





LAKE BONAVISTA COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION BREAKING BARRIERS FUND INFORMATION

What is Breaking Barriers Fund all about?

Breaking Barriers Fund (BBF) provides financial support to Lake Bonavista Hockey Program families facing financial challenges or obstacles during the hockey season.

What types of costs will the Breaking Barriers Fund cover?

The fund will help to cover team cash calls and team apparel purchases.

Am I eligible for funding?

In order to be considered for financial support, we ask that you first be able to answer yes to the following three questions:

- 1. Do you have a child(ren) registered in the Breakers hockey program this season?
- 2. Is the child on whose behalf you are applying between the ages of 4-18?
- 3. Is your family in a demographic which would be considered in financial need as defined by Government guidelines?

Please see table below to confirm low income cut-offs before tax.

If you can answer "yes" to all three questions, then you are eligible for funding through the Breaking Barriers Fund! Upon registration for the Lake Bonavista hockey program, the Registrar will guide you through the process if you choose to proceed with an application. Please note that your participation in the application process is voluntary, not automatic. You must specifically request to apply. Your information is kept confidential and your application is numerical. At no point will your personal information be shared with members of our BBF. The only information shared between our Registrar and the BBF selection committee is:

- The amount that you are requesting from Breaking Barriers Fund.
- The team your child is participating in

*Please note that if you have more than one child playing this year, you will need to do an application for each participant.

How do I apply for funding?

The fund consists of a three-tier application process. In doing so, it has prioritized timely payment to teams and a reliable framework to ensure all funds are used appropriately and responsibly.

Tier 1

Families that have been awarded funding from one of the following organizations for the upcoming hockey season will automatically be eligible for funding. The Lake Bonavista Registrar will provide the application directly to any family that meets these criteria:

Jumpstart

Flames Even Strength
Kid Sport

If you're family has received funding for your hockey fees from the above listed organizations, you are prequalified for BBF funding. Upon registration, the LBHEC Registrar will discuss the application process with you. 3

Successful Tier I applicants will receive payment towards team cash calls to a maximum determined annually by the BBF, based on available funds and applications received. Tier 1 applications take priority and will be paid before any other tier request.

Tier 2:

Families that have been approved for funding from an organization outside of the ones listed above. Proof of funding is required to be shared with the LBHEC Registrar. The Registrar will discuss the application process with you when you are registering for the hockey season.

Successful Tier 2 applicants will receive payment to go towards team cash calls to a maximum determined annually by the BBF, based on available funds and applications received. Tier 2 applications are not guaranteed payment as they are second priority requests.

Tier 3

Families experiencing financial difficulties that complete the BBF application in full and reach the minimum approval score as determined by the BBF approval committee. This application is submitted directly to the BBF via breakingbarriersfund@gmail.com The application can be submitted on behalf of yourself or someone else.

Successful Tier 3 applicants will receive payment to a maximum determined annually by the BBF, based on available funds and applications received. Applications are taken throughout the season and are paid at the discretion of the BBF based on merit of submission and funds available for assistance.

How are funds paid?

Whenever there is a BBF funded family on a team, the receipt of cash calls as well as any surplus funds at the end of the season is handled directly by an LBCA Admin Staff member to ensure confidentiality. At no point will anyone on a team know who the BBF recipient family is.

If I qualify for funding, do I still need to fundraise with my team?

If there is an opportunity within your team to fundraise for your cash call, you are expected to participate and do your best to raise your portion. Failure to comply with these guidelines will disqualify you for future funding.

Is my application confidential?

Your confidentiality is of the utmost importance to us. Please note that all applications are kept confidential. No further personal information, outside of what is collected for the applications directed by the Registrar, is required. Cheques are written from an LBCA account based on BBF requests, and only team names are provided for the completion of your funding. Information provided is only used for application purposes.

How is money raised for the Breaking Barriers Fund? Most of the money is raised at the annual Breaker Shaker event that takes place in the spring. We also accept direct donations and have the ability to write tax receipts where appropriate.

Can more than one child in the same family receive funding?

Yes, funding can be requested for more than one child in a family, playing on a Breakers hockey in the same hockey season.

Are families able to request funding two seasons in a row?

Yes, families can request funding for successive hockey seasons.



