With summer just around the corner, here are some handy tips to get your property summer-ready, and to keep our public parks and greenspaces looking great! Take advantage of the early-summer season and get a jump on completing your property's landscaping! By completing your front, side and rear-yard landscaping as soon as you can, you're beautifying your property, and Mahogany as a whole.

Pick up garbage and pet waste from your yard that may have been left behind by Old Man Winter - and don't forget to collect garbage that may have settled between your house and your neighbours'.

When walking your dog, be sure to carry a pet waste bag with you and clean up after your four-legged friend immediately. This keeps our parks and green spaces clean and safe for others to enjoy!

Rake up any dead grass and leaves from your property, and remove any dead leaves and stalks from perennials and ornamental grasses – this will help your grass and flower beds grow more guickly and healthily.

Mow your lawn regularly – this discourages undesirable grasses and weeds, while keeping your yard looking great!

Keep your lawn green by watering regularly. We recommend watering early in the morning or after it cools off in the evening, and giving your lawn at least one inch of water per week.

Trim hedges, trees and shrubs on your property – but be careful not to cut or prune City trees.

Keep things tidy! Keep yard waste, loose garbage, bottles, cans and boxes stored out of sight so that your beautiful yard and home – and not your recycling – are on display!

# **Mahogany Beach Club - Reminders**

## **Park and Lake Reminders**

- All members, age 12 years and over, must bring their membership card each time they wish to access the park, lake and Mahogany Beach Club – not just one card per family.
- No children under 12 years of age are permitted in the park without an adult.
- No pets are allowed at the MBC facility or parks.
- No smoking, alcohol or glass containers are permitted in the parks.
- Only charcoal briquettes may be used in the barbeques.
- Members assume full responsibility for their guests at all times and members must be present in the park at all times while their guests are using the facility.
- Lending your membership card to another person is prohibited.



### **Boat Rentals**

Fishing boats, kayaks, pedal boats and Stand Up Paddle (SUP) boards are available to residents on a first come first serve basis. Members who sign out the boat must be in the boat at all times. No children under the age 16 are to be in a boat without an adult. PFDs are mandatory and MUST be worn at all times. There is a 1 hour time limit on boats loans.

# **Fishing**

The Mahogany Homeowners Association encourages the practise of catch-and-release to make fishing more enjoyable for the families of Mahogany, however members are now allowed to remove fish from the lake. Members are allowed 2 fish per day per household up to 12 fish per month. This is a household limit and includes fish caught by your guests. Please report your catch by telling Beach staff onsite, phoning the main office or emailing reception@mahoganyhoa.com. Fishing is permitted from the Fishing Dock, Private Docks and fishing boats. Fishing from shore is permitted on the south side of the MBC fishing dock up to the bridge. Absolutely no live bait is permitted.

## **Tennis Courts**

Unless reserved for MHOA programs, the courts are available on a first come first serve basis. There is a 45 minute restriction during busy times. Tennis courts are to be used for tennis only. Soft soled court shoes are required. Chairs and other hard objects are not permitted on the courts.

# **Hockey Rink**

The hockey rink is available for inline roller blading. You must put your skates on at the rink. They are not allowed on the pathways within the MBC or at the West Beach.

## **Aerators**

The aerators have now been turned on. WARNING: As per the Rules and Regulations, please do not enter the park or the lake outside of park hours. The lake aerators pose a significant safety risk.

