



Neighbour disputes: keeping the peace

Your home is your castle – a place to relax and enjoy. But what if your haven is disturbed by a dispute with a neighbour?

Neighbour disputes can be tricky to handle and frustrating. So what can you do to bring peace to your neighbourhood again?

Talk to them. Talking is often the best way to address concerns or clear up misunderstandings. Things like letters, emails and text messages can often be misunderstood or misinterpreted. When done in a polite and respectful manner, talking can resolve the majority of problems.

Mediation. Did you know that The City of Calgary offers a free mediation service? If talking with your neighbour doesn't work, consider involving an unbiased mediator to help resolve the conflict. Anyone can access this free mediation service: Community Mediation Calgary Society

Contact your Community Resource Officer. If you have exhausted all other options, involving police directly is another way to help resolve the conflict. Contact the Community Resource Officer in your area for consultation. Please note that police will start with mediation with the intention of coming to a resolution that works for both parties.

For any situation that results in a crime-in-progress or threat of physical violence, call 9-1-1.

More Do's and Don'ts

Please consider some actions can often prove to be counterproductive and make things worse. Police do not recommend confronting a neighbour in a hostile, demeaning or accusatory manner, or engaging in behaviour to 'teach the other person a lesson.' Repeatedly contacting Calgary Police or Bylaw for non-criminal matters (i.e. bylaw infractions that would otherwise go unreported/unnoticed) is not a good use of resources and often has the opposite effect.

Remember, most people will judge others by their actions, while judging themselves by their intentions.

Many potential issues with neighbours can be avoided by establishing positive relationships early on. Though not everybody need be 'friends', basing a relationship on friendly terms can be beneficial in both the short and long term.

Aside from preventing future conflict, knowing your neighbours is an easy, practical and effective method of deterring crime in both your immediate neighbourhood and the larger community.


St. Bonaventure School



Giving People a Voice in Mental Health Research

The Mental Health Commission of Canada reports that in a given year, one in five people in Canada experiences a mental health problem or illness. In Alberta, that's more than 675,000 people.

Researchers and clinicians in the province recognize the need to learn more about mental health, but realize most research topics are chosen by the researcher, not the people living with mental illness. A new study partly funded by Alberta Innovates (previously Alberta Innovates – Health Solutions) is changing that. This fall, the Alberta Depression Research Priority Setting Project surveyed people who have experienced depression, as well as their clinicians and caregivers, to pinpoint gaps in current research.

"Someone with lived experience will likely have a different perspective than someone doing the research," explains Robbie Babins-Wagner, PhD, a professor at the University of Calgary Faculty of Social Work and a member of the project's advisory group.

Researchers are analyzing the survey answers to better understand the needs of people who experience depression. And what they find will shape research to help meet their needs. "This will allow the voice of people living with and caring for mental illness to influence research projects," adds Babins-Wagner.

ICE SAFETY

With spring around the corner, now is a good time to ensure that you and your family continue to be safe when it comes to rivers, community lakes, storm ponds, or waterways.

Every year 25-30 Canadians die in ice related incidents, and countless others fall through ice and have a close brush with death.

Some tips to remember:

- Always keep a safe distance from riverbanks and lakeshores to avoid accidentally falling through the ice.
- Don't walk on ice-covered bodies of water, including storm ponds. It's difficult to assess the thickness of the ice and its ability to hold the weight of a person or animal.
- If a person or an animal falls through ice into water, call 9-1-1. Do not attempt to rescue them yourself. Encourage the person to kick and pull themselves up onto the ice and roll, rather than walk, towards the shore.
- For outdoor skating, only skate on open ice surfaces specifically designated for skating , and on City of Calgary or community rinks; for locations visit http://www.calgary.ca/CSPS/Parks/Pages/Locations/Out-door-skating-rinks.aspx

What to do if you fall through ice into water

- Stay calm and try to keep your head out of the water and control your breathing.
- Try to pull yourself up onto the ice and on your stomach then, roll towards the shore, where the ice may be thicker.
- If you can't get out of the water in less than 10 minutes, stop kicking and trying to pull yourself out, and anchor yourself to the ice shelf. Continue to call for help.

If you do witness a person falling through the ice,

Stay back, do not go onto the ice and call 9-1-1.

HOW DO INTEREST RATES INFLUENCE Your investment choices?

Suzanne Smith-Demers – Consultant Interest rates have a wide impact on the economy with a direct impact on your investments and on your investment choices.

Lowering interest rates

- Make it possible to borrow money at extremely attractive interest rates.

Low interest rates

The White-Faced Ibis is a medium sized, dark wading bird, with long dark legs and a long, downward curving bill. Its plumage is dark chestnut in colour, with a purple and green glossy look during the breeding season. Breeding adults have a bare pinkish face in front of the eyes, bordered with white feathers and red eyes. In the non-breeding season, the White-Faced Ibis appears as a much more drab brown bird with dark wings.

Fun Facts:

• This South American native that had its first confirmed sighting in southeast Alberta in 1974.

- Most of its kind lives in the United States, Central America and the southern half of South America. For the winter this unusual visitor migrates to find warmth in the southern United States.
- The conditions found in that corner of the province were sufficient to attract a small but consistent number of breeding pairs. This bird is considered to be an isolated breeder in the province, separated from other populations, which are breeding further south on the continent.
- This bird's sickle shaped bill is ideal for foraging for its favourite foods. It pokes its bill down into water and mud to find insects, leeches, snails and earthworms, and also fish, crayfish, newts and frogs.
- The White-Faced Ibis chooses to nest in marshy areas where there is dense vegetation such as reeds, cattails and bulrushes and builds its nest from the stalks of these plants.
- The White-Faced Ibis lays a clutch of 3 or 4 green-blue eggs.
- The White-Faced Ibis will live about nine years.

White-Faced Ibis populations have shown modest growth in some areas of North America over the years. However, they face many threats from human activities:

Many individuals are not aware of the services that our office is able to assist with. Please use me and my staff as a community resource and information hub. I would encourage you to fill out the comment card on the newsletter to give us an indication of what matters most to you. There is not a lot of space for feedback, so I would encourage you to send an email, make a call, write a letter or come into the office to give greater detail on issues of importance to you. We all need to have a voice in our communities and in our province.

Education:

Much has been discussed recently regarding education curriculum and funding of public vs. independent schools. My children have gone through the public system here in Calgary. I am a strong advocate for a great public system. With this said, I also feel that the public system cannot meet the needs of all students and other options need to be available. Choice in our education system is paramount for a strong public and independent system. All who pay property taxes, pay an education portion to the Alberta Government regardless of whether you have children in the system or not. All of us benefit from an educated population. As everyone contributes, I feel that continuing to fund independent schools is important in meeting the needs of a diverse student population, Strengthening resources in the public system is also in some ways achieved by savings in capital and per student funding of independent schools. Should Calgary Bid on the 2026 Winter Olympics


