configuration and go through each attendee individually to discuss the topic of their choice.

The 2016 Counciltalk season will begin in Parkland on January 16. It will be at the Parkland Community Hall (505 Parkvalley Road SE). The discussion will run from noon to 2.p.m., but I would love to have you there at noon so that we can get a head start on things, and so you are assured of some coffee.
