# **Parkland Summerfest** 2016 & **Future Vision**

#### **Volunteers and Sponsors**

First off, I would like to thank the volunteers that make this event happen. There are a large number of volunteers that show up on the day of the event help out, not all volunteer jobs are glorious but they are all very important. Thank You! To all the planners and organizers, I can't count the number of hours you put in but it is immense. You do it for the right reason; you want to make this community better. Thank You!

We have some very important sponsors that, quite frankly, we could not do the event without. I ask that you all please use these businesses whenever you get the chance. There is a list of all the sponsors in this publication please take time to look through them.

#### Summerfest 2016

After 2 years of experimenting with different dates, trying to skirt the weather, we decided to move Summerfest 2016 back to the end of June, rain or shine. It is obvious that the date is more important than the weather. Attendance was at least double what we had in the previous two Summerfests, even without a tent. (More on that later).

I regularly attend festivals and events, not only in Calgary, but throughout western Canada. The economy and the low dollar have made this a tough year on festivals. I also keep in touch with numerous festival organizers in Calgary and the sentiment is the same with all of them, attendance and sponsorship are down about 35%. Just take a look at the line ups for both the Calgary and Edmonton Folk festivals and you will see a real lack of high end headliners.

We also lowered our budget on music this year. We had two outstanding headliners in 2016 but they did not have the "Flare" that a 54-40 or Loverboy has. It is always a struggle to decide between hiring good quality music and hiring "Flare". Some years we get bands based on name alone and

some years it has more to do with bands potential. This year, I truly believe we had 2 bands that have the ability to be "big names" in the years to come. Getting a home grown talent that has had a decent international hit was a real coup. I fully expect to see Jocelyn Alice rise to the top. She was generous enough to play our event even though her contractual restrictions forbade it. A few years back the Solstice Society brought in Serena Ryder on her rise to fame. I remember not knowing much about her at the time, but she is still one of my favorite acts to ever have played this

Most importantly, the feel and vibe of the event was outstanding. A real community feel was present again, something that lacked in the summer dates.

#### **Covering the Audience**

Having a tent was wonderful. As far as I know, we were the only outdoor festival that covered the audience. Now, economics make it impossible to do that for the size of festival we have. When British Petroleum was involved, we contributed 2/3rds of the infrastructure cost which included the tent, but we got much of that money back in bar and ticket revenue from Friday and their donation to our event. The cost of renting a tent is roughly \$50k with another \$10k -\$15k for permitting, drawings, and insurance.

We are currently looking at alternatives to covering at least a portion of the audience but there will be a significant cost for any solution that we come up with. You will hear more about this when we have some alternatives nailed down.

## **Green Cart set to roll out next spring**

After a successful pilot that saw a 40 per cent drop in garbage and 89 per cent satisfaction amongst residents, the Green Cart Program will roll out to all single family homes beginning next spring. All communities should have the service by fall 2017. Here are the highlights:

All food, yard and pet waste is accepted in the program.

**Unlimited quantity.** Use paper yard waste bags for extra yard waste that doesn't fit in the cart.

Green and blue carts will be collected on the same day every week.

Black carts will be picked up once every two weeks on a separate day since most household waste can be recycled or composted.

Residents will receive everything they need to get started including the green cart, a kitchen pail for collecting food scraps inside the home; a sample of compostable bags for the kitchen pail and yard waste bags. Once service begins, households will pay \$6.50 per month. This charge reflects the savings achieved by changing black cart garbage collection from weekly to once every two weeks.

#### Green carts go beyond backvard composting

If you're already backyard composting, keep it up. Use your green cart for all the other materials that cannot be composted at home like meat, bones, shellfish, dairy, weeds and pet waste.

#### Why we need to keep food and vard waste out of landfills

It may be hard to believe, but more than half of residential garbage is food and yard waste. Composting this material is the right thing to do. When food and vard waste is buried in the landfill it releases methane. a greenhouse gas that is 25 times stronger than carbon dioxide. By using the green carts we reduce dependence on our landfills, reduce greenhouse gas and turn food and yard waste into nutrient-rich com-



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# **Hearing Loss differs from Vision loss**

As with the eye, the ear's performance is affected by aging. However, bad vision gradually makes reading harder as the letters get smaller as in the chart below but hearing loss is different. In hearing impairment some sounds in a word may be heard clearly but other sounds particularly consonants may not, causing overall speech to sound 'muffled' or unclear. Hearing loss can make certain syllables and sounds harder to hear. For example, high-pitched consonants like f, s, th, c, st and t are easily drowned out by louder, low-pitched vowels like **a**, **o** and **u**. This results in a person with hearing loss complaining that they can hear others are talking, but not what they are saying. They can hear but do not always understand particularly in noise. Listening with an untreated hearing loss can be compared to Swiss cheese; there are 'holes' in the conversation.

Hearing Leasing Loss







Hearing loss usually begins unnoticed. On average, people with hearing loss wait almost 10 years before they do something about it. Too few people make a timely decision to take active steps to recover their hearing and increase their quality of life.

Studies show that as people lose their hearing, they are more prone to depression; they withdraw socially and communicate less with family and friends. This comes as no surprise – after all, you can't participate in conversation if you can't hear or understand what's being said!



# Mandatory bylaw for building maintenance approved by City Council

What goes up shouldn't come down.

In the last few years, there have been several incidents of materials and debris falling off tall buildings, particularly in the downtown core. City of Calgary investigations into these events revealed that there's more to be done to prevent potentially hazardous situations and protect public safety. That's why the Building Maintenance Bylaw was developed.

It will require buildings that are five storeys or higher and 10 years and older to complete visual exterior assessments every five years.

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
