Prince of Wales School

Parents and students showed their appreciation during the last week of April for the dedication, commitment and hard work of the staff of Prince of Wales school (POW). A big round of applause to the more than 30 people at POW who contribute to the top-quality education delivered to the students each day at school. POW parents appreciate the teachers and support staff every day, but dedicate a week each year to make the staff feel special with games, lots of food, and other tributes.

The generosity and empathy of POW students shone in April and May with the grade two students taking the lead in a fundraising effort to support the community of Kugaaruk, Nunavut. The grade two students were learning about communities across Canada. As they explored ways of life in the Arctic, they were sad to learn that a fire had devastated the community school in Kugaaruk. Not just a center for education, the Kugaaruk school served as the community center. It included an arena, breakfast and lunch program, and space for special events. After exploring how to best support this community, the grade two POW students developed a noon-hour intramural indoor hockey program with participation from other grades based on donations. Fundraisings efforts resulted in an amazing \$750.

The POW team has continued its preparations for the families from Legacy who will join the POW community in September. In April, Legacy families were invited to an evening open house, and in May, students were able to visit POW during the school day and get to know the classrooms and teachers.

As summer approaches, so too is the end of the school year. Students and teachers will spend June wrapping up their lessons and some lucky students will have the opportunity to experience outdoor field trips.

Andrew Sibbald School

In the past two months, our school has undergone exciting updates to its interior: a fresh coat of paint, an updated colour scheme and the creation of a new school logo which has been added to our entryway and gymnasium.

Over the past few weeks students have been busy in their third round of Sibbald U courses which are a variety of special courses that multi-aged groups (K-4) participate in each week. Course options include: Kids Café (cooking), Pottery, Mad Science, Design 2.0, Ukulele, Stem Challenges, Computer Coding, and Finding Fairies.

Field trips, off site experiences, hands on learning and connecting with parents and local experts are an important part of creating a rich experience at Andrew Sibbald. This spring, our students connected with nature by growing plants from seed using soil and lights, as well as a Tower Garden. In May, students in K-2 reared butterflies in the classroom, and then released them when they were ready. In addition, our Start Smart, Stay Safe (S4) Calgary Police Service representative, Constable Baker, was a quest speaker in all of the classrooms speaking on various topics that helped build an awareness of making positive choices and contributing to a safe and caring school community. As well, our Kindergarten students had a guest speaker from the Calgary Fire Department and also walked to the fire station for a tour.

During the months of April and May our students participated in various experiences such as community walks where they explored and connected to the neighbourhood, local businesses or Fish Creek Provincial Park. In April students in Grades 3 and 4 went to the Inglewood Bird Sanctuary and in May headed to Fish Creek Park for a week of Forest School. In May our whole school participated in an Adventure Running program held at Fish Creek Park where students navigated through various stations. In June, our Grade 1 and 2 students will be heading to the Calgary Zoo and our Kindergarten students will be going to the Calgary Corn Maze.

For over a decade the Andrew Sibbald School community has come together to create awareness about childhood cancer and raise money for Kids Cancer Care. On May 11th, our school community had many students who participated by shaving their head or chopping their ponytail during our Shave Your Lid for a Kid event. Our students did an amazing job of raising money for this important event.

Andrew Sibbald is the designated public school for students living in Lake Bonavista and Bonavista Downs. We will be a K-5 school in the upcoming school year, and will expand to include grade 6 the following year. We continue to accept Kindergarten registrations for the upcoming school year. We are excited to announce that we have a service provider offering before and after school care for students in Kindergarten within our school. Affirmation Techniques

There are a number of different techniques you can use to make your affirmations as powerful as possible. The goal with affirmations is to feel the truth in the statement you are affirming. Affirmations are reminders of the beliefs and values you want to live your life from. The more consistently you live from a place of affirmation, the more effortless habits and behaviors that support your goals become.

Try a variety of the techniques below to see what feels the most authentic and effective to you.

