



I saw a house for sale, and I want to check it out - will I have to sign a contract to get a real estate professional to show me the house?

The short answer is no. If you see a house for sale and you simply want a real estate professional to show you that house, you're not required to sign a contract.

Simply viewing a home with a real estate professional doesn't trigger a regulatory requirement to sign a contract with that real estate professional. However, if you start sharing confidential information such as your motivation for buying or your financial qualification, the real estate professional has a responsibility to clarify your working relationship, at which point they are going to provide you with some documents to review.

In the process of clarifying your working relationship, the first document a real estate professional should present to you is the Consumer Relationships Guide. The Consumer Relationships Guide is a mandatory document for real estate professionals when they begin working with a buyer or seller of residential real estate. It explains the different types of working relationships between real estate professionals and consumers.

The Consumer Relationships Guide is not a contract. It does not commit you to a specific ongoing working

relationship with your real estate professional, but it is an essential information piece for consumers to understand what working with a licensed real estate professional entails. Among other things, it discusses responsibilities and obligations.

The Consumer Relationships Guide contains an acknowledgement that consumers have to sign indicating they've read the Guide, understand it, and have been provided with an opportunity to ask the real estate professional questions about it. Consumers need to review and sign the Guide before entering into any contract with a real estate professional.

Some real estate professionals may actually present the Consumer Relationships Guide and request that you sign the acknowledgement even before showing you a single property, but that specific practice is not a reauirement.

## February Is Heart Month

Do you know the signs and symptoms of a heart attack and what to do if someone experiences these? Knowing can make the difference between life and death. Recognizing and responding immediately to the warning signs of a potential heart attack can significantly improve survival and recovery.

February is Heart Month - take the time to be heart safe and learn how you can reduce your risk.

### Know the signs of a heart attack

(Any, or all, of these signs & symptoms may occur)

- Chest discomfort described as crushing, squeezing, pressure, or heaviness;
- Discomfort that moves beyond the chest, such as the shoulder, arm, neck, or jaw;
- Shortness of breath, sweating, or nausea and vomiting.

### Reduce your risk

Heart attack risk factors include:

- Obesitv\*
- · Sedentary lifestyle\*
- Smokina\*
- High cholesterol\*
- · Age / gender
- Family history

Speak with your doctor about how to treat your modifiable (\*) risk factors and learn to be heart safe.

### What to do when seconds count

- Call 9-1-1 immediately. Early treatment can greatly reduce heart damage and make the difference of life and death;
- Treatment starts the moment EMS arrives. Paramedics can provide oxygen, start an intravenous and perform an electrocardiogram (ECG);
- Paramedics can also administer important medication(s) in the early minutes of a heart attack to lessen heart damage:
- During transport, EMS will share information with the hospital, so definitive treatment can begin immediately upon arrival:
- Take a CPR/AED (automated external defibrillator) course. Training is widely available from many reputable organizations. It's easy, inexpensive, and only takes a few hours.

### **Constituency Boundaries Review:**

In the coming months, the province's Electoral Boundaries Commission will undertake a review of the electoral constituencies. It's the first time the boundaries have been reviewed since 2009/2010. The province says Alberta's population has increased by more than 20 per cent in the last eight years. As a result, we need to review our provincial constituency boundaries prior to the next provincial election.

Provincial law directs the Alberta Electoral Boundaries Commission to review the existing boundaries and names for the 87 electoral constituencies and report to the Legislative Assembly of Alberta by October 31, 2017.

The Commission will consider the following in making recommendations to the Legislative Assembly:

- Your input
- Population figures and relative population density throughout the province
- Common community interests
- · Existing municipal and natural boundaries
- Effective representation

Albertans can take part in the process by attending a public hearing (See dates and times @ abebc.ca), providing a written submission and by following the Commission's progress on social media with #AlbertaEBC.

While this is an important process, I am worried about gerrymandering by the NDP government. Even though Calgary Hays is an urban riding, I hope you will agree giving everyone an equal voice matters. The fear is NDP will give rural Alberta much less representation as they have little support in rural Alberta. If you are concerned, please contact the committee via the methods above or send me a note to forward to them.

You may have heard in the news that last month our Government banned door-to-door sales of household energy products at the beginning of the year.

I am really proud of this decision, which helps protect Albertans from misleading, high-pressures sales.

The Government had received more than 1,000 consumer complaints about energy products and services, including:

- · Deliberate misrepresentations,
- Selling products they don't really need.
- Energy contracts not being cancelled upon request, and
- High-pressure tactics

Under these new rules, Alberta has banned door-to-door sales

- Furnaces
- Hot water tanks
- Natural gas and electricity contracts
- Air conditioners
- Windows
- · Energy audits

Energy companies can continue to sell directly to Albertans, including telephone and online sales, kiosks, and advertising. Consumers are still able to invite salespeople to their homes if they choose, and at the customer's request.

Alberta's Fair Trading Act protects consumers from unfair business practices before, during, and after a consumer transaction. Anyone with concerns about door-to-door sales should:

### Hello Ward 9!

I hope that you enjoyed the last couple weeks of 2016.

With the recession that we Calgarians have suffered through for the past two years, it's important that we reflect on what we have, maintain hope for what may be, and roll up our sleeves together and work towards making our neighbourhoods prosper—as we always do.

We have seen our quality of life shaken by the hit to our local economy. As your City Councillor, I have seen and heard about it from you at events, through email, social media, and in one-on-one meetings. Things are tough, but we are still optimistic.

In 2016, your Team Ward 9 supported increasing affordable housing stock for seniors, reformed the secondary suite process, increased the potential space for child care services, lowered property taxes, and removed the "Greenfield" development subsidy for new developments on the edges of our city - decreasing the tax burden on tax payers to the tune of \$6,000 to \$20,000 per residential unit built.

We have also supported moving up the time tables of, and building, infrastructure projects to get Calgarians back to work, and amended the sliding scale subsidy for our less fortunate neighbours to ensure that they do not get left behind as we all tighten our fiscal belts.
