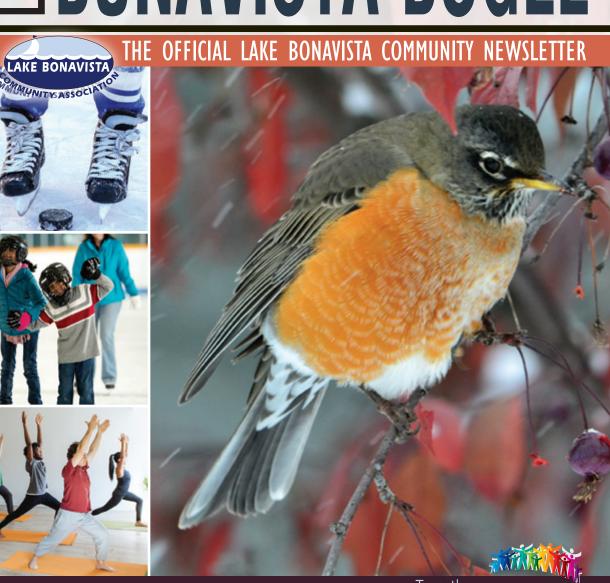

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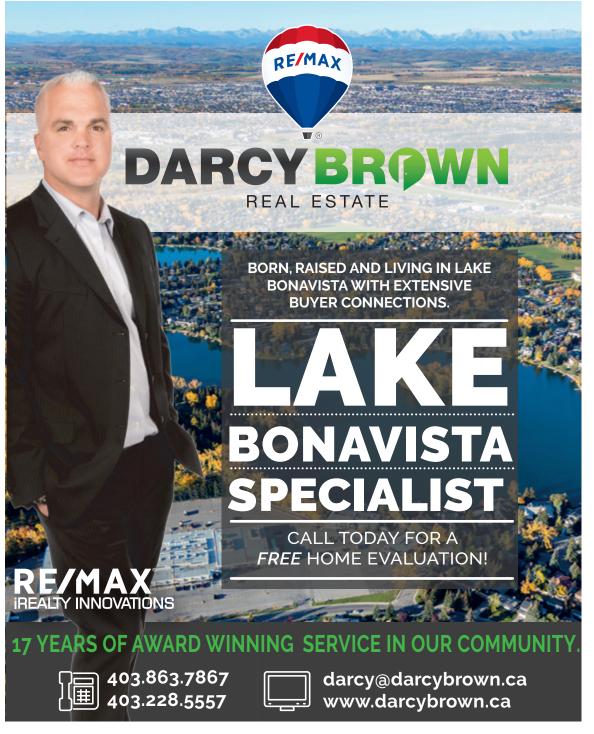

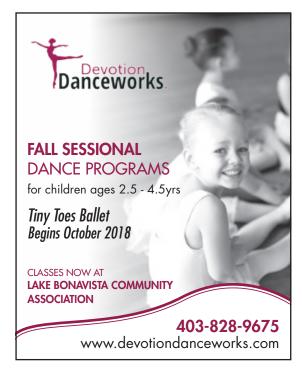

Over the last few years, the LBCA has been investing significant resources on renovations and required maintenance to our aging recreation facility. Those who have been to Lake Bonavista's rec centre since the summer will have noticed some new and visible changes. Renovations to the arena office and food concession, new paint and signage throughout the facility, and new rubber flooring in the arena areas has resulted in a bright, fresher and more spacious look and feel. Change room showers and daycare washrooms have also been rebuilt. Reflecting our focus on safety, we have also installed a new security surveillance system in and outside the building.

COMMUNITY INTEREST GROWS:

Currently we have 76 potential garden members, 24 volunteers, 41 interested raised bed renters, and 5 educational/ charity groups who plan to participate.

GARDEN AREA HISTORY:

The new garden area and Field House Building (originally called Community Hall, then Scout Hall, now Field House) was the original first community center in Lake Bonavista. Later construction of our now current LBCA community centre followed.

We are proud and hopeful that our new Field Garden will revitalize this local area and bring a positive new harmonious look to our neighborhood.

