

# **Mahogany Beach Club - Reminders**

### **Park and Lake Reminders**

- All members, age 12 years and over, must bring their membership card each time they wish to access the park, lake and Mahogany Beach Club – not just one card per family.
- No children under 12 years of age are permitted in the park without an adult.
- No pets are allowed at the MBC facility or parks.
- No smoking, alcohol or glass containers are permitted in the parks.
- Only charcoal briquettes may be used in the barbeques.
- Members assume full responsibility for their guests at all times and members must be present in the park at all times while their guests are using the facility.
- Lending your membership card to another person is prohibited.
- Members are limited to a household maximum of 8 guests per day.



### **Boat Rentals**

Fishing boats, kayaks, pedal boats and Stand Up Paddle (SUP) boards are available to residents on a first come first serve basis. Members who sign out the boat must be in the boat at all times. No children under the age 16 are to be in a boat without an adult. PFDs are mandatory and MUST be worn at all times. There is a 1 hour time limit on boats loans.

### Fishing

The Mahogany Homeowners Association encourages the practise of catch-and-release to make fishing more enjoyable for the families of Mahogany, however members are now allowed to remove fish from the lake. Members are allowed 2 fish per day per household up to 12 fish per month. This is a household limit and includes fish caught by your guests. Please report your catch by telling Beach staff onsite, phoning the main office or emailing reception@mahoganyhoa.com. Fishing is permitted from the Fishing Dock, Private Docks and fishing boats. Fishing from shore is permitted on the south side of the MBC fishing dock up to the bridge. Absolutely no live bait is permitted.

### **Tennis Court**s

Unless reserved for MHOA programs, the courts are available on a first come first serve basis. There is a 45 minute restriction during busy times. Tennis courts are to be used for tennis only. Soft soled court shoes are required. Chairs and other hard objects are not permitted on the courts.

### **Hockey Rink**

The hockey rink is available for inline roller blading. You must put your skates on at the rink. They are not allowed on the pathways within the MBC or at the West Beach.

### Aerators

The aerators have now been turned on. WARNING: As per the Rules and Regulations, please do not enter the park or the lake outside of park hours. The lake aerators pose a significant safety risk.

The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal and Next Avenue have all published articles about how volunteering can help you earn your next job.

S Volunteering your love makes you feel more love. Love is a hard thing to measure. When researchers at the London School of Economics examined the relationship between volunteering and measures of happiness, they found the more people volunteered the happier they were. Volunteering builds empathy, strengthens social bonds and makes you smile – all factors that increase the feeling of love.



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



Clean and inspect your boat and all equipment that has been in contact with water. This includes boats, boots, waders, PFDs and swimming floats. Remove mud, sand and plant materials. Rinse, scrub or pressure wash your boat and equipment using hot water if possible (90°C or hotter).

Drain water from your boat and equipment before leaving the shoreline.

Dry your boat and equipment completely between trips and allow a minimum of 24 hours to air dry before entering new waters. Leave compartments open on boats and equipment. Sponge out standing water.

### Back to school safety

Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and students about some road safety tips, as streets become more congested, with the return of the school year. Pedestrians and motorists both have an important role to play – road safety is a shared responsibility.

#### Motorists

- Avoid talking on cell phones, texting, or any other behavior that diverts your attention away from driving;
- Give right-of-way to pedestrians who have activated overhead crossing lights, or who are waiting to cross from a street corner;
- Remember, it is illegal to pass vehicles other than those that are parked - in school zones or playground zones, during posted hours.

#### Around school buses

- Flashing amber lights mean a bus is slowing down to stop motorists should do likewise;
- No matter which direction you are coming from, STOP, when approaching a school bus with activated flashing red lights – unless the bus is on the opposite side of a divided highway from you;
- Driver courtesy goes a long way. By simply being alert and cautious when approaching a school bus, you are contributing to school bus safety.

### Pedestrians

- Cross only at marked crosswalks, or street corners that have clear visibility from all directions;
- Make eye contact with all drivers before crossing the street, and keep distractions to a minimum;
- When activating overhead crossing lights, pause before stepping off the curb to ensure motorists in both directions have come to a complete stop;
- Stay within the crosswalk lines until fully clear of the roadway;
- Obey pedestrian lights at intersections. Cross the street only when you see the 'walk' sign and only when all cars have come to a complete stop;
- If you are with young children or pets, hold your child's hand firmly and keep a solid grip on leashes when crossing;
- Remember: children learn by observing. By demonstrating safe crossing habits, you can reduce the chances of your child being involved in a preventable auto/pedestrian collision.

### "Scary" Investment Moves to Avoid By Kevin O'Hagan, PFP, FMA, CIWM

If you have young children or grandchildren, you know what's really important. Yes, it's Halloween time again, which means you'll see plenty of witches and vampires scurrying around. You'll no doubt find these characters more amusing than frightening, but you don't have to look far to find things that are a bit more alarming such as these scary investment moves:

Paying too much attention to the headlines — Some headlines may seem unnerving, but don't abandon your investment strategy just because the news of the day appears grim.