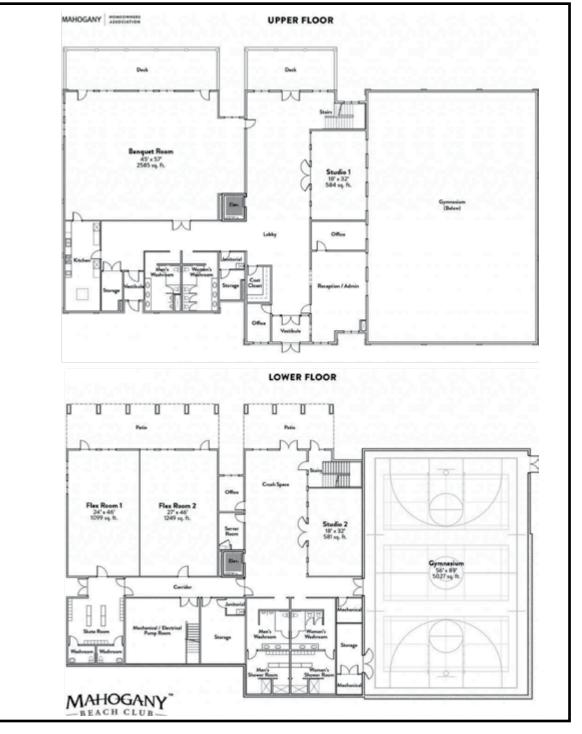

# The Grey Jay

In 2016, the Royal Canadian Geographical Society asked Canadians to identify candidates for an 'official' bird for Canada, intending to lobby the Canadian Government to make the final choice official to mark Canada's 150th birthday in 2017. The winner was the Grey Jay which is also known as the Gray Jay, the Canada Jay, the Whisky/ Whiskey Jack, the Camp Robber, the Meat Hawk and the Moose Bird.

The Grey Jay is the only grey coloured Jay in North America and is 28 to 33 cm (11 – 13 in) from beak to tail's tip, has a 45 cm (18 in) wingspan and weighs about 70 g (21.5 oz) The Grey Jay is a large fluffy grey bird with white head, black nape, short black bill, and long tail but no head crest. It has variations in its colouring in different regions and is often visually confused with Northern and Loggerhead Shrikes. This mischievous bird lives year round in every province and territory of Canada, thriving in cold temperature extremes (up to -30 C). The Grey Jay is found in boreal regions from the tree limit in the far north through mountains and foothills, coniferous and mixed forests, bogs and fens, picnic and campsites across the country.

#### **Fun Facts:**

• The Grey Jay is a member of the Corvidae family of birds, along with other Jays, Crows, Magpies and Ravens. This is a highly intelligent group of birds known for their boisterousness, persistence and adaptability to the presence of humans in their environment. The Grey Jay is said to have the same "brain to body size ratio" as dolphins and chimpanzees!

- These birds are of the earliest nesters in Alberta, laving eggs as early as late February. This gives their young most of the year to learn to forage and store food for their first winter.
- Grey Jays are omnivores and eat seeds, scavenge carcasses (part of nature's clean up crew), and eat eggs and nestlings of other birds.
- Grey Jay cold weather adaptations include:
- catching small chunks of food by covering it with their sticky saliva, and 'gluing' the food to tree trunks, twigs or conifer needle clusters. The Grey Jay remembers where it stores this food!
- allowing solar radiation to penetrate their feathers while still keeping their insulating qualities; and
- decreasing their body temperature at night.
- You may be able to attract the Grey Jay to your backvard feeder with suet, rolled oats, shelled sunflower seeds, or dry dog and cat food.

Condominiums can be a great housing option, and with some due diligence, you can find one that is well suited to your needs, and a financially-sound purchase.

Condominium refers to a type of ownership that includes the individual ownership of a unit and shared ownership of common property with other unit owners. Condominiums can be apartment-style, townhouses, attached, or detached.

Condominium owners typically pay monthly condominium fees to cover their share of expenses for the common property, and some of this payment goes into the condominium corporation's reserve fund.

The reserve fund is used to pay for major capital repairs and replacements. All condominium corporations must have a reserve fund. As a buyer, you want a condominium corporation that has a healthy reserve fund because it reduces the likelihood of a special assessment. Special assessments occur when a condominium corporation has major work to do and there isn't enough money in the reserve fund. The corporation assesses an amount owing to the owner of each unit.

So how can you find out if the corporation you're thinking of buying into is a healthy one? A good place to start is a condominium document review.