GARDEN NOTES:

Garden Guidelines and Rules:

- Current bed rental interest exceeds maximum number of beds. This topic was discussed at the garden meeting and guideline "Bed Rental Allocation Procedure" was written to ensure fairness of bed assignment. Half bed sizes were added for more participants.
- The following documents were written to properly manage gardening:
- 1. Bed Rental Allocation Procedure
- Garden Rules and Resident Accommodation
- 3. Operating Volunteer Tasks
- 4. Orientation Rules
- 5. Bed Rental Agreement

Where your dollars \$ will go: All garden bed rentals will go to support operation costs. Fees for renting a garden bed are anticipated to be:

- Full Size Bed: \$30/yr (LBCA members)
- Full Size Bed: \$55/yr (non-members)
- Half Size Bed: \$15/yr (LBCA members)
- Half Size Bed: \$40/yr (non-members)

FIELD GARDEN PROJECT STATUS:

Here is a summary of garden project progress for August:

- City of Calgary Environmental Report and approval to proceed was granted (raised vegetable beds and fence line in-ground berry plantings).
- Existing irrigation system was capped by City of Calgary Parks Water Management.
- City of Calgary Optional Amenity
 Agreement in progress (this is the last
 item needing completion before any
 work can start)
- First Community Garden Meeting held on Aug 15, 2018
- Financial grant applications were submitted to:
- o TD Friends of the Environment Foundation
- o Calgary Foundation Neighbor Grants Program
- Donated garden equipment received: garden tools, metal tool storage bin, 3 composters, ground trim timbers, table & chairs, 50' hose, storage shelf
- All garden guidelines and bed rental agreement completed (garden committee approval needed).
- Construction may start this fall 2018 but will depend on grant funding received and fundraising. 1st growing season is anticipated for 2019 (but may be limited by funding success and construction).

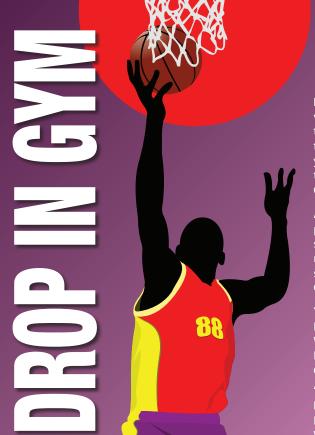

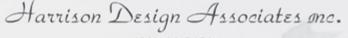

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18 Benefits of Deep Breathing

Breathing correctly is not only important for living longer but also to have a good mood and keep performing at your best.

1. Breathing Detoxifies and Releases Toxins

Your body is designed to release 70% of its toxins through breathing. If you are not breathing effectively, you are not properly ridding your body of its toxins i.e. other systems in your body must work overtime which could eventually lead to illness. When you exhale air from your body you release carbon dioxide that has been passed through from your bloodstream into your lungs. Carbon dioxide is a natural waste of your body's metabolism.

2. Breathing Releases Tension

Think how your body feels when you are tense, angry, scared or stressed. It constricts. Your muscles get tight and your breathing becomes shallow. When your breathing is shallow you are not getting the amount of oxygen that your body needs.

3. Breathing Relaxes the Mind/Body and Brings Clarity

Oxygenation of the brain reducing excessive anxiety levels. Paying attention to your breathing. Breathe slowly, deeply and purposefully into your body. Notice any places that are tight and breathe into them. As you relax your body, you may find that the breathing brings clarity and insights to you as well.

4. Breathing Relieves Emotional Problems

Breathing will help clear uneasy feelings out of your body.

5. Breathing Relieves Pain.

You may not realize its connection to how you think, feel and experience life. For example, what happens to your breathing when you anticipate pain? You probably hold your breath. Yet studies show that breathing into your pain helps to ease it.

6. Breathing Massages Your Organs

The movements of the diaphragm during the deep breathing exercise massages the stomach, small intestine, liver and pancreas. The upper movement of the diaphragm also massages the heart. When you inhale air, your diaphragm descends and your abdomen will expand. By this action you massage vital organs and improves circulation in them. Controlled breathing also strengthens and tones your abdominal muscles.

7. Breathing Increases Muscle

Breathing is the oxygenation process to all of the cells in your body. With the supply of oxygen to the brain this increases the muscles in your body.

8. Breathing Strengthens the Immune System

Oxygen travels through your bloodstream by attaching to haemoglobin in your red blood cells. This in turn then enriches your body to metabolise nutrients and vitamins.