Writing Affirmations

Writing your affirmations down adds power and action energy to what you are saying. The goal when writing affirmations is to make the words that you are using meaningful enough to evoke the feelings you desire to feel when your affirmation manifests.

Repeat, Repeat, Repeat

Say your affirmations as often as you can. Each time you notice that you have slipped into old limiting, negative patterns of thinking, acknowledge your thoughts, and replace them with an affirmation. If you write them to be short and easy to remember repeating affirmations this way can quickly become habit.

You can post your affirmations to your fridge, car, bathroom mirror, anywhere that will prompt you to remember to take a moment to affirm the reality you are stepping into.

Visualization and Affirmations

Visualization and Affirmations are closely related. The more real we can make our affirmations, the easier it is for our minds to embrace how true they are. There are two main ways to visualize and increase the potency of your affirmations:

1. Visualize a natural image that compliments the statements you are making. For instance, for abundance, picture millions of stars in the sky, billions of grains of sand in a desert or countless drops of water in a waterfall. This gives your mind concrete examples that abundance in our natural state of being.

It makes it more difficult for your mind to contradict abundance because this is showing that abundance does exist.

2. Visualize the outcome you would like to experience as a result of the affirmation. Include all of your senses in the affirmation. What will this reality look like? Taste like? Sound like? Smell like? Feel like? This is an easy way to get your feelings engaged with your affirmations. As you immerse yourself in your visualization, your feelings will bubble up to create the energy needed to bring about this new reality.

Write an Affirmation Letter

Sometimes you may find that your mind wanders when you try to focus on a goal just in your mind. Writing an affirmation letter can assist in generating the focus and details needed to create a new reality. There are many different types of letters you can write. Few examples below;

- Write a letter to the Universe explaining what you would like to contribute to the world.
- Write down what your ideal day would look like from sunrise to sunset.
- Write a letter to your self explaining why it has been hard to achieve a goal. You might be very surprised about what comes out.
- Write a letter to someone you admire about what qualities of theirs you would like to incorporate into your life.

Get Creative

Putting your affirmations into a picture or other work of art can be a tremendous way to add energy to your affirmations. Our actions on the physical plane have the most energy of anything we think or feel. That is why cooking dinner creates a meal quicker than thinking about dinner. Similarly, putting creative energy into your desires through action can jumpstart your motivation quicker than just thinking and speaking affirmations alone. Creative projects can include:

- Painting or drawing your ideal life or a symbol for your ideal life.
- Create a vision board or book.
- Compose a piece of music.
- Physically plant your dream in your yard & watch it grow.

"Above all, practice being loyal to your Soul"

Smile

Smiling while you are saying affirmations brings fourth positive feelings almost immediately. You will be amazed at what a great mood you will be in when you start smiling.

Feel the Energy Within

Eckhart Tolle presents a wonderful exercise in his book A New Earth. He asks his readers to feel the vibration in their hands. Take a moment now to sense if you can consciously feel the presence and vibration of your hands. To me, it feels almost like a light buzzing all throughout the inside of my palms and fingers. You can sense the same thing in your legs, torso, head, all over. This exercise is a wonderful reminder that we all creative energy. The energy that will create our desires is what moves within us now. It is powerful enough to power our body and it is powerful enough to change any circumstance we so desire.

Take a Walk

Before or during your affirmations, walking in nature can be an inspiring act. Notice all of the miracles that surround you while you are walking. The colors and shapes of trees and flowers are beyond a doubt divinely created. Take the time to notice the precision and creativity in nature. Know that the force that guides each tree and flower while it is growing is the same force that is guiding your life.

Listen to Music

Music as an affirmation technique is a sure fire way to get your emotions roused toward your intentions. You can say your affirmations before or during a piece of music and then let the music carry your feelings into your new reality. Music is wonderful because it gives your mind something to focus on rather than wander. Let yourself sink into the melody, and with your eyes closed, let the music become the soundtrack to your new life.

