



Surprisingly, even with the downturn in the economy, Diamond Cove has lots of activity, especially with repairs and renovations. This is good news for the community and for property values. Residents should be aware of any restrictions, responsibilities or requirements for their property, especially as it relates to fences and walls (both stub and attenuation). Please remember that homeowners are responsible for their fences, on both sides. If it is a wooden fence, it is required that everyone use the right colour of "Diamond Cove White" which is available at Benjamin Moore-Overwall in Midnapore. It should be based on the Flood-pro pastel base. Of course, this colour can also be matched at any other paint dealer.

One of our Board members has spoken with the good people at Benjamin-Moore in Midnapore and they are offering to pre-mix your Diamond Cove White if you call ahead, and provide a special rate to incent purchase at their store.

The Annual General Meeting was held on April 20th and we had a better turn-out this year, with new residents coming to hear how the Cove residents association is working on behalf of the community. Some of the highlights from the meeting...



COOK CORNER

Chicken Foil Dinner for Camping (or to Grill at Home) Makes 4 packets

- 4 large pieces of heavy duty (or double-thick) aluminum foil
- oil
- 4 small potatoes, chopped
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 2 ears corn, cut in half (can use frozen cobs)
- butter, melted
- Basic Spice Rub (or spices of choice)
- 4 boneless, skinless chicken thighs (if using breasts, pound the thickest parts flat)

To assemble: Lay out the pieces of foil and oil the centers of each.

In the center of each piece of foil pile the potatoes and onions.

Brush corn cobs with melted butter and place next to the potatoes. Sprinkle everything with the spice rub (or spices).

Lay the chicken atop the potatoes and onions and sprinkle with more spice rub.

Seal the edges all nice and tight, but leave a little room for steam. If taking camping, put the pouches in ziplock baggies in case of leakage (which did happen). Cook right away or freeze to take camping to be used the first 1-2 days.

To cook: Cook thawed packets 5 inches from the fire/ coals, 15 minutes on one side and 15 minutes on the other. If they are closer because of stationary grate at the campsites, just turned them a little more often and move them to avoid hot spots. In this case, they might cook closer to the 20 minute mark, so you'll have to be checking after this point (it's okay if they are still partially frozen, they seemed to cook the same amount of time over the hotter campsite fire).



ALLEYS HOLLYHOCKS

Watch out for a woman on a mission, particularly if she is a gardening-type woman. You might just get caught up in her guest, and who knows where that could lead.

Take back alleys, for instance. Most older houses in Calgary have a back alley (or lane, if you wish) and most of them are pretty dismal. Not a thing of beauty. Scruffy. Untidy. Unloved. Ignored. Most are surfaced with gravel, with the exception of those blocks that have been upgraded to asphalt. Nicer and cleaner, but expensive. Many of us who have a dog to walk (or a "granddog" in my case) spend more time in the alley than on the street some days, so we see what goes on behind our neighbours' fences. Would you agree with me that there could be some improvement here?

How much trouble would it be to plant a little something out there for our fellow gardeners and dog walkers, not to mention ourselves? Me, I adore Sweet Peas – the scent is so edible I can stuff my head into a bunch and just inhale the intoxicating fragrance. Usually, I prefer to leave summer flowers outdoors; they look better where Mother Nature placed them. Sweet Peas, however, must be cut because if you leave just one to go to seed (looks like a little pea pod) that's it, game over, no more blooms. Keep cutting them (they make the kitchen smell heavenly) and the plants will bloom and bloom right until snowfall. So toss a bunch of sweet pea seeds along the fence and make your neighbours smile.

My next favourite is the old-fashioned Hollyhock for its statuesque beauty. Tall and tough, with dramatic papery flowers arranged all the way up the towering spires, they also bloom for weeks through summer and fall. You might have to tie these to the fence, as our summer storms can send them off in odd directions. Hollyhocks are biennials (bloom in their second year, then die), so must be planted for two consecutive years to assure continued bloom. They will reseed themselves from then on with little fuss. Furthermore, they attract bees like crazy.

The main focus of the Blockwatch program is to watch out for one another and prevent crime. The easiest way to talk to newcomers in the neighbourhood is about their garden, whether it be the one facing the street, the private one glimpsed through the fence, or the Sweet Peas and Hollyhocks in the back lane. Summer is short. Stop and smell the flowers.
