





Community Board Update

This month I would like to explain how the role of the LBCA differs from one of our community's other very important organizations: The Lake Bonavista Residents Association.

The LBCA is a charitable organization whose primary responsibility is to own, operate, and maintain our recreational facility located at the southwest corner of Acadia and Lake Bonavista Drive. Thanks to our many volunteers, partners, and staff, we operate a wide range of social, sport, fitness, and community programs. The LBCA also plays an important role as the official community representative to The City of Calgary and other organizations.

The LBCA does not have any operational involvement or responsibility over Bonavista's lake, its related facilities, or adjacent park area. These are the exclusive responsibility of the Lake Bonavista Residents Association, a separate and distinct nonprofit organization whose valuable work is funded by the obligatory annual levy on all Lake Bonavista homeowners. All Calgary lake communities have a comparable residents association and funding mechanism.

Contrary to common perception, the LBCA is not funded from the Residents Association's levy. Nor are Lake Bonavista residents automatically members of the LBCA. The LBCA is primarily funded by its facility rentals and, to a lesser degree, from its program fees and LBCA membership sales. LBCA membership is not automatic, even for Lake Bonavista residents. If you wish to be a member, you must purchase a membership. Membership provides your family access to various program discounts and helps support LBCA activities and services.

While lake access is restricted to Lake Bonavista residents and their invited guests, there are no such restrictions to become a LBCA member or to participate in the LBCA's facility or programs. However, only those LBCA members who actually reside in Lake Bonavista are able to be voting members of the LBCA Board or vote at the organization's annual general meeting. We are always looking for more good people to participate on our Board and committees.

Worried? How NOT to Let It Get the Best of You By Dr Wayne Dyer

"A day of worry is more exhausting than a week of work." – John Lubbock

- Begin to view all of your present moments as times to live, rather than to obsess about the future. When you catch yourself worrying, ask yourself, "What am I avoiding now by using up this moment with worry?" Then begin to take action on what you are avoiding.
- 2. Recognize the preposterousness of worry. Ask yourself over and over, "Is there anything that will change as a result of my worrying about it?" For example: Will my worrying affect the stock market? Will my worrying affect the weather? Will my worrying affect whether or not my child has an accident?
- Give yourself shorter and shorter periods of "worry time". Designate 10 minutes in the morning to worry—and when that time period is up, refuse to worry until your afternoon worry segment.
- 4. Make a worry list of everything you worried about yesterday or last year, and then see if your worrying did anything to affect the outcome.
- 5. It makes no sense to worry about the things you have no control over, because if you have no control over them, it makes no sense to worry about them. And also, it makes no sense to worry about the things you do have control over, because if you have control over them, it makes no sense to worry about them. And there goes everything that it is possible to worry about. Either you have control, or you don't, and worry is just a waste of your precious, present moments.

Medical Cannabis by Melissa Karakochuk, Pharmacist/Owner

Medical cannabis is currently governed in Canada under the Access to Cannabis for Medical Purposes Regulations (ACMPR) and has been legal for the past two decades. It has become more widely acceptable as our country moves towards legalization of the recreational use of marijuana.

What conditions may benefit from medical cannabis? Health conditions that may benefit from medical cannabis include: chronic pain, mental health conditions (including depression and anxiety), opioid addiction, and nausea/vomiting resulting from cancer chemotherapy, among others.

Why should I use medical over recreational cannabis for my medical conditions?

- **Safety First** Physicians and allied health care professionals (such as pharmacists) can help to register, select and monitor your therapy. While cannabis is considered "natural", it still has side effects and can adversely affect some medical conditions.
- **Product Tested** Licensed Producers (LP) are regulated by Health Canada and their products are tested for purity and accuracy.
- **Controlled Substance** obtaining medical cannabis through a physician and from an LP helps to ensure that the product is used in a safe and measured approach.
- **Medical Coverage** future benefits may include coverage by insurance plans, as some private insurance plans have started to provide coverage of medical cannabis.

How do I access the medical cannabis in Canada?

- 1. Consult with your physician. Not all physicians are registered to prescribe cannabis and some medical conditions require approval from a specialist.
- 2. Register with an LP who will mail the product directly to your home.
- 3. Therapy will be monitored by your physician and allied health care professionals.

How can my Pharmacist help?

Pharmacists currently don't prescribe or dispense medical cannabis but can advise on additional resources, LP registration, product selection, and therapy monitoring.

Waterfowl

Waterfowl are known for their territorial aggression and often unusual choices of nesting sites. In the spring, downtown rooftops become the choice nesting locations for geese, while ducks tend to take up residence in suburban gardens and bushes. Understanding how these animals nest and raise their young will help these animals and the people who interact with them peacefully co-exist.

Did you know?

- Geese tend to be monogamous and will often return to the same nesting site year after year
- Female geese and ducks are less able to fly before they are about to lay their eggs. The male will defend his mate and nest while she is vulnerable
- Geese and ducks incubate their eggs for between 3 and 4 weeks and once their eggs have hatched, it can take goslings and ducklings over 2 months to learn to fly
- Geese and Ducks are protected by the migratory bird act of Canada; their nests are federally protected. Tampering or interfering with an active nest is against the law
- Goslings can safely drop up to 5 stories onto grass or up to 2 stories on pavement
- Ducks and Geese produce 'precocial' young, meaning that once a duckling or gosling is hatched it is fully feathered, with eyes open and is capable of walking and foraging for food on its own
- Geese nest away from water and often cross busy roads as they bring their young to water. This walk is important to strengthen young waterfowl's legs and give them time to waterproof their feathers
- It is not normal to find young waterfowl alone; if you find a lone duckling or gosling it needs help!
- Bread is harmful to waterfowl; please don't feed waterfowl bread!



Spring is finally here and hopefully April showers (and snow!) bring May flowers. I know for many of us winter has been long and arduous, but now it is time to put the snow shovels away, enjoy the fresh buds of nature and prepare for May long weekend and outdoor living! Whether we are camping, planting our gardens or hiking in the Rockies, remember to enjoy the beauty and bounty Alberta has to offer.

The Spring Session is in full swing and much has been going on at the Alberta Legislature. I continue to be your outspoken voice now and into the future.

A couple of years ago one of my constituent brought a long standing and some might say archaic, law to my attention. It is called "adverse possession" but is commonly known as squatter's rights. I have since worked diligently to abolish it. While many of us "urban" Albertans see the issue more as a rural one, it is an issue that clearly can impact all Albertans. In the words of my affected constituent "every home owner, with a misplaced fence over 10 years old, could be subject to a legal claim against their registered land title". Alberta and Nova Scotia are the only two provinces with this law still on the books. Adverse Possession supersedes any clear title, title registration, real property report or other documentation generally thought of as securing your ownership rights, but guite simply, if the conditions of the current law are met, you could be subject to land seizure without compensation. In my opinion, adverse possession is outdated and has no reasonable justification for continuance as a law of the land. I am hopeful my Private Members Bill 204 will rectify this and protect all Albertans from unexpected land seizure.

Please join me for my annual STAMPEDE BBQ on Saturday July 7th from 11am-2pm. We will once again be shouting YEE HAW with Spolumbo's, refreshments, live music from Barter and Cash, games, prizes, and ice cream.