Letting Go of Anger: Forgiveness

Nearly everyone has been hurt by the actions or words of another. But if you don't practice forgiveness, you might be the one who pays most dearly. By embracing forgiveness, you can also embrace peace, hope, gratitude and joy. Consider how forgiveness can lead you down the path of physical, emotional and spiritual well-being.

What is forgiveness?

Generally, forgiveness is a decision to let go of resentment and thoughts of revenge. The act that hurt or offended you might always remain a part of your life, but forgiveness can lessen its grip on you and help you focus on other, more positive parts of your life. Forgiveness can even lead to feelings of understanding, empathy and compassion for the one who hurt you.

Forgiveness doesn't mean that you deny the other person's responsibility for hurting you, and it doesn't minimize or justify the wrong. You can forgive the person without excusing the act. Forgiveness brings a kind of peace that helps you go on with life.

Why is it so easy to hold a grudge?

When you're hurt by someone you love and trust, you might become angry, sad or confused. If you dwell on hurtful events or situations, grudges filled with resentment, vengeance and hostility can take root. If you allow negative feelings to crowd out positive feelings, you might find yourself swallowed up by your own bitterness or sense of injustice.

What are the effects of holding a grudge?

- If you're unforgiving, you might:
- Bring anger and bitterness into every relationship and new experience.
- Become so wrapped up in the wrong that you can't enjoy the present.
- Become depressed or anxious.
- Feel that your life lacks meaning or purpose, or that you're at odds with your spiritual beliefs.
- Lose valuable and enriching connectedness with others.

How do I reach a state of forgiveness?

Forgiveness is a commitment to a process of change. To begin, you might:

- Consider the value of forgiveness and its importance in your life at a given time.
- Reflect on the facts of the situation, how you've reacted, and how this combination has affected your life, health and well-being.
- Actively choose to forgive the person who's offended you, when you're ready.
- Move away from your role as victim and release the control and power the offending person and situation have had in your life.

As you let go of grudges, you'll no longer define your life by how you've been hurt. You might even find compassion and understanding.

What happens if I can't forgive someone?

Forgiveness can be challenging, especially if the person who's hurt you doesn't admit wrong or doesn't speak of his or her sorrow. If you find yourself stuck: • Consider the situation from the other person's point of view.

- Ask yourself why he or she would behave in such a way. Perhaps you would have reacted similarly if you faced the same situation.
- Reflect on times you've hurt others and on those who've forgiven you.
- Write in a journal, pray or use guided meditation or talk with a person you've found to be wise and compassionate, such as a spiritual leader, a mental health provider, or an impartial loved one or friend.
- Be aware that forgiveness is a process and even small hurts may need to be revisited and forgiven over and over again.

Does forgiveness guarantee reconciliation?

If the hurtful event involved someone whose relationship you otherwise value, forgiveness can lead to reconciliation. This isn't always the case, however.

Reconciliation might be impossible if the offender has died or is unwilling to communicate with you. In other cases, reconciliation might not be appropriate. Still, forgiveness is possible — even if reconciliation isn't.

What if I have to interact with the person who hurt me but I don't want to?

If you haven't reached a state of forgiveness, being near the person who hurt you might prompt you to be tense and stressful. To handle these situations:

- Remember that you can choose to attend or avoid specific functions and gatherings. If you choose to attend, don't be surprised by a certain amount of awkwardness and perhaps even more intense feelings.
 Respect yourself and do what seems best.
- Do your best to keep an open heart and mind. You might find that the experience helps you to move forward with forgiveness.

What if the person I'm forgiving doesn't change?

Getting another person to change his or her actions, behavior or words isn't the point of forgiveness. Think of forgiveness more about how it can change your life by bringing you peace, happiness, and emotional and spiritual healing. Forgiveness can take away the power the other person continues to wield in your life.

What if I'm the one who needs forgiveness?

The first step is to honestly assess and acknowledge the wrongs you've done and how those wrongs have affected others. At the same time, avoid judging yourself too harshly. You're human, and you'll make mistakes.

If you're truly sorry for something you've said or done, consider admitting it to those you've harmed. Speak of your sincere sorrow or regret, and specifically ask for forgiveness — without making excuses.

Remember, however, you can't force someone to forgive you. Others need to move to forgiveness in their own time. Whatever the outcome, commit to treating others with compassion, empathy and respect.

