



### **ATCO Gas:** Delivering safe and reliable natural gas service to you

Urban Pipeline Replacement Program necessary to meet growing natural gas service demands

As a resident in the Parkland community, you may have noticed some construction by ATCO Gas or one of our contractors. As indicated in the December 2015 issue of the Parkland Community newsletter, ATCO Gas started installing a natural gas line in the Parkland community and Fish Creek Provincial Park on February 16, 2016.

This work is part of the Urban Pipeline Replacement (UPR) Program where new low-pressure gas lines are installed in residential areas and high-pressure natural gas lines are relocated from to non-residential areas alongside ring roads (Transportation/Utility Corridors.)



The portion of the project in your neighbourhood is scheduled to be complete in June with reclamation scheduled for summer 2016 and includes a new paved pathway to connect the Park to 146 Avenue along Bow Bottom Trail. Signs outlining impacts of the work are located throughout the Park.

The project is scheduled to take place in three phases: Phase 1: All work in Phase 1 will be contained in Fish Creek Provincial Park. A low-pressure natural gas line will be installed from an existing line in the Transportation/Utility Corridor near Sun Valley Boulevard to 146 Avenue SE. For a portion of the work, horizontal directional drilling (a trenchless method for installing underground pipeline) will be used to minimize impact to the Park. Timeline: February 16, 2016 to April 2016, weather permitting

- Phase 2: A low-pressure natural gas line to be installed along Bow Bottom Trail from 146 Avenue SE to south of Canyon Meadows Drive. Timeline: April 2016 – early May 2016, weather permitting
- Phase 3: A low-pressure natural gas line will be installed from Bow Bottom Trail along Parkwood Way and connecting to an existing line near Acadia Drive and Canyon Meadows Drive SE. Timeline: May 2016 – early June 2016, weather permitting



- Define based on their findings, summarize and clarify people's needs and insights to focus their work;
- Ideate brainstorm a variety of solutions, are encouraged to think out of the box, to help solve the original concern or need;
- Prototype build a prototype problem-solving device and test it; and
- Iterate evaluate their product/service and make changes to improve it.

You can imagine that as students build and innovate things they use a lot of materials! They take old appliances apart, combine components, and new creations are born.

### IN & AROUND CALGARY

Calgary – With the mild winter and above-average temperatures this spring, many Calgarians are ready to tidy up their yards and get their gardens ready for the new season. Spring cleaning means plenty of yard waste that can be given a second life as compost. Calgarians are encouraged to drop off their yard waste for free at City landfills so it can be composted instead of thrown away.

**From April 1 to May 29**, all three City of Calgary landfills will waive fees for residential loads of leaves, branches, plants and other garden material. The yard waste will be composted at the sites, turning it back into a useful resource.

"Yard waste makes up over a third of household garbage at this time of year," says Sharon Howland, Leader of Program Management at Waste & Recycling Services. "Fallen leaves, branches and plants are all materials that can be composted instead of thrown away. By composting this material, it will help reduce greenhouse gases and turn it into a useful product that helps new plants grow."

Here are four tips for Calgarians to know about the spring yard waste drop-off program before they come to the landfill:

- Make sure your load only contains yard waste like leaves, branches and plants (no sod – it can't be composted at City sites). Charges will apply if the load contains other items.
- Residents are encouraged to leave their yard waste loose or put it in paper yard waste bags, which can be composted as well. If yard waste is loose, residents should make sure to secure and cover loads before transporting them.
- City landfills are open seven days a week from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.:
- Spyhill Landfill 69th St. and 112th Ave. N.W.
- East Calgary Landfill 17th Ave. And 68th St. S.E.
   Shepard Landfill 114th Ave. and 86th St. S.E.
- For faster service, visit the landfill on a weekday or before 9 a.m. on Saturday or Sunday when wait times are shorter.



courtesy of the Calgary Police Service. They broke down Calgary's break and enter (B & E) statistics by community. In all, Ward 14 fared well in comparison, but a couple of salient points were apparent. Almost half of residential B & Es were unforced entries, and the vast majority of garage B & Es were unforced. Can you imagine how much crime we could stop by just locking our doors?

- Here are some crime prevention tips from the Police: • Do not leave garage doors open
- Keep the door to your attached garage locked
- Keep your front, rear, and patio doors locked, even when at home
- Do not leave valuables near the entrances in your home
  Do not leave your vehicles unlocked when parked outside
  Do not leave your garage door opener in your vehicle
  Close all windows and doors at night

They may seem like common sense, but sometimes that seems less common than it ought to be.

Two more key points: do not be afraid to report suspicious activity to the police, and get involved with your local community association. The police visit them regularly to share information and hear concerns. You can contact the police at 403-266-1234 for nonemergencies, and at 911 for emergencies.