Meditate

One of the frustrations with our minds is that we have a conscious mind and a unconscious mind. It is harder to influence our unconscious mind, and typically, that is the portion of our minds that controls the out-picturing of our reality. Change would be lightening quick if we only had to consciously choose to believe something. For change to really occur, you need to influence your unconscious mind. One way to accomplish this is through meditation. Meditating gives your mind a break from the steady stream of thoughts so that you can get in touch with the more intuitive and influential part of yourself.

If you allow time to meditate before saying your affirmations, your conscious mind will have stopped (or slowed) its barrage of thoughts so that the message you are instilling can get through to your subconscious and implant the new belief. There are numerous ways to meditate including:

- Counting count up, count down, count 1 to 10, count at each inhalation and each exhalation.
- Meditate on a single word: peace, love, abundance, prosperity, joy...
- Watch your body watch your breath move in & out of your lungs.
- Move through your body feeling the Universe vibrate within.
- Use a guided meditation CD.
- Meditate on your specific affirmation repeat it over & over again.
- Focus on a single object.

Learning to meditate is a process. Our conscious minds do not easily release us from the grip of non-stop thinking. In the beginning, it is especially important to pick a meditation that gives your conscious mind something to focus on. If your mind does wander, do not judge yourself, just observe your mind jump around & slowly guide it back to your focus point or saying.





June is upon us and another school year is coming to an end. Graduation is a milestone for many as the pinnacle of high school or a post-secondary experience. It is always a privilege to attend graduation ceremonies and it is a highlight to see young adults launching into a new chapter of their lives

Often in the Legislature, Bills can be controversial, but this spring I was proud to lead the charge amongst opposition parties in raising awareness on Labour Code and Employment Standards consultation. We felt it necessary to take a stand and demand additional time for employers and employees to provide feedback on the far-reaching consequences of changes in legislation for every working Albertan. How we are employed, and under what rules, matters to both business and employees alike. All of us want to have safe and healthy workplaces. Understanding the costs, implications and consequences of legislation requires more than just a short on-line survey or invitation-only engagement sessions.

On the topic of workplace safety, I attended with students, staff, and parents at Dr. E. P. Scarlett High School a presentation around rights and responsibilities that we all have for the safety of ourselves and co-workers. Calgary-Fish Creek resident Julie Hamilton was able to share her message on the importance of worksite safety through her "Missing Tim" initiative on National Day of Mourning. Julie lost her dear son Tim, a Scarlett Grad, to a workplace accident that was 100% preventable. Julie presented her story to hundreds of students to create awareness on what guestions to ask on the job site, and to give the students "permission" to walk away from unsafe work. My thanks to Julie for sharing her emotional and heartfelt message in which her loss may give others the chance to avoid life-threatening risk. Everyone deserves to go home safely to their family after a good day's work.

As many start to contemplate summer adventures, I would like to highlight two important tools to make your travels safer. Most of us have smartphones and it is hard for many to imagine life without them. Although technology can be challenging, it also provides us with opportunities for greater public safety. There are two phone APPS developed to improve the lives of everyday Albertans: **511** and **Alberta Emergency Alerts**. Both 511 and Alberta Emergency Alert are available free of charge. 511 is Alberta's Official Road Report. There is a wealth of real time information and there are constant updates on visibility, road construction, as well as many other items. 511 can also be monitored through Twitter, so if you do not have the app and have questions regarding specific road conditions, I have received immediate responses as late as 11:30pm; now that is service!

Few of us can forget the images of destruction that occurred with the Ft. McMurray wildfire. Individuals had to evacuate on a moment's notice and getting the word out can be difficult in challenging situations. The AEA (Alberta Emergency Alert) app is designed to give off a very loud and recognizable tone when danger or a public service announcement needs to be shared quickly. It can be a water advisory, road closure or evacuation notice, but smartphone warnings can keep us well informed and I would encourage you to use these tools to improve personal safety.