9. Breathing Improves Posture

Good breathing techniques over a sustained period of time will encourage good posture. Bad body posture will result of incorrect breathing, so this is such an important process by getting your posture right from early on you will see great benefits.

10. Breathing Improves Quality of the Blood

Deep breathing removes all the carbon-dioxide and increases oxygen in the blood and thus increases blood quality.

11. Breathing Increases Digestion and Assimilation of food

The digestive organs such as the stomach receive more oxygen, and hence operates more efficiently. The digestion is further enhanced by the fact that the food is oxygenated more.

12. Breathing Improves the Nervous System

The brain, spinal cord and nerves receive increased oxygenation and are more nourished. This improves the health of the whole body, since the nervous system communicates to all parts of the body.

13. Breathing Strengthen the Lungs

As you breathe deeply the lung become healthy and powerful, a good insurance against respiratory problems.

14. Proper Breathing makes the Heart Stronger.

Breathing exercises reduce the workload on the heart in two ways. Firstly, deep breathing leads to more efficient lungs, which means more oxygen, is brought into contact with blood sent to the lungs by the heart. So, the heart doesn't have to work as hard to deliver oxygen to the tissues. Secondly, deep breathing leads to a greater pressure differential in the lungs, which leads to an increase in the circulation, thus resting the heart a little.

15. Proper Breathing assists in Weight Control.

If you are overweight, the extra oxygen burns up the excess fat more efficiently. If you are underweight, the extra oxygen feeds the starving tissues and glands.

16. Breathing Boosts Energy levels and Improves Stamina

Breathing increase pleasure-inducing neurochemicals in the brain to elevate moods and combat physical pain

How to Breathe properly?

In order to breathe properly you need to breathe deeply into your abdomen not just your chest. Even in the old Greek and Roman times the doctors recommended deep breathing, the voluntary holding of air in the lungs, believing that this exercise cleansed the system of impurities and gave strength. This certainly is of great value to you in your work in the world. Breathing exercises should be deep, slow, rhythmic, and through the nose, not through the mouth. The most important parts of deep breathing have to be regulating your breaths three to four seconds in, and three to four seconds out.

- Inhale through your nose, expanding your belly, then fill your chest. Counting to 5.
- 2. Hold and Count to 3. Feel all your cells filled with golden, healing, balancing sunlight energy.
- 3. Exhale fully from slightly parted mouth and Feel all your cells releasing waste and emptying all old energy. Counting to 5.

Schedule your deep breathing exercise just as you would schedule important business appointments. Set aside a minimum of two 10-minute segments of time everyday although you can begin with two five minutes segments if you prefer. Honouring yourself enough to schedule time with yourself is the first step in mastering stress. Tend your relationship with yourself and your relationship with life and with others will be enriched and deepened accordingly. Remember to share with your children and all your friends and loved ones so that they too can reap its untold benefits

Halloween Safety

The members of Calgary's Partners for Safety: Calgary's Child Magazine,

AHS EMS, Calgary Police, Fire, 9-1-1, Bylaw, and Transit would like to remind parents and trick-or-treaters of some Halloween safety tips as October 31st approaches. Partners for Safety vehicles will be out patrolling communities on Halloween night to provide a visible safety resource for parents and trick-or-treaters.

Trick-or-Treaters

- Remember: all regular pedestrian rules still apply. Be sure to cross the road at marked crosswalks, or well-lit corners only. It is safest to work your way up one side of the street, and then cross once to the other side.
- Stay away from houses that are not well lit. Do not accept rides from strangers or enter any home you feel is unsafe.
- Let your parents know where you are going to be at all times (route) and advise them if you will be late returnina.

Parents

- Be certain that young trick-or-treaters are accompanied by an adult. Older children should stay in groups.
- Pre-determine boundaries to trick-or-treat within and establish a firm time to return home.
- Advise children not to eat anything until they return home. Dispose of any items that appear to have been tampered with, or that are not properly wrapped.

Costumes

- · Choose bright coloured costumes that are highly visible. Adding reflective tape to costumes further increases visibility.
- Consider sending your children with a flashlight for additional safety and increased visibility.
- · When purchasing, or making costumes, look for materials and accessories that are labeled flame-resistant.
- All costume accessories, such as sticks, rods, or wands. should be soft and flexible, with no sharp edges.
- Consider using hypoallergenic make-up kits instead of masks that may impair breathing, or vision.
- Be sure costumes are loose enough to be worn over warm clothing, but not so long that they become a tripping hazard. Costumes should not be longer than vour child's ankles.
- Ensure your child is wearing adequate foot wear that takes into consideration weather conditions and walking.

