

Cool camps for your little critters

Send your kids on an action-packed nature adventure this spring break! The City of Calgary's nature day camps connect children with the natural world through hands-on activities and outdoor play. Campers will explore the exciting world of bugs, birds, plants and animals, and gain a better understanding of nature and their place within it.

Spring nature day camps run from Monday, March 21 to Thursday, March 24 and are located at the Inglewood Bird Sanctuary, Ralph Klein Park and Devonian Gardens.

Nature Fun Camps, designed for children four and five years old, introduce preschoolers to the natural world using games, crafts and stories. Camps run from 9 a.m. to noon and are \$92 per child.

Nature Spring Camps, designed for children ages six to 10, focus on nature's amazing transformation during the spring season, including insect, plant and animal adaptations. Camps run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and are \$180 per child.

The City of Calgary also offers nature day camps during July and August for children four to 12 years old. These week-long adventures are offered at the Inglewood Bird Sanctuary, Halfand full-day camps are available. Summer camp registration begins February 29.

Available at calgary.ca/citizendashboard, the tool displays performance measures and data using interactive graphs, charts and maps.

"The Dashboard provides citizens with easy access to City performance measures, provides explanations of what those measures mean and what we are doing to improve service," said Mac Logan, General Manager, Transportation and Chair of a committee designed to oversee and champion customer service and digital innovation at The City. "We look forward to hearing from Calgarians during the pilot as they explore the tool."

Powered by The City's Open Data Catalogue, the Citizen Dashboard pilot currently displays performance measures for 311; Calgary Transit Access; Transit Safety and Security; Waste Management; and Building Regulations. Additional services and performance measures continue to be added on a regular ba-

City staff hit the roads throughout snow season

When snow falls, City Parks crews guickly started clearing designated pathways, and Roads crews are always working hard to plow, salt, and sand major roadways. When it snows, make sure to give yourself extra time to reach your destination and leave extra distance between you and the car ahead of you. TENNIS NEWS



Although Parkland graduated from the Building Tennis Community (BTC) Program I was invited back to attend the Tennis Canada's BTC Conference in Toronto in late October 2015. Tennis Canada wanted new BTC's to meet some graduated communities from across the country to share experiences.

Tennis Canada also established a new direction for BTC's to not only focus on getting kids to learn tennis, but to increase the number of recreational competition through a league pathway system. This is similar to any other kids' sports such as hockey, soccer, basketball, etc. The minor league concept gives participants a chance to play right away and be part of a team. As children are learning skills while playing games, they are also improving. While at the Aviva Centre (formally Rexall Centre, where the Roger's Cup is played), we watched a Girls Only league. Kids wore different coloured jerseys and played doubles under the guidance of a female coach.

In January, Parkland tried to develop an indoor program for kids and adults.
