



PARK96 ANNUAL FEES

Invoices for the 2017 Annual Fee were mailed to each residence the first week of January avoiding the Holiday rush. The annual fee is \$200.00 (including GST) and interest will begin on April 1, 2017. Parkland Residents have options how to pay:

NEED A FOB?

Are you new to Parkland and need a FOB? Drop into the Park Office with proof of your new address and fill out a membership form. Homeowners are given a complementary access FOB. Check out the Office hours on park96.com, press the door bell and Office Administrator, Jennifer Stone will let you in. Or book an appointment at park96@telus.net during a time that works for you.

If you plan to bring between 10 to 40 people to the Park for an outdoor gathering, please notify the Park Office to avoid over booking. If you wish to bring more than 40 people to your gathering then once again contact the Park Office at park96@telus.net and pay a minimal per person fee. Parkland Residents must stay on site at all times when bringing guests into the park.

PARKLAND HOUSE SITTING

The House Sitting Registry matches home owners looking for a house sitter with those wishing to offer house sitting services. This is a great job for a teen, with some parental supervision or a home owner wishing to exchange with another. House sitting duties could include: emptying the mail box, picking up the paper, clearing away flyers, watering plants and generally keeping an eye on things. All service arrangements and remuneration are determined by the owner and house sitter.

Park 96 is a private gated facility owned by the property owners in Parkland who have paid all fees owing and are deemed to be "Members in Good Standing" or the designate of such owner. The current fee is \$200.00 due annually on January 1st, part of which is a \$96 encumbrance on each property or residence. This fee is used to maintain operations, support social and recreational programs and finance park improvements. The Park is managed by an elected Board of Directors of up to 15 members. This Board meets at 7:00 pm on the fourth Tuesday of each month, excluding July and August. Members with guestions or concerns are welcome to attend these meetings, with prior notice of their desire to be added to the agenda, or may contact the Board President, Keith Watson, directly at park96@telus.net.

Parkland Community Hall:



SCHOOL SHOUT-OUTS

Prince of Wales School

Parents and students showed their appreciation during the last week of April for the dedication, commitment and hard work of the staff of Prince of Wales school (POW). A big round of applause to the more than 30 people at POW who contribute to the top-quality education delivered to the students each day at school. POW parents appreciate the teachers and support staff every day, but dedicate a week each year to make the staff feel special with games, lots of food, and other tributes.

The generosity and empathy of POW students shone in April and May with the grade two students taking the lead in a fundraising effort to support the community of Kugaaruk, Nunavut. The grade two students were learning about communities across Canada. As they explored ways of life in the Arctic, they were sad to learn that a fire had devastated the community school in Kugaaruk. Not just a center for education, the Kugaaruk school served as the community center. It included an arena, breakfast and lunch pro-

gram, and space for special events. After exploring how to best support this community, the grade two POW students developed a noon-hour intramural indoor hockey program with participation from other grades based on donations. Fundraisings efforts resulted in an amazing \$750.


The POW team has continued its preparations for the families from Legacy who will join the POW community in September. In April, Legacy families were invited to an evening open house, and in May, students were able to visit POW during the school day and get to know the classrooms and teachers.

Come out to help us tidy up our community:

- Any refundable bottles will given to Parkland Cares.
- Cerebral Palsy is on site and they will take clothing, kitchen utensils, DVDs, CDs, games, toys, and your old clothing. For a complete list check out cpalberta.com/ donate/recycle-clothing-bottles.
- Recycle your branches, leaves, garden waste, and grass at the green truck. (Use paper not plastic bags.)
- Best Shredding will return to shred and dispose of your old confidential papers.
- Recycle Logic will again safely rid you of your old tired electronics (computers, monitors, printers, cell phones and TVs) from your basements and garages.
- GFL will be providing our metal dumpster. So dig into your garden/tool shed and unload your old tools, barbeques, etc. or rid your home office of filing cabinets to fill our metal bins. To save space we request you take the legs off the barbecues as well as any wood.
- $\bullet \ \ Recycle \ those \ old \ tires \ hanging \ on \ the \ wall \ of \ your \ garage.$

- Get rid of your old refrigerators and coolers for a small fee (\$20.00) which will cover the cost of removing the coolant.
- A parent is coordinating the collection of baby/tot car seats. These will be taken to a processor for disposal.
 The processor is charging \$10 per seat.

Happy, smiling volunteer attendants will be on hand to show you which bin /area to place your garbage, recyclables, and donations. As per last year recycles are free but garbage costs. A small donation of \$20 per second or more pickups will be accepted. After our costs are handled the remainder will be given to a food bank.

We cannot accept railway ties, animal carcasses, hazardous materials including chemicals, paints, oils, used oil filters etc.



June is upon us and another school year is coming to an end. Graduation is a milestone for many as the pinnacle of high school or a post-secondary experience. It is always a privilege to attend graduation ceremonies and it is a highlight to see young adults launching into a new chapter of their lives

Often in the Legislature, Bills can be controversial, but this spring I was proud to lead the charge amongst opposition parties in raising awareness on Labour Code and Employment Standards consultation. We felt it necessary to take a stand and demand additional time for employers and employees to provide feedback on the far-reaching consequences of changes in legislation for every working Albertan. How we are employed, and under what rules, matters to both business and employees alike. All of us want to have safe and healthy workplaces. Understanding the costs, implications and consequences of legislation requires more than just a short on-line survey or invitation-only engagement

On the topic of workplace safety, I attended with students, staff, and parents at Dr. E. P. Scarlett High School a presentation around rights and responsibilities that we all have for the safety of ourselves and co-workers. Calgary-Fish Creek resident Julie Hamilton was able to share her message on the importance of worksite safety through her "Missing Tim" initiative on National Day of Mourning. Julie lost her dear son Tim, a Scarlett Grad, to a workplace accident that was 100% preventable. Julie presented her story to hundreds of students to create awareness on what questions to ask on the job site, and to give the students "permission" to walk away from unsafe work. My thanks to Julie for sharing her emotional and heartfelt message in which her loss may give others the chance to avoid life-threatening risk. Everyone deserves to go home safely to their family after a good dav's work.

As many start to contemplate summer adventures, I would like to highlight two important tools to make your travels safer. Most of us have smartphones and it is

hard for many to imagine life without them. Although technology can be challenging, it also provides us with opportunities for greater public safety. There are two phone APPS developed to improve the lives of everyday Albertans: 511 and Alberta Emergency Alerts. Both 511 and Alberta Emergency Alert are available free of charge. 511 is Alberta's Official Road Report. There is a wealth of real time information and there are constant updates on visibility, road construction, as well as many other items. 511 can also be monitored through Twitter, so if you do not have the app and have questions regarding specific road conditions, I have received immediate responses as late as 11:30pm; now that is service!

Few of us can forget the images of destruction that occurred with the Ft. McMurray wildfire. Individuals had to evacuate on a moment's notice and getting the word out can be difficult in challenging situations. The AEA (Alberta Emergency Alert) app is designed to give off a very loud and recognizable tone when danger or a public service announcement needs to be shared quickly. It can be a water advisory, road closure or evacuation notice, but smartphone warnings can keep us well informed and I would encourage you to use these tools to improve personal safety.

Although session will be ending soon, your comments and feedback help me to better serve you, so please join me for my MLA Café this month, June 16th from 10am to 12noon at my office. 




