Well that is all for now. Please watch the community outside bulletin board for new programs starting. All of the details have not been finalized as of today's date, so we will post them to keep you informed.





1/2 cup deli ham, chopped1/2 cup shredded lettuce1/4 cup shredded carrot1/4 cup Ranch dressing1 pita bread round, cut in half

Directions

Place ham, lettuce, and carrot in a re-sealable plastic bag. Pour Ranch dressing into a small re-sealable container. Wrap the pita bread in plastic wrap. Pack the ham mixture, Ranch dressing, and pita bread along with a spoon in a lunch box or bag until lunch time.

Assemble pita pocket by spooning the ham mixture into each pita half and drizzling the Ranch dressing on top.



HOME GARDENING WITH BARBARA



September in Canada is one of our most beautiful months. Alberta does not have the climate for many of the red maples that grow in the eastern part of our country, but our deciduous trees and shrubs nonetheless provide us with wonderful displays.

How does this come about? Photosynthesis is the process by which the plant takes water from the ground, carbon dioxide from the air, and sunlight to turn them to glucose, which is the food of life – not just for plants, but for people too. Chlorophyll is the chemical in the leaves that gives them a green colour. All spring and summer the trees and shrubs are busy making glucose as they grow and store for the winter. Always thinking ahead, the trees know that there will not be enough light and water for photosynthesis during the winter, so they store what they have saved up during the summer. Each leaf has a special layer of cells called an abscission or separation layer at its base. During the summer little tubes pass through this layer carrying nutrients in and out of the leaf. As the days shorten, the tubes close up, the supply of water and removal of waste stops, and the leaf prepares to fall. The chlorophyll disappears, and the yellow and orange pigments that were there all along become visible. The orange colour comes from carotene (like carrots) and the yellows from xanthophylls (also found in banana skins and marigolds). Different combinations of these two pigments give us a variety of brilliant colors.

The reds and purples come from anthocyanin, also found in beets, apples and red grapes. The maple leaves

actually make this compound in the fall before shedding their leaves. Tannins produce the browns common to oaks and are merely visible waste products.

The most spectacular displays are in the eastern part of the continent due to the climate and wide variety of deciduous trees and shrubs. On a good year, the late summer will be dry, and the autumn will have bright sunny days and cool, frost-free nights. A very early frost or a fall with dull cloudy days and warm nights produces only drab color. Even here in the Chinook belt, we notice a difference in the brilliance of our fall colors from year to year. When Willow Park, Maple Ridge, Lake Bonavista and Parkland were developed in the 1960's and 1970's, the developer planted thousands of Northwest Poplars. Love 'em or hate 'em, you have to admit that the show they put on in autumn is a feast for the eyes. Many of the boulevards and front yards still contain mature specimens and I for one will be sorry to see them reach the end of their short lives, for they are indeed beautiful when dressed in their luminous gold foliage. This year, with our hot dry spring and wild and wet summer, it is anyone's guess what the fall colours will turn out to be.

The Queensland Garden Club will celebrate its 10th anniversary this month. We are very proud of our little community of gardeners (who come from many neighbourhoods across the city, not just Queensland) and all the knowledge and enjoyment we have gleaned from the members and visiting guest speakers. Happy Birthday to us! First Wednesdays are when we meet, and all are welcome.