Condominium documents relate to the operation of the condominium corporation, which you want to ensure is financially stable and well managed. Condominium documents include but are not limited to:

- current reserve fund study (5 years old or less) and 25vear reserve fund plan
- current operating budget and fee schedule
- current balance sheet
- registered bylaws

When buying a condominium, you can hire a professional to review your condominium documents. They can provide you with a summary of the documents, and identify areas about which you might have concerns. Reviewing condominium documents can uncover financial difficulties, bylaws you find unacceptable (for example, restrictions as to size, number, or type of pet), upcoming necessary maintenance, or even discussion in Board meeting minutes about water issues.

Even a healthy reserve fund and a review of condominium documents can't guarantee you won't have a special assessment or that your fees won't go up. In fact, you should expect your fees to go up a small amount each year, from factors such as inflation or rising utility costs. However, reviewing the condominium documents will give you a good idea of the health of your condominium, and if it's the right one for you.

# **Green Cart Food and Yard Waste** Program

Deer Ridge anticipates receiving the Green Carts about the end of August. Please visit calgary.ca/greencart to get additional details on the Green Cart Food and Yard Waste program.

#### **Green Cart Q&A**

As green carts are set to roll out this summer, here are some common questions you may have about the program.

#### Why are we doing this?

More than half of what's in our garbage is material that could be composted. Composting can reduce what goes into our landfills by half and instead creates a high quality, nutrient rich compost for local gardens, parks and farms. A great video to watch is available at calgary.ca/greencart.

### What if I already compost in my backyard?

Continue to backyard compost and use your green cart too. You'll be surprised how many materials such as meat, bones, dairy, cooked foods, pet waste, tree branches can now go in the green cart.

#### What about smells and rodents?

We found that residents in the pilot didn't experience an increase in pests around their carts. Collecting food and yard waste in the green cart is similar to putting them in the garbage. If your household hasn't experienced problems with pests and food odours in the past, it's unlikely you will with the new system. Some good practices to follow include:

- Empty the kitchen pail into your green cart every 2-3
- Keep the lid of the kitchen pail and green cart closed.
- Put your green cart out for collection every week, even if it's not full.
- Sprinkle a small amount of baking soda or vinegar in your kitchen pail and green cart.

### Will compost return to the community?

Yes, some compost will be available to the community for free through community gardens and select giveaway days starting in 2018. The majority of the compost will be sold in bulk to landscape suppliers with the proceeds reducing the processing costs and lowering the program fee.

Are you at a place in your life where you are facing a new path? Has a new path been chosen for you by the loss of a job or change in your health? Is it time once again to step back and do some serious thinking about the next chapter? Richard Leider and David Shapiro have written Repacking Your Bags: Lighten Your Load for the Good Life with you in mind.

This book is for students, homemakers, businesspeople, professionals and retirees. It is about making choices, after having a courageous conversation with yourself (and perhaps others). Consider these questions:

What's next for me? Why doesn't all this make me happy? What do I want to be when I grow up? How can I find my life's work? How shall I reimagine my life?

# **EMS: Heat Related Illness**

With the return of summer weather, Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind everyone to stay safe in the heat and sun this season. While children and the elderly may be more susceptible to the effects of heat and sun, basic prevention measures should be taken by all to avoid a heat related illness during periods of hot and humid weather.

#### Heat exhaustion

- Heat exhaustion can occur due to excessive fluid loss during periods of prolonged sweating in a hot and/or humid environment (indoors or outdoors).
- Patients may suffer headaches, weakness, fatique, nausea/vomiting, thirst, chills, and profuse sweating.
- The patient is usually cold and damp to the touch and the skin may appear pale or dusky gray.

#### Heat stroke

- · Heat stroke is a medical emergency which, without prompt treatment, could be fatal.
- It occurs when the body can't cool itself naturally (e.g. perspiration). The body's temperature will continue to rise to dangerous levels.
- · Due to severe dehydration and the inability to sweat, the patient may appear flushed, and skin may be hot and dry to the touch.

#### First aid

- First aid for all heat related illness begins with removing or sheltering the patient from the hot environment.
- · Remove excess or tight fitting clothing, and allow them to rest in a cool environment.
- If the patient is conscious and alert, provide suitable fluids such as: water, juice, or a sports drink.
- If you are concerned, seek medical attention or call 9-1-1.

