



PARKLAND HOUSE SITTING REGISTRY

The House Sitting Registry matches home owners looking for a house sitter with those wishing to offer house sitting services. This is a great job for a teen, with some parental supervision or a home owner wishing to exchange with another. House sitting duties could include: emptying the mail box, picking up the paper, clearing away flyers, watering plants and generally keeping an eye on things. All service arrangements and remuneration are determined by the owner and house sitter.

Time to Pass the Torch

Some History

I have truly enjoyed starting community soccer in Parkland. Back in 2008-11 there was no communityrun soccer here. After a "lonely and all over the south of Calgary" club experience three years in a row, in 2012, I convinced the hall board to finance soccer start up. Roughly a \$12,000 endeavour, that we hoped would be cost recovery.

Some Help

Thank you to Steve Mulholland and Janice Schneider for having faith in me and the suspected support of the community. Several people pitched in and lent their experience and time to make this a good community program. I knew "race car race car" and "popcorn" about soccer back then and did appreciate all the advice. Of course, there were some growing pains. Having to petition the city for the ability to rent the fields being the first. Thank you to our ward council Peter Demong for going to bat for us!

What Happened and Importance

That first year, for the older kids, whoever showed up we divided in two groups and they played in pinneys. We now have six full teams in that age group. We have almost two hundred kids play now. Being able to run our own soccer meant:

- Everyone could play Mondays and Wednesdays.
- We could play with neighbours and friends so our kids would at least know someone on their team.
- Older kids (8 -12 year olds) could still play community
- Flexibility, friends could coach together.
- · Low costs.
- · Community building.

It is this last one—community building—that has had the most impact on me. I would never have had a reason to have met so many other people in my community. I love looking at the fields on these soccer nights. All the parents visiting, kids (some in the trees, which is discouraged!) running around with friends. Many staying a bit later and lingering. Not many activities have the ability to foster community ties quite like this. Which is why I have continued to support this program long after my kids have stopped playing. Because it's a win-win for everyone, good exercise for the kids, great for the adults, and good for the neighbourhood too. A very big thank you to all who have helped me and community soccer. It truly is a bigger than one person task and we could not have run it without you.

Cindy Steps Out

It is time for me to step out and someone else to step in. If you too think this is worthwhile please identify your interest. We are looking for someone to facilitate soccer next year. I will happily help through the transition. There are dozens of people who are solid volunteers for this established program, you wouldn't be alone.

Park 96 is a private gated facility owned by the property owners in Parkland who have paid all fees owing and are deemed to be "Members in Good Standing" or the designate of such owner. The current fee is \$200.00 due annually on January 1st, part of which is a \$96 encumbrance on each property or residence. This fee is used to maintain operations, support social and recreational programs and finance park improvements. The Park is managed by an elected Board of Directors of up to 15 members. This Board meets at 7:00 pm on the fourth Tuesday of each month, excluding July and August. 

Stav Safe in Summer Weather



July is a month made for BBQs, outdoor sports, and relaxing on the deck. It's a time where most Albertans spend as many hours as possible outside enjoying the warm weather. As temperatures soar, it is important to keep a few things in mind as you head outdoors.

Though most people can handle moderate summer weather without issue, even healthy Albertans need to keep heat safety in mind during warmer months. When temperatures are high, make sure to take frequent breaks from the heat, spending some time indoors at home, or in a cooled public building— like a mall or indoor pool. Ensure that sunscreen of at least SPF 30 is applied 20 minutes before heading outdoors (be sure the product blocks both UVA and UVB rays), and reapply frequently. Rescheduling outdoor activities to cooler hours of the day is also smart way to beat the heat.

When spending time outdoors, what you wear makes a big difference in keeping your body cool. If you know you will be out in the heat, light colored clothing is suggested. A wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses (with a UVA/UVB CSA- certified seal) along with long sleeves and pants can help protect you from the sun's rays. A water bottle is a much needed accessory with any summer outfit— make sure to drink plenty of water and other non-alcoholic, non-caffeinated beverages to stay hvdrated.

Albertans are also urged to keep an eye out for heat warnings issued by Environment Canada. The warnings are posted online at weather.gc.ca/warnings/index_e. html?prov=ab to keep residents informed and prepared during periods of extreme heat.