**Chasing "hot" investments** — You can get "hot" investment tips from the talking heads on television, your next-door neighbour or just about anybody. But even if the tip was accurate at one point, by the time you get to a "hot" investment, it may already be cooling down. And, even more importantly, it simply may not be appropriate for your individual risk tolerance and goals.

Ignoring different types of investment risk — Most



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investors are aware of the risk of losing principal when investing in stocks. But if you shun stocks totally in favour of perceived "risk-free" investments, you'd be making a mistake because all investments carry some type of risk. For example, with fixed-income investments, including GICs and bonds, one risk you may encounter is inflation risk — the risk that your investment will provide you with returns that won't even keep up with inflation and will, therefore, result in a loss of purchasing power over time. Another risk you can incur is interest-rate risk — the risk that new bonds will be issued at higher rates, driving down the price of your bonds. Bonds also carry the risk of default, though you can reduce this risk by sticking with bonds that receive the highest ratings from independent rating agencies.

**Failing to diversify** — If you only own one type of investment, and a market downturn affects that particular asset class, your portfolio could take a big hit. But by spreading your dollars among an array of vehicles, such as stocks, bonds and government securities, you can reduce the effects of volatility on your holdings. (Keep in mind, though, that diversification cannot guarantee profits or protect against loss.)

**Focusing on the short term** — If you concentrate too much on short-term results, you may react to a piece of bad news, or to a period of extreme price volatility, by making investment moves that are counterproductive to your goals. Furthermore, if you're constantly seeking to instantaneously turn around losses, you'll likely rack up fees, commissions and possibly taxes. Avoid all these hassles by keeping your eyes on the future and sticking to a long-term, personalized strategy.

You can't always make the perfect investment choices. But by steering clear of the "scary" moves described above, you can work toward your long-term goals and hopefully avoid some of the more fearsome results.

# Fish Compensation project in Bowmont Park

Following the 2013 flood, The City undertook a number of projects to repair and reinforce riverbanks along the Bow River. These projects helped protect critical City infrastructure but in some cases, had compounding impacts on sensitive fish habitat along the river. In order to appropriately compensate for the loss of habitat, The City identified a number of sites that could supplement lost habitat at other locations. A project in Bowmont Park was one of the sites chosen.

The project is located adjacent to and partly within Bowmont Natural Area Park (Bowmont Park) on the north bank of the Bow River. Work will entail:

- Reopening historic side channels
- Re-establishing flow to the side channels, through excavation and re-contouring, to provide yearround connectivity from and to the main channel of the Bow River
- Constructing additional fish habitat structures using large trees and boulders
- Re-planting of all areas disturbed and the new channel banks with native plants and grasses;
- Providing additional bank and channel enhancement and protection to promote natural channel function while protecting infrastructure and the environment.

The City will also replace the existing (North) pedestrian bridge with a longer single span bridge. When the existing pedestrian bridge was constructed in the early 1990s, the channel width was reduced from 35 m to 15 m, which has severely limited flood water flow under the bridge. This has likely contributed to the significant amount of gravel and river cobble that has accumulated upstream of the pedestrian bridge. Widening the channel at this location will help achieve our goal of creating healthy fish habitat.

# Sometimes mortgage terms can be confusing

Principal: The original amount of a loan, before interest.

**Prepayment penalty:** A fee charged by the lender when the borrower prepays all or part of a mortgage over and above the amount agreed upon.

Closed mortgage: A mortgage that cannot be prepaid

### or renegotiated for a set period of time without penalties.

**Open mortgage:** A mortgage that can be repaid at any time during the term without any penalty. For this convenience, the interest rate is between 0.75-1.00% higher than a closed mortgage. This is a good option if you are planning to sell your property or pay-off the mortgage entirely.

**Fixed rate mortgage:** A mortgage where the interest is set for the term of the mortgage.

**Variable rate mortgage:** A mortgage for which the interest rate fluctuates based on changes in the prime interest rate.

**High ratio mortgage:** A mortgage that exceeds 80% of the purchase price or appraised value of the property. This type of mortgage must be insured.

**Conventional mortgage:** A mortgage up to 80% of the purchase price or the value of the property.

**Mortgage insurance:** If your down payment is less than 20% of the purchase price of the property, the lender is going to require mortgage insurance.

I hope everyone had a nice summer. It's been a busy time in our constituency. I have spoken to many concerned parents from Prince of Peace, New Brighton and Copperfield schools about playground funding. I will continue to advocate on your behalf.

We have also been inundated with complaints of odour in the vicinity of Copperfield. Alberta Transportation district staff have since investigated and confirmed that it is not originating from the storm ponds constructed as part of the Southeast Stoney Trail project. The smell is originating from the natural wetlands near Copperfield. As all wetlands in Alberta are under the jurisdiction of Alberta Environment and Parks (AEP), we have reached out to AEP to discuss the issue and were informed that they had received similar complaints and had sent a compliance inspector to the site to investigate. They determined that the odour is a result of decreased water level in the wetlands due to recent dry weather and that since the odour does not pose any health concerns, they will not be taking any actions to eliminate it. If residents in the area have further concerns related to these wetlands they can contact Alberta Environment and Parks at 1-800-222-6514.

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