#### Prevention

- Stay well-hydrated by drinking plenty of water.
- Be aware that excessive alcohol consumption will promote *de*hydration.
- Always wear a broad brimmed hat to keep the sun off your face and neck.
- Apply a broad spectrum, waterproof sunscreen with a minimum SPF of 30+, especially for children. The sun's UV rays peak between 11am-3pm, even on cloudy days.

# **Green Carts are coming this** summer

Starting this June, green carts will be rolled out to all households for food and yard waste collection. Here are some details on the rollout.

#### Green cart collection start dates

Green carts will be rolled out by quadrant. Once all residents in a quadrant have their carts, collection will begin as follows:

Quadrant	Cart delivery	Weekly green cart collection starts:
SW	June 5 - July 15	Week of July 17
NW	July 3 - August 12	Week of August 14
NE	August 7 - September 2	Week of September 4
SE	August 28 - September 30	Week of October 2

### Three things to do when your cart arrives

#### 1. Bring your cart up to your home.

Carts will be delivered to the front of your home. Bring your cart up to your home and store it in a safe place (e.g. garage, against the side of your house or back fence).

#### 2. Look inside the green cart.

Everything you need to get started is inside the cart. This includes:

- Kitchen pail and sample compostable bags.
- Sample paper yard waste bags for extra yard waste that doesn't fit inside the cart.
- Instruction guide and collection schedule.

## 3. Consult your collection schedule.

The collection schedule inside your cart explains when green cart collection starts in your quadrant along with your new collection days and schedule. You can also find out your collection days and sign up for free automated reminders at calgary.ca/collection.

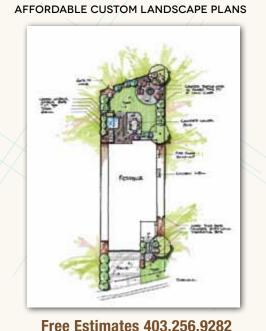


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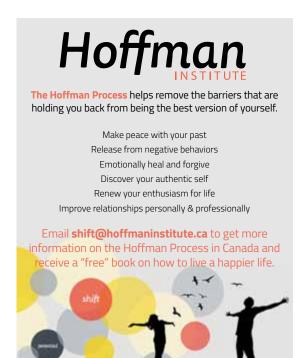

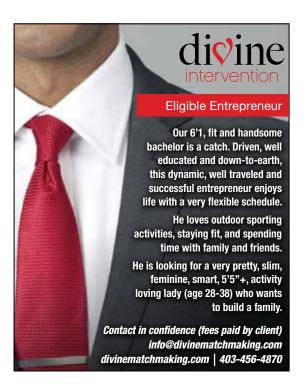

# **Whirling Disease**

Whirling disease is caused by a parasite and affects salmonid fish including trout. It can be transmitted through spores that attach to equipment used for swimming, paddling, boating and fishing. While there are no health concerns for people from the disease, it has the potential to wipe out the trout population in the lake.

Help prevent the spread of Whirling disease into our lake! With Whirling Disease being detected in the Bow River watershed, please be diligent about cleaning your equipment between bodies of water.

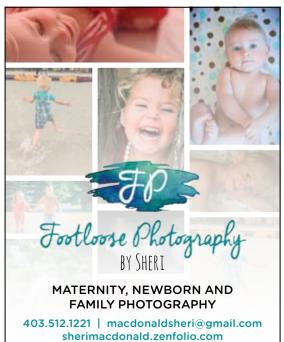
**Clean** and inspect your boat and all equipment that has been in contact with water. This includes boats, boots, waders, PFDs and swimming floats. Remove mud, sand and plant materials. Rinse, scrub or pressure wash your boat and equipment using hot water if possible (90°C or hotter).

**Drain** water from your boat and equipment before leaving the shoreline.

Dry your boat and equipment completely between trips and allow a minimum of 24 hours to air dry before entering new waters. Leave compartments open on boats and equipment. Sponge out standing water.

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Standard & Poor's announced it is downgrading Alberta's credit rating yet again, this time by two notches, from AA to A+.
