

Mahogany Beach Club Reminders

Park and Lake Reminders

Pet Pointers: Holiday Pet Dangers

As the holiday season is fast approaching, there are some things to consider when making the house safe for your furry friends. There are many things that we commonly have around the home during the holidays that can cause big problems if they are ingested by your pet. The following are things to watch out for and the problems that they can cause.

Dangerous holiday plants:

Poinsettias: Everyone talks about how 'toxic' this plant is to your pets. There is *some* truth in this but it may be a little overblown. Usually, if ingested, this plant will cause irritation to the mouth and stomach lining. Your pet may be in for a day or two of stomach upset but it generally doesn't warrant hospitalization.

Lilies: Some holiday arrangements may contain lilies. The majority of true lily varieties are EXTREMELY toxic to cats. Lilies can cause kidney failure leading to death in cats. Even brushing up against the lilies and ingesting a tiny amount of the pollen is bad news. Any exposure to lilies (again, this is just for cats) requires an immediate trip to the 24-hour clinic and may require fluid therapy for 72 hours to ensure the kidneys are protected.

Mistletoe and Holly: Both of these plants can cause significant stomach upset and may require a brief stay in hospital for re-hydration so best to keep them out of reach as well.

Dangerous holiday foods:

Chocolate: This is absolutely the most common toxin ingestion in the pet world during the holidays. Depending on the amount and type of chocolate ingested, your pet could have minor stomach upset or things could get as serious as heart arrhythmias, seizures and death. Some pets will even 'unwrap' gifts to get at this delicious hazard, potentially exposing them to wrapping paper foreign bodies (paper causing an obstruction in the intestines). If your pet ingests ANY chocolate this season – contact your veterinarian with the type of chocolate, amount ingested and the weight of your dog so they can determine how bad things may be.

Holiday dinners: It's so easy to think that you're being a kind and generous owner to share a bit of holiday dinner with Fido, however, this can have bad effects on many dogs and we potentially never know which pet is going to have a bad 'reaction'. Some pets can get a mild or more severe gastroenteritis (stomach upset) and others can even develop inflammation of the pancreas (pancreatitis). Pancreatitis can actually be life threatening if severe enough. Onions and garlic within the meals can also cause their own subset of problems as both can cause Heinz body anemia. This is characterized by an abnormal shape to the red blood cells that makes them unable to transport oxygen to the rest of the body properly.

Uncooked dough: Uncooked dough is extremely dangerous – it can rapidly expand in the gastrointestinal tract leading to life threatening ethanol toxicosis from fermentation of the yeast ingested and potentially obstruction of the stomach.

Salt ornaments: Homemade ornaments are adorable but are extremely dangerous to your pets. Ingestion of just one or two salt dough ornaments can lead to salt toxicosis and death.

Dangerous holiday products:

Light cords: Some pets are just attracted to chewing on light cords. This is most often a problem with puppies and kittens. The obvious consequence of chewing on a string of holiday lights would be electrocution.

String-like decorations: Cats in particular are attracted to string decorations (garland, tinsel and sometimes even fake Christmas trees themselves). Ingestion of any of the above can result in intestinal obstruction and necessitate surgery.

Potpourri: Ingestion of liquid and/or dry potpourri can lead to stomach upset. Hot liquid potpourri can also cause significant burn injury (both heat and chemical) to the mouth, esophagus and stomach lining.

Another nugget, try this affirmation: "Change no circumstance in my life, change me." Truly mean it. Put the behavior of the other person completely out of your mind and say to yourself: "How should / behave?" then put all your attention there.

Moods can be beaten. I have proven so in my own life.





Calgary Police ServiceInformation Night

Thank you to the Volunteer Operations Committee for organizing the Calgary Police Service Information Night on November 3. Thanks also to the five members of the CPS who came out to speak with residents about crime in Calgary's southeast.

Resident, and Volunteer Voice Editor, Dawn McKay attended the event and summarized the presentation for those unable to attend as follows:

Most crimes in our neighbourhood are crimes of opportunity. Criminals will casually make their way down a street checking for unlocked car doors, unlocked garage doors, unlocked windows and household entry doors. If they find an unlocked door, they can easily gain access to a car for garage door openers, registration papers, electronics, change, etc.

Once they have gained entry to your garage, if the door connecting into your home is unlocked, it's easy to come into the house, grab anything nearby (keys, purses, electronics, etc.) and be out the door in a couple of minutes.

In September, 90% of reported property crime in Mahogany could have been prevented by locking doors and removing valuables from vehicles. In October that number declined to 75%.

The officers had some tips for making your home and vehicles less of a target:

- 1. Lock all doors and windows with deadbolts if possible
- 2. Do a circuit around your home before bed to ensure all entry points are locked.
- 3. Remove valuables, loose change, chargers, electronics, paperwork that identifies you, etc. from your vehicle, or from the sight of anyone taking a peek in.
- 4. Don't leave large packing boxes for expensive equipment or electronics in your garbage for anyone to see your most recent purchase.
- 5. Have exterior lights on, and if possible, motion sensors.
- 6. Close and lock your garage door.
- 7. Don't leave your car running.



- 8. Know your neighbours and be part of the community.
 9. Report suspicious activity to the police they can track these activities and will deploy resources, especially if it is an ongoing or chronic issue.
- 10. Report any break-ins, even if nothing is taken. This will give police accurate statistics of illegal activity in the community. If crimes are not reported, police are unaware there is a problem. Police budgets only allow for so many resources. They need to know where crimes are being committed so resources can be deployed strategically.





Green Line LRT

2016 Year in Review

2016 has been a big year for the Green Line LRT project. We've had great conversations with thousands of Calgarians, continued to refine alignment options, and have even begun some preliminary infrastructure improvements in the southeast.

A few of the highlights from this year include:

- On October 4, 2016, City Council approved a fully tunneled LRT route in Calgary's downtown core.
- The Beltline alignment options have recently undergone an extensive evaluation. The results of the evaluation, which includes stakeholder and public input, indicate that 12 Avenue S is the preferred corridor. The Green Line project team will carry two options forward for further evaluation: 12 Avenue S Surface and 12 Avenue S Surface + Tunnel.
- The Green Line team met with and spoke to Calgarians along the corridor from north to south and everywhere in between. We've sought input from the public that informed the project team's recommendations to Council, and we conducted transit oriented development workshops in several communities on the north segment of the line.

What's Next

There are some major project milestones coming up in the first half of 2017, including the Beltline alignment recommendation to City Council (March 2017), and the final, full alignment recommendation to City Council (June 2017). As we explore and refine the details of the project, we will back in the community seeking input and sharing our progress.