Corpsing is a common technique among pro haunters. There are countless YouTube videos available to learn the nuances and a variety of different corpsing techniques. This is a very simple version.

- Start with a generic plastic skeleton (often called a "Bucky" among haunters).
- Wrap pieces of clear plastic garbage bags around your skeleton.
- Use a heat gun to melt the plastic around the skeleton. Try to get lots of variety in the "meat." If you don't have a heat gun, a very hot hair dryer will usually work but will take more patience. The fumes may be toxic so you should work outdoors at the very least and ideally with a fume hood.
- Once you're happy with the "meat" you can paint it. We recommend stains in shades such as mahogany and burnt umber because they make a fairly nice charred corpse appearance. Add layers until you are happy with it. For the most realistic effect, don't make it too even.
- Once complete, seal your creation with clear glossy varnish.

CALGARY WILDLIFE



The Bobcat Alberta's Smallest Wild Cat

The Bobcat (Lynx rufus or Felis rufus) is a very adaptable animal that is widely distributed in North America. Locally it has expanded its range into populated areas, even into residential areas in cities as large as Calgary. These small wild cats are found in somewhat warmer climates than some of their larger kin (the lynx and cougar). Like other wild cats, they are strong, silent hunters living and hunting among rocks and bushes, and in well treed areas. Generally, they are rarely seen by people when in more remote environments, although the city dwellers are more likely to be "caught" going about their daily activities by observant humans.

Bobcats range from 12 to 24 inches high (30-60 cm), and 25 to 32 inches long (64-82 cm). They weigh just 15 to 35 pounds (6.8 to 16 kg), with the female being somewhat smaller than the male. Most Bobcats are grey to brown with dark spots (for camouflage), with a white underbelly and short, black-tipped tail. The cat is named for its tail, which appears to be cut or "bobbed." They have well-whiskered faces, black tufted ears and longer back than front legs.

Fun Facts:

- Bobcats are territorial, solitary and nocturnal. They are dawn/dusk (crepuscular) hunters. The animals they hunt are generally easy to catch, such as rabbits and hares, but they will also eat other small animals (mice, squirrels) and birds (including geese and swans).
- Bobcats have to catch their prey; taking advantage of the element of surprise, stalking them or lying in wait, jumping and grabbing them with their teeth in just a few long bounds. They can jump up to 12 feet.
- Bobcats can run short distances at speeds up to 40 to 50 kph (25 to 30 mph).
- Wild cats like the bobcat don't chew their meat. They slice off chunks with their sharp teeth and swallow the pieces whole.
- Bobcats mark their territories with claw marks, urine sprays and feces.
- Bobcat females are called a 'queen,' the male a 'tom,' and the young are 'kittens.' Bobcats have litters of one to eight kittens, usually in the spring.
- Lifespan in the wild is from 7 to 10 years. The oldest wild bobcat on record was 32 years old in captivity, and in the

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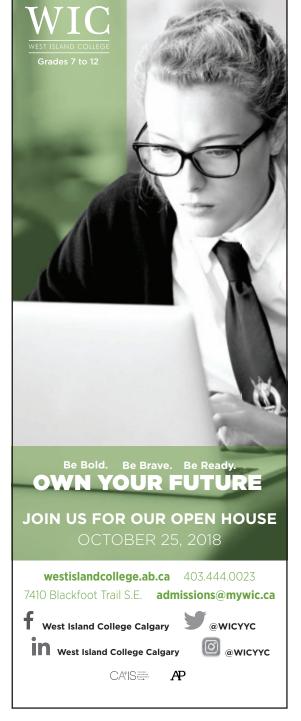
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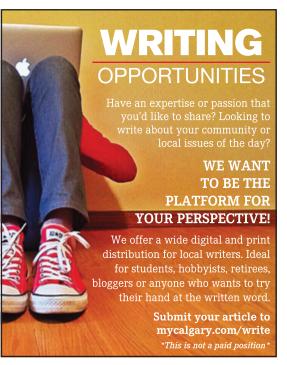