PROGRAM INFORMATION Regular Season – Timbits

Season runs September to March. There are two levels of Timbits teams, Junior and Senior. 1st time Timbit players will participate in a one hour skate to help coordinators form teams. Senior teams are typically 2nd year players. Hockey Calgary hosts a Timbit Jamboree at the end of the season which each team can decide to participate in. Teams may also participate in in-town tournaments of their choice.

Regular Season – Novice to Bantam

The regular season runs from September to March with evaluations taking place in September. Teams participate in Esso Minor Hockey Week, typically in January and then in playoffs end of February/March. Once teams are formed in September, individual teams may decide to participate in in-town or out of town tournaments at their discretion. It is mandatory for 1st year or new Bantam players to participate in the checking clinic.

House League – Novice & Atom – Maximum 32 registrants per age group

The House Sparrow

The House Sparrow is a member of the Old World sparrow family native to most of Europe and Asia. This little bird has followed humans all over the world and has been introduced to every continent except Antarctica. In North America, the birds were intentionally introduced to the United States from Britain in the 1850s as they were thought to be able to help with insect control in agricultural crops. Being a hardy and adaptable little bird, the House Sparrow has spread across the continent to become one of North America's most common birds. However, in many places, the House Sparrow is considered to be an invasive species that competes with, and has contributed to the decline in, certain native bird species.

Fun Facts:

- The House Sparrow is part of the weaver finch family of birds which is not related to North America's native sparrows.
- The males have a grey crown and underparts, white cheeks, a black throat bib and black between the bill and eyes. Females are brown with a streaked back (buff, black and brown).
- These little birds have only been in Alberta for about 100 years made themselves at home here by taking advantage of urban human environments, where food and home sites are provided.
- In Alberta, House Sparrows can be found in backyards, parks, suburban and cultivated fields, and urban areas. They are rarely found in far northern areas.
- House Sparrow make untidy nests in boxes (sometimes taking over another bird's nest), under eaves, in crevasses in buildings or masonry or stone structures, in spruce trees, and, in cold climates, even in the heat vent outlets of commercial laundries. These birds may raise up to three broods a season.
- These birds usually travel, feed and roost in assertive, noisy, sociable groups, but always maintain wariness around humans.
- Although often disliked for their raucous and unsanitary manners, the House Sparrow provides great fodder for the study of bird behaviours in general because they are so commonly found in areas populated by humans.

Yielding to Emergency Vehicles

Time is the enemy in an emergency. For everyone's safety, it is important for motorists to understand how to correctly yield right of way to emergency vehicles with lights and siren activated. You can help EMS, police, and fire get to the scene quickly and safely by following these rules of the road:

When an emergency vehicle approaches with lights and siren activated:

• If you're in the middle of an intersection when an emergency vehicle approaches with lights and siren activated, safely clear the intersection;

• On a one or two-lane road, motorists should move to the right side of the road, slow down, and then stop. Remember to signal;

• On a road with three or more lanes, motorists should move to the nearest side of the road and stop. If driving in the centre lane, move to the right side of the road and stop. Remember to signal;

 Come to a complete stop and wait for the emergency vehicle to pass. Shoulder check for more emergency vehicles (there is often more than one) before reentering traffic flow. Remember to signal;

• Emergency vehicles might use *any* available road space to maneuver. This could include the shoulders, turning lanes, in order to pass other traffic.

When operating a vehicle:

- Drive attentively and defensively at all times. Be cognizant to sirens and be prepared to yield the right of way;
 It is Alberta law for motorists to slow down to at least
- 60 km/hour (unless a lower speed is posted) when driving past a stopped emergency vehicle. This includes EMS, police, fire, and tow trucks with their lights activated;
- Do not break the rules of the road in order to give right of way to an emergency vehicle. This could include proceeding through a red light, or making an illegal turn. Actions such as these jeopardize all motorists in the area;
- Drivers must place their full attention on the roadway and toward the safe operation of their vehicle at all times. The fine for distracted driving in Alberta is \$287.00;
- Always leave plenty of space between your vehicle and an emergency vehicle, should it be required to stop suddenly.


Now consider how this person that you have imagined yourself being moves through his or her days. What are


